HEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time

being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: Now THEREFORE I, ALEXANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, being Administrator as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested as aforesaid and of all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation announce and proclaim that THE SECOND SESSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AND THE LEGISLATIVE Assembly, to be holden under the provisions of the said Act, shall be holden, for the despatch of business, on Monday, the seventh day of Decem-BER NEXT, at the hour of three of the clock, p.m.: the session of the Legislative Council to be holden in the Legislative Council Chambers, in St. George's Terrace, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly Chambers, in Howick Street, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the said Colony, at Perth, this 24th day of September, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

IS Excellency the Administrator in Executive Council has been pleased, on the recommendation of the Perth Roads Board, to approve of the following deviation in the road from Perth to Wanneroo, viz.:—That portion from the North boundary of Location K to the Western boundary of Location 132 is closed, and the following line of road substituted therefor: the West side being a line starting from a spot situate 51 chains 98 links West, from the South-West corner of Swan Location I, and extending 9 degrees 46 minutes, 28 chains 20 links, 350 degrees 1 minute, 69 chains 86 links, 42 minutes, 11 chains 57 links, along the East boundary of Swan Location 741; then 356 degrees 8 minutes, 50 chains, 355 degrees 22 minutes, 13 chains 3 links, 360 degrees 36 minutes, 20 chains 2 links, 355 degrees 34 minutes, 58 chains 58 links, to the North-East corner of Perthshire Location 114, and the South-East corner of Perthshire Location 103, and along its Eastern boundary 336 degrees 57 minutes, 154 chains 28 links, to the Southern corner of Perthshire Location 102, and along its South-East boundary 21 degrees 47 minutes, 62 chains 92 links, to its Eastern corner; then 239 degrees 52 minutes, 73 chains 68 links, 331 degrees 59 minutes, 84 chains 42 links, through the North-East corner of Swan Location 839; then 332 degrees 53 minutes, 136 chains 37 links, to the Eastern boundary of Swan Location 132, and North 5 minutes East, 7 chains 77 links, to its North-East corner.

1. The Contractor to perform all the trucking to and from the shore end of the Jetties, and to find labor for by the Government, and kept in repair except when damaged through carelessness.

2. The Contractor to be responsible for all loss or

damage during transit, and in loading or discharging goods

from the trucks.

3. The Contractor to place and stow all goods as directed by the Customs Officer in charge of the sea and shore end of the Jetty.

4. All the trucking to be charged per ton and be computed in accordance with the scale published in the Government Gazette of the 8th November, 1881.

5. When the trucking is ordered by the Principal Officer of Customs after the usual hours, during holidays, and on Sundays, the work must be performed by the Contractor.

6. Preference to be given to bonded goods so that none of such goods remain on the Jetties after 3 p.m. on all days except Saturdays, when they must be removed by noon.
7. The Contractor and his servants to be amenable to

the existing Jetty Regulations.

8. The Contractor not to be compelled to load trucks with goods placed more than three yards from the rails, nor to place goods discharged from trucks more than three yards from the rails; if a further distance is required, a special arrangement may be made with the owner of the goods.

9. For performing the above services the Contractor will be permitted to charge one shilling and sixpence per ton, as per scale published in the Government Gazette of the 8th November, 1881, on all goods trucked to and from the sea and shore end of Jetties.

10. For goods trucked after hours, on holidays (on permission being obtained for so doing from the Principal Officer of Customs or Officers in charge of Jetties) the Contractor will not be allowed to charge more than 2s. 6d. per ton, but he will be permitted to make special arrangements

with parties requiring his services.

11. A bond of £300 for Albany, and £100 for all other jetties, with two sureties in similar amounts, will be required for the due performance of the Contract, and

the Contract to terminate at any time on the Government giving one month's notice.

12. When a Jetty needs repair such as to interfere with the traffic, the trucking must be done in a way most advantageous under the circumstances, and no remission of rent will be made.

The Principal Officer of Customs to have the right 13. The Principal Officer of Customs to have the right to settle all disputes between truckers and owners of goods, and to fix and determine charges for trucking such goods on which dispute may hereafter arise, whether fixed or not by any previous scale for calculating tonnage.

14. The Principal Officer of Customs' decision in all such matters to be final, so far as they do not interfere with the laws existing in the Colony.

15. That any tender accepted for the service during 1892 will not commence until these conditions are signed by the tenderer and his sureties.
