ALTERATION IN POSITION OF LEADING LIGHTS FOR STEWART ISLAND CUTTING.

NOTICE is hereby given, that, on and after 23rd July, IN two white lights for leading through Stewart Island Cutting will be exhibited from triangular beacons on Stewart Island to the southward of the cutting; and the lights (red and white) hitherto shown from beacons north of the cutting will be discontinued.
