Death of His Royal Highness Prince Albert Victor, Duke of Clarence and Avondale.

INTELLIGENCE having been received of the lamented decease, on the 14th instant, of His Royal Highness Prince ALBERT VICTOR, grandson of Her Majesty the Queen, and eldest son of Their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Wales, His Excellency the Administrator, with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby direct—

- (1.) That Sunday, the 17th instant, be observed as a day of General Mourning in Western Australia, and that the officers of the Government and all others of Her Majesty's subjects be invited to wear Mourning in token of their sympathy with Her Majesty and Their Royal Highnesses in their great affliction.
- (2.) That the Flags on all the Public Buildings be hoisted half-mast high, from 8 a.m. until sunset on the above day.
- (3.) It is requested that the Flags on board of the Ships in the Harbours be similarly displayed on the same day.
- (4.) The Commandant of the Local Forces is hereby commanded to cause twenty-one minute guns to be fired on the above-mentioned day, such salute terminating at sunset.
