THE Government having decided to sink a shaft at the Collie Coal Seam, is desirous of engaging the services of some qualified person, for a few months, to take charge of this work.

What will probably be required is a shaft possibly 200ft. in depth, size about 5ft. x 3ft., through sand reef and sand-stone rock. It will probably require strong timbering in places, or possibly throughout the whole depth, and there will be a good deal of water to contend with. About 20 tons of coal is in-

tended to be raised for trial.
