PROCLAMATION

Western Australia, to wit.

By His Excellency SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

THEREAS by "The Bank Holidays Act, 1884," it is provided that the Birthday of the Sovereign shall be observed as a Bank Holiday, and whereas Her Majesty's Birthday this year falls on Sunday, and it is by the said Act provided that when a day fixed as a Bank Holiday falls upon a Sunday, the next following Monday shall be a Bank Holiday; AND WHEREAS it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that it is inexpedient that Monday, the 25th May in this year, should be a Bank Holiday: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the powers in me vested by the aforesaid recited Act, do declare and proclaim that Monday, the 25th day of May, 1891, shall not be a Bank Holiday; and I do hereby, with the like advice, appoint Wednesday, the 27th day of May, 1891, to be a Bank Holiday, instead of the 25th day of May aforesaid.

Order in Council.

Whereas an order duly made under the provisions of the Second Section of the 44th Vic., No. 5, is now in force, forbidding any person to land or introduce into the Colony any Grape Vine or any portion thereof from any of the Australian Colonies, and it is expedient that the operation of such Order should be limited as hereinafter mentioned, I, Sir WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by this Order made in Executive Council in pursuance of the said Act do direct and declare that it shall, at any time during the six calendar months next after the date of the publication hereof in the Government Gazette of Western Australia, be lawful for any person to land or introduce into the Colony any Grape Vine cuttings being the produce of the Province of South Australia, any previous order to the contrary notwithstanding. Provided always, that before any Grape Vine cuttings are landed in the Colony a certificate from some duly qualified person, or a statutory declaration by the proprietors, declaring that the vineyards from which the cuttings were procured are and always have been free from disease, shall be produced to the Collector or Sub-Collector of Customs at the port of importation.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

PLATFORMS AND SIDINGS.—Goods will not be received for delivery at platforms or sidings except under special agreement that the consignor will relieve the Commissioner of all responsibility in regard to any loss or damage occurring in unloading or arising from any cause whatever after arrival at destination, and the sender will be required to sign a special agreement to that effect. All goods for platforms and sidings must be prepaid at sending stations.

Marking and Packing.—All goods must be fully and distinctly addressed or marked, and well and securely packed.

Demurrage on Trucks.—When the loading or unloading of trucks has to be performed by the sender, consignee, or owner, a demurrage charge of 5s. per truck per day, or part of a day, will be made for all trucks not loaded up within twelve working hours after supplied, or unloaded within twelve working hours after arrival at destination (exclusive of Sundays or proclaimed holidays).

Should the loading or unloading of trucks be delayed beyond the prescribed time when the goods have to be handled by the sender, consignee, or owner, as the case may be, the Commissioner may, instead of charging demurrage, do the loading or unloading by his own servants, or men specially employed for the purpose, charging the person concerned the rates fixed by the rate sheet, or the actual cost of the work, where no rate is given. The Commissioner does not, however, guarantee to undertake the loading or unloading of any trucks, it being optional with him to handle the goods or not.

Small consignments (less than a truck load) will always be loaded or unloaded by the Department in the absence of the sender or consignee, and a charge of 1s. per ton made for each service.

TARPAULINS.—A charge of 2s. 6d. per day or part of a day will be made for each Tarpaulin used beyond twelve working hours (exclusive of Sundays or proclaimed holidays) in covering any goods (whether in the trucks or otherwise).

Storage on Goods.—All goods must be removed from the Railway premises within twelve working hours after arrival at destination (exclusive of Sundays or proclaimed holidays). Such goods not removed within the times specified will remain on the Railway premises at the owner's risk, and be subject to a storage charge of 6d. per ton, or 1d. per package per diem, at the option of the Commissioner.

Consignees to give Receipt.—A written receipt must be given by consignees for all goods received from the department; and the Commissioner may demand proof of ownership or an indemnity-note, signed by two approved sureties, should there be any doubt as to the person applying for the goods being the actual consignee or owner.

CLAIMS for loss of goods will not be recognised unless lodged with the Commissioner within fourteen days after date of consignment, and no claim will be recognised after removal from the Railway premises of the goods alleged to have been damaged.

Unclaimed Property.—All goods or other property unclaimed for the space of six months after arrival will be sold by the Commissioner, and after deducting from the proceeds what may be due to the department for freight, storage, or other charges (including expenses of sale), the surplus, if any, will be held to the credit of the owner, and paid to him on demand.

Goods, &c., consigned to different persons, though forwarded by the same individual, will be treated as separate and distinct consignments.

CONSIGNMENT NOTES.

All goods sent by rail must be accompanied by a consignment-note in a form prescribed by the Commissioner, which the sender (or an authorised person on his behalf) is required to sign, as a guarantee of the correctness of the information furnished therein. Any false description will render the sender liable to a penalty of Ten pounds (Vide By-law, 44 Vict., No. 17, Sections 7 and 8). Goods for platforms or sidings will only be carried on condition that the consignor accepts all responsibility in regard to loss or damage arising from any cause whatever after arrival there.

On and after the 25th May the above classification and rates will come into force, previous lists being cancelled.

FINDING OF THE COURT.

Read in Open Court and in the hearing of William Miller, late Master of the British screw steamer "Maid of Lincoln."

We find that the British screw steamer "Maid of Lincoln" was stranded on a reef off the mouth of the Hill River while on her voyage from Dongara to Fremantle, and has since become a total wreck, through your carelessness in navigation.

We, therefore, under the powers granted unto us under the Local Ordinances, 28 Vic., No. 2, and 51 Vic., No. 6, suspend your Local Certificate of Competency, No. 141, as Master Mariner, for a term of 6 (six) calendar months from this date.
