Amendment of Clause 91 of the Regulations for the management of Goldfields.

*Crown Lands' Office,
Perth, 6th July, 1891.*

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under the powers conferred upon him by the Goldfields Act (50 Victoria, No. 18), directs it to be notified, for general information, that Clause 91 of the Goldfields Regulations, as gazetted on 8th May, 1890, has been amended so as to read as follows:—

DATE OF LEASES AND PAYMENT OF RENTS.

91. All Gold Mining Leases granted under these Regulations shall be computed from the 1st January preceding the date of the application.

All rents of Gold Mining Leases shall be calculated as from the 1st of January to the 31st of December, and shall be paid in advance to the Commissioner of Crown Lands at the Land and Survey Office, Perth, or to his Agents at the various Resident Magistrate's Courts in the Colony, or to the Warden of the Goldfield, on or before the 1st of March in each year. Leases applied for during the year will be charged rent from the beginning of the quarter previous to the date of application, *viz.*, from the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July, and the 1st day of October, as the case may be.

A book shall be kept at the Warden's office on all Goldfields where ground is held under lease, to be called a Register of Gold Mining Leaseholds; in which book shall be entered the names of all lessees, the share each lessee holds, all transfers made, and all liens upon lessees' shares.

METEOROLOGICAL OBSERVATIONS for the week ending 14th July, 1891.
