Hydrographic Remarks.

Affecting Charts No. 1048, XII., 88, Buccaneer Archi-pelago to Bedout Island; No. 1047, VIII., 90, Cape Ford to Buccaneer Archipelago; No. 475, II., 89, N.W. Coast, Australia.

(Bearings given are Magnetic. Sour Spring Tide.) Soundings reduced to L.W.

Baleine Bank (P.D.)—The western point of the reef marked as Baleine Bank (P.D.) is in latitude 16° 46' S.; longitude  $121^{\circ} 49'$  E. From this point it has been examined for a distance of 5 miles to the eastward.

The general depth was found to be 24 feet, coral bottom, and the least water obtained 18 feet. It appeared to extend some miles further to the eastward.

The locality where 7 fathoms was struck in the year 1890—latitude  $16^{\circ}43'$  S., longitude  $121^{\circ}37'$  E.—has been examined. No danger was found. There is a depth of from 12 to 18 fathoms, coral bottom, between this and the Baleine Bank. The sea is much discolored with patches of mud and lime, giving the appearance of rocks; but no obstacles to navigation were discovered.

Walker Rock is a coral patch of small extent, with 24 feet water over it, situated in latitude  $16^{\circ}$  52' 13" S., longitude  $121^{\circ}$  48' 32" E.

Tidal Streams in the neighborhood of the Baleine Bank are rotatory in their action, and run at a speed of from 1 to  $2\frac{1}{2}$  knots per hour, according to the age of the

moon. The flood stream commences in a direction slightly to the east of south, and works round to the eastward. At half-tide it is setting east, and at high water the direction of the stream is north. The ebb stream commences slightly to the west of north, and works round to the westward. At half-ebb it is west, and at low water it is south.

Expedition Island—placed on the existing chart from the report of the Captain of the barque "Tien Tsin," and represented to be 6 miles in length, 2 to 3 miles in breadth, 30 feet high, covered with bushes, and surrounded by an extensive reef-does not exist.

extensive reef—does not exist. H.M.S. "Penguin," drawing 17 feet, anchored in the position assigned to the centre of the island, in latitude  $15^{\circ} 34'$  S., longitude  $123^{\circ} 45' 40''$  E., depth 32 fathoms. An examination for a radius of 3 to 5 miles showed that the bottom was uneven, and that there were indications of a shoal 3 miles to the west, and north-west of the above position, but no land or sand-bank was visible from the topmast-head at L.W. neap tides. The vessel approached the alleged island from 8 miles S. by W., and left it N. by E. for 30 miles, without seeing any danger or observing any obstruction which would prevent other ships of her draught using this route when bound from Derby to Wyndham or Port Darwin. The description given by the Cantain of the "Tien"

The description given by the Captain of the "Tien Tsin" agrees fairly well with that of Adele Island, which is on the same parallel of latitude, 36° to the westward.

The Shoal Water, south of Adele Island, extends further to the south than has hitherto been supposed. The "Penguin" found very uneven bottom in latitude 15° 45' 30" S., longitude 123° 17' E., the least sounding struck being 8 fathoms, coral bottom. Nothing was seen which indicated danger to shipping; but the locality should be passed with caution.

AUDITORS' REPORT.

WE have examined the annexed Balance Sheet, made up to the 30th September, 1891, and report that we find the several items therein stated to conform to the Balances in the General Ledger, and the Balance Sheets of the respective Branches and Agencies of the Bank collectively. The Cash, Bills, and other Securities held at the Branches and Agencies in New South Wales, Victoria, and South Australia, on the 30th September, in New Zealand and Western Australia on the 7th September, in Queensland on the customary dates, and at London on the 30th June last, have been certified to as being correct by the usual documents.
