WHEREAS it is provided by "The Sandalwood Act, 1881," that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim and define one or more area or areas of Waste Lands of the Crown within which no live or growing Sandalwood tree shall be cut or grubbed up for the period to be named by the Governor in such Proclamation: NOW THEREFORE I, the said Administrator, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and define the Waste Lands of the Crown contained and being within the following area to be an area within which no live or growing Sandalwood tree shall be cut or grubbed up during a period of three years from the date hereof:—

Bounded on the *South* by the Sea Coast; on the *West* by the Great Southern Railway, part of the

Eastern Railway, and the Road from Spencer's Brook to Welbing, *viâ* Newcastle; on the *North* by a line extending 60 miles due East from Welbing; and on the *East* by a line extending from Point Charles on the South Coast North-Westwards to a spot situate 60 miles due East from York, and thence to the said spot 60 miles East from Welbing.

BY virtue of the provisions of "The Destructive Insects and Substances Act, 1880" (44 Vict., No. 5), I, ALEXANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Western Australia, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby order and direct that from and after this date it shall not be lawful for any person to introduce into the Colony any Grapes or Grape Vines, nor shall it be lawful to introduce any Grape Vine Cuttings except such as are the produce of the Province of South Australia; and, before any such Grape Vine Cuttings are landed in the Colony, a certificate from some duly-qualified person, or a statutory declaration by the proprietors, declaring that the Vineyard from which the Cuttings were procured is free from disease, shall be produced to the Collector or Sub-Collector of Customs at the port of importation.

The Order in Council dated the 15th day of April, 1886, is hereby rescinded.

No. 1.—All that portion of Denham Sound lying between the shore of Dirk Hartog Island and a line drawn from Quoin Bluff to a headland lying South by West half South from Cape Bellefin.

No. 2.—All that portion of Useless Inlet and Freyinet Reach which lies inshore of a line extending Northwards from Cape Bellefin to the edge of the Three-fathom Bank on the 26th parallel South latitude, and along it East to a point about 1½ miles North-North-East from Cape Heirisson, and thence about South-South-East half South in direction of Lefevre Island to a spot 1½ miles East from a headland lying about 5 miles North-Westerly from said island, and thence West to that headland.
