No. 333.

MAIN ROAD.

From an angle in the Karridale Road (gazetted 28th October, 1891), situate about half-a-mile East-North-East from the South-East corner of Special Occupation Lease No. 2037, and extending Westward, through said block, to its Northern boundary to join the Main Road (declared in Gazette of 9th September, 1886), being half a chain wide when crossing the said block. (This, with portion of road gazetted 6th September, 1888, will be called the Hamelin Road).

No. 334.

MINOR ROAD.

A Road, one chain wide, leaving the old Vasse-Augusta Road near the North side of Chapman Brook, and extending Eastwards near or along the right bank of Blackwood River upwards in direction of Lower Blackwood. (To be called the Blackwood Road).

No. 335.

MINOR ROAD,

(This is Deepdene Road).

No. 341.

MINOR ROAD,

One chain wide, leaving the Hamelin Road above-mentioned near the Eastern boundary of Special Occupation Lease 2037, and extending Southward to the North boundary of Special Occupation Lease 2267. (To be known as the Waterhouse's Road).

No. 342.

MINOR ROAD.

One chain wide, leaving the junction of the old Augusta Road (gazetted 26th November, 1872) with the Road gazetted 2nd September, 1886, and extending Northwards to Special Occupation Lease 2340. (To be known as Ellis Road).

No. 343.

MINOR ROAD,

One chain wide, leaving the Karridale Road (gazetted 28th October, 1891) about three miles Northward from Boundary Creek, and extending East to the West boundary of Sussex Location i. (To be called Twinwood Road).
