Greeting:

KNOW YE that we have assigned you jointly and severally and every one of you Our Justices to keep Our Peace in our Colony of Western Australia. And to keep and cause to be kept all Ordinances and Statutes for the good of the Peace and for the preservation of the same and for the quiet rule and government of Our People made in all and singular their articles in Our said Colony (as well within Liberties as without) according to the force form and effect of the same. And to chastise and punish all persons that offend against the form of those Ordinances or Statutes or any one of them in the aforesaid Colony as it ought to be done according to the form of those Ordinances and Statutes. And to cause to come before you or any of you all those who to any one or more of Our People concerning their Bodies or the firing of their Houses have used threats to find sufficient security for the Peace or their good behaviour towards Us and Our People. And if they shall refuse to find such security then them in Our Prisons until they shall find such security to cause to be safely kept.

We have also assigned to you and every two or more of you (of whom any one of you the aforesaid Maitland Brown, Charles Denroache Vaughan Foss, Robert Fairbairn, John Crampern Rosselloty, Rowley Crozier Loftie, Thomas Henry Lovegrove, James Cowan, Robert John Lepper, William Henry Timperley, William Dyer Cowan, John Adam, Frederick Arthur Hare, John Michael Finnerty, Benjamin Tydd Heuston, Edward Power Dowley, Richard Gibbons, Charles Lovegrove, We will shall be one) Our Justices to inquire the truth more fully by the oath of good and lawful Men of the aforesaid Colony by whom the truth of the Matter shall be the better known of all and all manner of Felonies Poisonings Trespasses Forestallings Regratings Ingrossings and Extortions whatsoever. And of all and singular other Crimes and Offences of which the Justices of Our Peace may or ought lawfully to inquire by whomsoever and after what manner soever in the said Colony done or perpetrated or which shall happen to be there done or attempted. And also of all those who in the aforesaid Colony in Companies against Our Peace in disturbance of Our People with armed force have gone or rode or hereafter shall presume to go or ride. And also of all those who have there lain in wait or hereafter shall presume to lie in wait to maim or cut or kill Our People. And also of all Victuallers and all and singular other Persons who in the abuse of Weights or Measures or in selling victuals against the form of the Ordinances and Statutes or any of them therefor made or in force for the common benefit of the said Colony and Our People thereof have offended or attempted or hereafter shall presume in the said Colony to offend or attempt. And also of all Sheriffs Stewards Constables Keepers of Gaols and other Officers who in the execution of their offices about the premises or any of them have unduly behaved themselves or hereafter shall presume to behave themselves unduly or have been or shall happen hereafter to be careless remiss or negligent in Our aforesaid Colony. And of all and singular Articles and circumstances and all other things whatsoever that concerns the said Colony done or perpetrated or which hereafter shall there happen to be done or attempted in what manner And to inspect all Indictments and Informations whatsoever so before you or any soever. of you taken or to be taken or before others late Our Justices of the Peace in the aforesaid Colony made or taken and not yet determined. And to make and continue Processes thereon against all and singular the persons so indicted or informed against or who before you hereafter shall happen to be indicted or informed against until they can be taken surrender themselves or be outlawed. And to hear and determine all and singular Felonies Poisonings Trespasses Forestallings Regratings Ingrossings Extortions the Unlawful Assemblies Indictments and Informations aforesaid and all and singular other the premises according to the Laws and Ordinances of the said Colony as in the like case it has been accustomed or ought to be done. And the same Offenders and every of them for their Offences by Fines Ransoms Imprisonments Amerciaments Forfeitures and other means as according to the Law and Custom of the said Colony or form of the Ordinances and Statutes aforesaid it has been accustomed or ought to be done to chastise and punish. Provided always that if a case of difficulty upon the determination of any of the premises before you or any two or more of you shall happen to arise then let judgment in no wise be given thereon before you or any two or more of you unless in the presence of our Chief Justice of Our said Colony. And therefore We command you and every of you that in the keeping of the Peace Ordinances and Statutes and all and singular other the Premises you diligently apply yourselves and that at certain days and places appointed for these purposes into the Premises you make inquiries and all and singular the Premises hear and determine and perform and fulfil them in the aforesaid form doing therein what to Justice appertains according to the Law and Custom of the said Colony saving to Us the Fines and other things to us therefrom belonging.

