HEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: Now Therefore I, ALEXANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, being Administrator as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested as aforesaid and of all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation announce and proclaim that THE SECOND SESSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AND THE LEGISLATIVE Assembly, to be holden under the provisions of the said Act, shall be holden, for the despatch of business, on Monday, the seventh day of Decem-BER NEXT, at the hour of three of the clock, p.m.: the session of the Legislative Council to be holden in the Legislative Council Chambers, in St. George's Terrace, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly Chambers, in Howick Street, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the said Colony, at Perth, this 24th day of September, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

IN pursuance of the provisions of an Act passed in the Fiftieth year of Our Lady the Queen, and intituled "An Act for the Management of Goldfields," I, the said Administrator, do hereby proclaim the portion of Crown lands, bounded by lines starting from Tallering Peak and extending North-Eastwards to the summit of Mount Murchison; thence to the summit of Mount Hale; thence to Mount Russell, near the watershed of the Murchison River; thence South-Westward to Mount Kenneth; thence Westward to Mugga Mugga Hill; and thence North-Westward to the summit of Tallering Peak, to be a Goldfield, and to be known and called by the name of "The Murchison Goldfield."

SWINGING STATION FOR THE ADJUSTMENT OF COMPASSES.

OTICE is hereby given, that a Swinging Station, at which vessels may swing for the purpose of adjusting their compasses, has been established in Townsville Harbour

The swinging point is about the centre of the enclosed harbour, and is marked by the intersection of two leads:—

1st. Frederic's Peak, Aplin, Brown & Co.'s Flagstaff, and a broad white paint-mark on the Western Breakwater in line bearing S. 45° 50′ W.

2nd. The highest peak of Mount Elliot in line with a painted mark on the Eastern Breakwater bearing S. 34° 20′ E.

Opposite each of the following conspicuous objects is given its correct magnetic bearing from the swinging point—Variation 6° 40′ nearly stationary:—

damaged through carelessness.

2. The Contractor to be responsible for all loss or damage during transit, and in loading or discharging goods

from the trucks.

3. The Contractor to place and stow all goods as directed by the Customs Officer in charge of the sea and shore end of the Jetty.

4. All the trucking to be charged per ton and be computed in accordance with the scale published in the Government Gazette of the 8th November, 1881.

5. When the trucking is ordered by the Principal Officer of Customs after the usual hours, during holidays, and on Sundays, the work must be performed by the

6. Preference to be given to bonded goods so that none of such goods remain on the Jetties after 3 p.m. on all days

except Saturdays, when they must be removed by noon.
7. The Contractor and his servants to be amenable to

the existing Jetty Regulations.

8. The Contractor not to be compelled to load trucks with goods placed more than three yards from the rails, nor to place goods discharged from trucks more than three yards from the rails; if a further distance is required, a special arrangement may be made with the owner of the goods.

9. For performing the above services the Contractor will be permitted to charge one shilling and sixpence per ton, as per scale published in the Government Gazette of the 8th November, 1881, on all goods trucked to and from the sea and shore end of Jetties.

10. For goods trucked after hours, on holidays (on permission being obtained for so doing from the Principal Officer of Customs or Officers in charge of Jetties) the Con-

on which dispute may hereafter arise, whether fixed or not by any previous scale for calculating tonnage.

14. The Principal Officer of Customs' decision in all such matters to be final, so far as they do not interfere with the laws existing in the Colony.
