HEREAS by "The Imported Stock Act, 1876," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to acquire and set apart, by Proclamation in the Gazette, such ground as may be required for one or more Quarantine Stations, on which the necessary sheds and appurtenances may be erected, for the purpose of the said Act; AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient by me, the Administrator, to set apart a Temporary Quarantine Station at Fremantle: Now Therefore I, the said Administrator, in exercise of the powers in me vested as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby set apart as a Temporary Quarantine Station at Fremantle, for the purposes of the said Act, for a period not to exceed six weeks from this date, that portion of Fremantle Town Lot No. 27, described as follows:

Bounded by lines starting from the Eastern corner of Fremantle Town Lot 825, and extending in a N.N.W. direction 10 chains 18 links along the E.N.E. boundaries of Fremantle Town Lots 825, 772, 773, 774, 775, and part of the E.N.E. boundary of Fremantle Town Lot 776, thence East about 3½ chains along Samson Street, thence South 10 chains to South Street, and then West 2½ chains along said South Street to the starting point, being the Western portions of Fremantle Sub. WESTERN AUSTRALIAN RAILWAYS.

REGULATION.

Private Siding Access.

N pursuance of the powers vested in me by sections 8, 9, and 11 of "An Act to further amend 'The Railways Act, 1878'" (55 Vict., No. 34, 1892), I, Harry Whittall Venn, Commissioner of Railways for the Colony of Western Australia, do hereby make the following Regulation, such Regulation to come into force forthwith:-

- 1. A limited number of private sidings only will be granted, and such sidings only will be granted as the Railway Department, after full consideration, finds can conveniently and safely be allowed.
- 2. No siding access will be permitted without formal application is made, and without the consent of the Commissioner of Railways, in writing, is first obtained thereto; and no consideration will be accorded to applicants upon the plea that they have incurred expense in anticipation of obtaining such consent
- 3. The applicants shall pay to the Commissioner the whole cost of constructing the siding and its connections.
- 4. The applicant shall pay rental, quarterly in advance, at the following rates per annum:
 - (a.) For any siding access granted on to the railway, not being at a railway station, £60;
 - (b.) For any siding access at either of the chief stations—Fremantle, Perth, Geraldton—£30;
 - (c.) For any siding access at any other railway station, £15.
- 5. Upon the expiration of the term for which any existing rights have been granted by the Commissioner of Railways, the grantees may renew their tenure under these regulations at the option of the Commissioner, but, failing the Commissioner's approval thereto, the siding will be removed by the Commissioner.
- 6. Such persons as have heretofore been using siding access without the formal authorisation of the Commissioner shall have three months' notice given them by or on behalf of the Commissioner to terminate the use of such access, or to make application in the form prescribed hereinafter, and the Com-

missioner may, at his option, grant the application; but, failing the Commissioner's approval thereto, or in event of the person heretofore using the siding neglecting to apply within the prescribed time, the siding will be removed by the Commissioner.

- 7. Every application shall be made upon the printed form, which shall be accompanied by a cheque for the proper premium.
- 8. The form of application may be obtained from the officers of the Working Railways Department.

Periodical Tickets.

Periodical Tickets between all Stations can be obtained on appliion to the Traffic Manager through Station Masters. They are available by Special or other Trains than those notified in s Time Table.

?eriodical Ticket holders, when travelling by Train, will be uired to produce their Tickets when called upon to do so by any the Officers or Servants of the Commissioner of Railways. A ssenger holding a Periodical Ticket neglecting or refusing to

produce or deliver it up for inspection, when so required, must pay the regular fare.

A Periodical Ticket is not transferable; and if any such Ticket be found in the possession of any person to whom it was not issued, who shall attempt to travel therewith, it shall be retained, and absolutely forfeited, unless it shall appear that the proper holder thereof had not connived at such improper use.

In addition to the usual charge, a deposit of 10s. will be required on all Periodical Tickets, which will be returned on delivering up the said Ticket; but if not so delivered up within 24 hours after the expiration of the time for which the Ticket was issued, the said deposit shall be absolutely forfeited.

A new Periodical Ticket in lieu of one lost will only be issued on payment of ten per cent. on the original cost of such lost ticket (See By-Laws 2 and 3).

Note.—All Periodical Tickets are issued subject to any alteration which may be made in the Trains during their currency, and no allowance or compensation will be made to the holders on account of any alteration in the time, or reduction in number of Trains. No allowance or extension of time will be made on the ground of the holder of a Periodical Ticket having through sickness or disaster, or any other cause whatever, failed to use the ticket during the period or any part of the period for which it was issued.

Passengers' Tickets.

Any person (unless having a free pass) taking a seat at any Station where there is a Booking Office, or remaining in any carriage used on the Railway, as a passenger therein, without having first paid his fare, and obtained a ticket, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2 (See By-Law No. 1).

Children.

Passengers' Luggage.

First Class Passengers are allowed, of ordinary luggage, 84lbs.; Second Class, 56lbs. Any excess and articles of merchandise will be charged for at Parcels Rates. Passengers are strongly recommended to have their names and the Station to which they are proceeding distinctly marked on their luggage, and to satisfy themselves that it is placed in the Train. The Commissioner of Railways will not be responsible for any luggage unless it is specially booked and paid for, and the owner's name and its destination distinctly marked thereon (See By-Law 4).

Smoking.

Smoking will only be permitted in the compartment of a Carriage set apart for that purpose (See By-Law 15).

Gratuities.

Servants of the Commissioner of Railways are prohibited from receiving any gratuity from the public, on pain of dismissal.

Irregularities.

It is requested that any irregularity may be immediately reported to the General Traffic Manager, Perth.
