IT is hereby notified, for general information, that the Central Board of Education has decided to establish Five Bursaries for Girls, and has approved the following Regulations, drawn up by the Inspector of Schools, for the same.

Elementary School Bursaries for Girls.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF CANDIDATES.

1. Five Bursaries of the value of Ten pounds each will be annually offered to girls attending the Government and Assisted Schools of the Colony.

2. Candidates for these Bursaries must—

- (a.) Be over twelve years of age, and not more than fourteen years old on the 31st October of the year in which the examination for the Bursary is held;
- (b.) Have attended one or more of the Government or Assisted Schools continuously for at least two years immediately preceding the above-named October 31st, and have made not less than three hundred half-day attendances (unless prevented by illness) in such schools, during their last school year;
- (c.) Have passed satisfactorily in all the subjects prescribed for the Sixth Standard in the "Programme of Examination" appended to the Regulations of the Central Board of Education;
- (d.) Produce a certificate of industry and good conduct from the head teacher of the last school attended.

3. The Bursaries are awarded upon a competitive examination, which comprises the following subjects:—

- (a.) Reading aloud passages in prose and verse;
- (b.) Writing from dictation, as a test of spelling and penmanship;
- (c.) Geography generally, and special reference to Australasia;
- (d.) English Grammar, including simple analysis;
- (e.) Arithmetic, including the ordinary rules, and questions in mental arithmetic.

4. The following values are affixed to the several subjects of Examination:—

Reading	100 marks.
Penmanship	100 „
Spelling	100 „
Geography	200 „
English	300 „
Arithmetic	300 „

NOTE.—Course of Study for 1892 same as that for High School Scholarship (see below).

(3.) A Theme or short Essay on any simple subject.

(c.) Derivatives—

(1.) Prefixes and Affixes generally.

(2.) Derivation of words in specified selection.

(d.) Recitations—

(1.) Wolsey's Soliloquy, page 367.

(2.) Description of Mercy, page 369.

5. ARITHMETIC 300

Simple and Compound Rules, Reduction, Simple and Compound Proportion, Practice, Fractions (Vulgar and Decimal), and Interest. Notation and Numeration. Memory work in all the above Rules.

NOTE.—(a.) The Arithmetic Exercises must be worked on paper; slates will not be allowed.

(b.) Right method and arrangement, and good figures, will add to the value of the answers.

6. GEOGRAPHY 200

Definition of Geographical terms: Australasia particularly, Europe and India, generally. Map drawing.

The candidates must be able to draw the three following Maps:—

(a.) Australia.

(b.) India.

(c.) England.

NOTES.—(1.) A new course of study will be issued for each year; and, in future, a selection from some standard author. Prose or Verse may be specified.

(2.) Selections from Constable's Advanced Reader for "English."

5. No candidate is eligible for a Bursary who fails to obtain a *minimum* of $\frac{2}{3}$ (two-thirds) of the *maximum* number of marks.

6. An examination of candidates will be held annually in Perth in the month of September, and should it be found expedient for the convenience of candidates residing in the distant parts of the Colony, the Central Board of Education may arrange for examinations being also held in "local centres." In the latter case, copies of the examination questions will be forwarded, under seal, to the Chairman or Secretary of the District Board of Education of such "centre," to be opened at the commencement of the examination, which shall be held simultaneously with and in the same manner as that held in Perth.

7. Application for admission to the Bursary examination must be made to the Secretary Central Board of Education, on or before the 31st July of each year.

8. The Bursaries will be paid to the successful candidates on the last day of December in the year succeeding the date of examination, if the following conditions have been fulfilled:—

(a.) That the successful candidate shall have attended a Government or Assisted School regularly (making, at least, three hundred half-day attendances).

(b.) That such scholar shall pass successfully the examination for the Seventh Standard at the annual examination of the school.

(c.) That such scholar produce certificates of good conduct from the teacher of the said school.

NOTE.—The parents of the successful candidates shall have the right to choose the Government or Assisted School in which their children shall be educated during the twelve months of holding the Bursary.

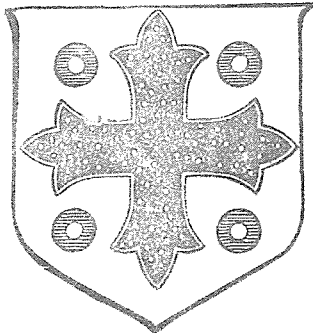