And We command by the tenor of these Presents Our Sheriff of Western Australia that at certain days and places which you or any such two or more of you as is aforesaid shall make known to him he cause to come before you or such two or more of you as is aforesaid so many and such good and lawful Men of his Bailiwick by whom the truth of the matter in the Premises shall be better known and inquired into.

In CHAINESS whereof We have caused Our trusty and well-beloved Sir WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Knight Grand Cross of Our most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Our Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, to sign these Presents and to affix hereto the Public Seal of Our said Colony, this eighth day of July, in the fifty-fifth year of Our Reign and in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

THE following Report from the Inspector of Pearl Shell Fisheries, on Balla Balla Creek, is published for general information.

> JOHN FORREST, Colonial Treasurer.

SIR, — With reference to Balla Balla Creek, inside Depuch Island, I visited it at the beginning of last month during spring tides. I found the schooner "Harriet," about 60 tons register, inside the Creek, loading copper ore; she was moored in a hole or gutter, having two fathoms at low water spring tides. The creek is about a mile in length and about from 80 to 150 yards wide.

There would be nothing to prevent a flat-bottomed vessel from going alongside the bank and taking cargo straight on board, as there are 12 to 14 feet of water alongside the bank at high water, with a soft muddy bottom.

A vessel drawing 16 feet could go up the Creek at high water; of course she would require to moor, as it's a tidal Creek, with a sand and muddy bottom, and no reefs or rocks.

Large vessels have good anchorage in 5 to 9 fathoms of water, on the North-east side of Depuch Island, between Depuch and the Forestier Islands; and about two miles from the mouth of the Creek, good shelter from the prevailing winds, so that vessels can depend upon having smooth water at nearly all times.

 ${\bf I}$ consider it one of the best places along the coast for a vessel to load.

The Chart is wrong as regards the rise at springs: it gives 14 feet, and I found a rise of 18 feet of water.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

THE attention of Masters of vessels bound for either Champion Bay, or Fremantle, is directed to a chart published by Wilson (late Norie) of Leadenhall Street, London, dated 1882, and they are warned against some gross mistakes it contains.

The chart in question shows a revolving light on some position of the Pelsart Group of the Abrolhos Islands, probably meant for Hummock island, where there is a beacon, but no light has ever been erected on any of the Abrolhos Islands.

The Revolving Light on Moore Point (Champion Bay) is on the same chart shown as a fixed light, instead of revolving.

The Bluff leading Lights (Champion Bay) are noted on the chart as Red instead of White, as should be the case.

Some extraordinary directions for vessels bound to Fremantle are added in a footnote to the chart, which are altogether and entirely erroneous and misleading.

The chart contains two small plans of King George's Sound and Princess Royal Harbor, of which one shows Point King Light in its proper position, but the other has it placed wrongly on Point Possession.

CORAL REEF IN TRACK OF VESSELS FROM ROE-BUCK BAY OR DERBY TO WYNDHAM AND PORT DARWIN.

PORT DALWIN.

Jamieson Reef.—Owing to information given by Captain R. Jamieson of the Adelaide S.S. Company's vessel "Otway" a coral reef has been found by H.M.S. "Penguin" in the track of vessels bound from Roebuck Bay or Derby to Wyndham and Port Darwin.

This reef is 24 miles long north and south, and one mile broad east and west. It is mostly covered at all times of tide with from 12 to 24 feet water; but there is one small part three quarters of a mile from the north end of the reef which dries 5 feet at low water spring tide. This spot is in latitude 14° 4′ 32″ S., longitude 125° 21′ 11″ E. From it, the centre of the flat-topped summit of Condillac bears S. 78° E., distant 12.2 miles.

The water in this locality is much discolored at all times; and there is nothing in the appearance of the sea over the reef to indicate danger, except at nearly low water when the shallowest part breaks. The lead gives no warning.

91. All Gold Mining Leases granted under these Regulations shall be computed from the 1st January preceding the date of the application.
