CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c.

By His Excellency SIR WILLIAM

7 HEREAS by "The Bank Holidays Act, 1884," it is provided that the Birthday of the Sovereign shall be observed as a Bank Holiday, and whereas Her Majesty's Birthday this year falls on Sunday, and it is by the said Act provided that when a day fixed as a Bank Holiday falls upon a Sunday, the next following Monday shall be a Bank Holiday; AND WHEREAS it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that it is inexpedient that Monday, the 25th May in this year, should be a Bank Holiday: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the powers in me vested by the aforesaid recited Act, do declare and proclaim that Monday, the 25th day of May, 1891, shall not be a Bank Holiday; and I do hereby, with the like advice, appoint WEDNESDAY, the 27th day of May, 1891, to be a Bank Holiday, instead of the 25th day of May aforesaid.

Order in Council.

WHEREAS an order duly made under the provisions of the Second Section of the 44th Vic., No. 5, is now in force, forbidding any person to land or in-troduce into the Colony any Grape Vine or any portion thereof from any of the Australian Colonies, and it is expedient that the operation of such Order should be limited as hereinafter mentioned, I, Sir WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by this Order made in Executive Council in pursuance of the said Act do direct and declare that it shall, at any time during the six calendar months next after the date of the publication hereof in the Government Gazette of Western Australia, be lawful for any person to land or introduce into the Colony any Grape Vine cuttings being the produce of the Province of South Australia, any previous order to the contrary notwithstanding. Provided always, that before any Grape Vine cuttings are landed in the Colony a certificate from some duly qualified person, or a statutory declaration by the proprietors, declar-ing that the vineyards from which the cuttings were procured are and always have been free from disease, shall be produced to the Collector or Sub-Collector of Customs at the port of importation.

By-LAW.

1. That for the better preservation of the new line of road to Yilgarn, all drivers of teams with more than two horses on the said road shall be compelled to drive their horses two abreast, and in case of three horse teams, one horse shall be driven in the shafts, with the two leaders abreast.

2. Non-compliance with this By-law will render offenders liable to a fine not exceeding two pounds for every such offence under this law.

3. This By-law not to come into force for six months after passing, to allow the public to have their waggons, drays, &c., put in order to comply with this law.

Stoppage at Pick-up Platforms.

Trains marked thus * will only stop at platforms when required o pick up or set down passengers. Passengers desiring to alight t any of the platforms must give notice to the Guard at the revious Station, in order to prevent their being carried beyond heir destination.

The departure of Trains will be delayed or otherwise, under pecial circumstances, at the discretion of the Commissioner.

Departure or Arrival not Guaranteed.

The Commissioner of Railways does not guarantee the dearture or arrival of the Trains at the time stated, nor will the Department be responsible for delay or any consequence arising herefrom.

Periodical Tickets.

Periodical Tickets between all Stations can be obtained on appliation to the Traffic Manager through Station Masters. They are iot available by Special or other Trains than those notified in his Time Table.

Periodical Ticket holders, when travelling by Train, will be equired to produce their Tickets when called upon to do so by any f the Officers or Servants of the Commissioner of Railways. A 'assenger holding a Periodical Ticket neglecting or refusing to roduce or deliver it up for inspection, when so required, must pay he regular fare.

A Periodical Ticket is not transferable; and if any such Ticket e found in the possession of any person to whom it was not issued, who shall attempt to travel therewith, it shall be retained, and bsolutely forfeited, unless it shall appear that the proper holder hereof had not connived at such improper use.

Commissioner of Railways' Office, Perth, 11th May, 1891. In addition to the usual charge, a deposit of 10s. will be required on all Periodical Tickets, which will be returned on delivering up the said Ticket; but if not so delivered up within 24 hours after the expiration of the time for which the Ticket was issued, the said deposit shall be absolutely forfeited.

A new Periodical Ticket in lieu of one lost will only be issued on payment of ten per cent. on the original cost of such lost ticket (See By-Laws 13 and 14).

Note.—All Periodical Tickets are issued subject to any alteration which may be made in the Trains during their currency, and no allowance or compensation will be made to the holders on account of any alteration in the time, or reduction in number of Trains. No allowance or extension of time will be made on the ground of the holder of a Periodical Ticket having through sickness or disaster, or any other cause whatever, failed to use the ticket during the period or any part of the period for which it was issued.

Passengers' Tickets.

Any person (unless having a free pass) taking a seat at any Station where there is a Booking Office, or remaining in any carriage used on the Railway, as a passenger therein, without having first poid his fare, and obtained a ticket, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 (See By-Law No. 1).

Children.

Children under three years of age, Free; above three and under twelve years, Half-fare.

Return Tickets.

Passengers' Luggage.

First Class Passengers are allowed, of ordinary luggage, 84lbs.; Second Class, 56lbs. Any excess and articles of merchandise will be charged for at Parcels Rates. Passengers are strongly recommended to have their names and the Station to which they are proceeding distinctly marked on their luggage, and to satisfy themselves that it is placed in the Train. The Commissioner of Railways will not be responsible for any luggage unless it is specially booked and paid for, and the owner's name and its destination distinctly marked thereon (See By-Law 15).

Smoking.

Smoking will only be permitted in the compartment of a Carriage set apart for that purpose (See By-Law 26).

Gratuities,

Servants of the Commissioner of Railways are prohibited from receiving any gratuity from the public, on pain of dismissal.

Irregularities.

It is requested that any irregularity may be immediately reported to the Traffic Manager, Perth.
