HEREAS it is provided by "The Sandalwood Act, 1881," that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim and define one or more area or areas of Waste Lands of the Crown within which no live or growing Sandalwood tree shall be cut or grubbed up for the period to be named by the Governor in such Proclamation: Now THEREFORE I, the said Administrator, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and define the Waste Lands of the Crown contained and being within the following area to be an area within which no live or growing Sandalwood tree shall be cut or grubbed up during a period of three years from the date hereof:—

Bounded on the South by the Sea Coast; on the West by the Great Southern Railway, part of the

Eastern Railway, and the Road from Spencer's Brook to Welbing, viâ Newcastle; on the North by a line extending 60 miles due East from Welbing; and on the East by a line extending from Point Char es on the South Coast North-Westwards to a spot situate 60 miles due East from York, and thence to the said spot 60 miles East from Welbing.
