# CENTRAL DISTRICT.

That part of the Colony lying within the following boundary (including islands adjacent and the Houtman's Abrolhos), viz.:—a line starting from the sea coast and extending East through the eight-mile water, Southward from Milo, on the Irwin River, to a spot about 12 miles East of the said eight-mile water; then South through Trigonometrical Station L S near the Upper Arrowsmith River, then East through Trigonometrical Station S.Y.Y. and across the North road between the 165th and the 166th mile mark from Perth, across Lake Monger and Lake Moore; then North to the summit of Pullagaroo Hill (Trigonometrical Station, K. 46), then West to East Longitude 117°, then North along said meridian passing over Coompacoompera Hill, then West through Elizabeth Spring on the Murchison River to the Northern Telegraph line, and along it Southward to the Murchison River, and down the said river on its left bank to the sea coast.
