WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: NOW THEREFORE I, ALEXANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, being Administrator as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested as aforesaid and of all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation announce and proclaim that THE SECOND SESSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AND THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY, to be holden under the provisions of the said Act, shall be holden, for the despatch of business, on MONDAY, THE SEVENTH DAY OF DECEMBER NEXT, at the hour of three of the clock, p.m.: the session of the Legislative Council to be holden in the Legislative Council Chambers, in St. George's Terrace, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly Chambers, in Howick Street, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the said Colony, at Perth, this 24th day of September, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

Hydrographic Remarks.

Affecting Chart No. 18, Jan. 88, Port Darwin and adjacent inlets; and Chart No. 613, II., 89, Melville Island, with Dundas and Clarence Straits.

(Soundings reduced to L.W. Springs. Bearings given are Magnetic.)

Lorna Banks are two banks of small extent in the track of vessels approaching Port Darwin from the westward. They lie North-east and South-west from one another, and are distant apart 9 cables.

Each bank has over it 24 feet, sand and shells, and there are 9 fathoms between them, with 11 to 12 fathoms around.

The North-east bank is in latitude 12° 20' 57" S., longitude 130° 19' 22" E. From it the conspicuous hump on the West end of Quail Islet, which is just in sight from the deck of a vessel, bears S. 36 E., distant 12'·8; and the left extreme of Charles Point (which is not in sight from the deck of a vessel) bears S. 86 E., distant 17'·4. The water does not break on these banks, except in strong West winds.
