WHEREAS by an Act passed in the 52nd year of the reign of Her present Majesty, No. 14, intituled "An Act to amend an Ordinance intituled 'An Ordinance to provide for the establishment of Proper Places for the Burial of the Dead'" (10th Vict., No. 12), it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Executive Council to declare the closure of any cemetery or burial place: Now THEREFORE I, the Administrator, in Executive Council, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the power vested in me by the said Act, do hereby declare the closure, on and after the 1st of April next ensuing, of all Cemeteries now existing within the Guildford Municipality.
