TIS Excellency the Administrator, by virtue of the powers given him by the Land Regulations, has been pleased to order that the Crown Lands included within the areas hereinafter particularised be classed as Town and Suburban, to form Townsites in the Katanning Agricultural Area, to be known and distinguished as Pinwernying, Moojebing, and Woodanilling.

PINWERNYING TOWNSITE.

Bounded by lines starting from the Great Southern Railway Reserve and extending East therefrom about 130

chains 65 links to a post situate 9 chains East and 39 chains 03 links North from the South-East corner of Kojonup Location 190, then South 99 chains 04 links to the North boundary of Kojonup Location 255, then West along said boundary about 64 chains 33 links to the Great Southern Railway Reserve and along its Eastern boundary northwards to the starting point.

The lots are numbered from 1 to 90, and contain from about 3 acres to 14 acres each.
