THE following Tables of Fees under "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," appointed and fixed by the Municipality of Albany with the consent of His Excellency the Administrator, are published for general information.

Municipality of Albany.

The Council of the above Municipality have specified and framed the following table of all such Fees as shall be taken and charged by any keeper of the Public Pound at Albany, or by any person who shall impound or have in a place of security within the Municipality any Cattle for any matter or thing authorised to be done by "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Vic., No. 7).

The following scale of fines shall be imposed on persons offending against the provisions of the above Act :—

- 1. For each entire horse or bull at large within the boundaries of the Municipality, not less than ten shillings (10s.) or more than forty shillings (40s.)
- 2. For each mare, gelding, foal, ox, cow, heifer, calf, or any pony, mule, or ass, swine or goat at large within the boundaries of the Municipality, not less than 2s. 6d. or more than 40s.
- 3. For each of the aforementioned animals tethered in any street, public thoroughfare, or public ground, not less than 10s. or more than 40s.
- 4. For sheep at large within the boundaries of the Municipality, any number not exceeding 20, not more than 20s.; and for every succeeding 20, or portion of that number, not less than 2s. 6d.

That the Public Pound for this Municipality shall, until further notice, be the enclosure at the North-West corner of Albany Townsite Lot No. 114, fronting Stirling Street, and the following fees shall and may be charged and taken by the Poundkeeper, Mr. James Wilkinson:—

Reward for the Destruction of Eagle Hawks.

III Excellency the Administrator, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed that a Reward of 2s. (Two shillings) be offered for each and every Eagle Hawk destroyed, and such Reward is hereby offered under the following conditions:—

Every person who shall produce to any Justice of the Peace the head and talons of an Eagle Hawk, and shall prove to the satisfaction of such Justice that the same is the head and talons of an Eagle Hawk, shall be entitled to a Reward of Two shillings, to be obtained as hereinafter set forth: The said Justice shall forthwith cause the said head and talons to be entirely destroyed in his presence; and he shall give to the person producing the same a Certificate in writing signed by the said Justice,

and certifying that the said head and talons have been destroyed in his presence, and that the said person is entitled to the reward of 2s. for the destruction of an Eagle Hawk.

Upon the production of such certificate, as aforesaid, to the Clerk of any Court of Petty Sessions, the person therein named shall be paid by such Clerk the sum stated in the said Certificate, and the Clerk shall retain the said Certificate.

It shall be the duty of the Clerk of every Court of Petty Sessions to make monthly returns, to the Government Resident, Resident or Police Magistrate of the District, of all moneys paid for such Rewards, annexing to such returns the said certificates.

THE attention of Bankers and the public generally is particularly requested to the provisions of "The Gold Declaration Act, 1888," which are as follows.

JOHN FORREST, Colonial Treasurer.

- 1. ANY banker or other person exporting from the Colony any gold, gold ore, gold dust, or gold bullion, if such gold, gold ore, or gold dust shall have been found in or procured from the soil of the Colony, or if the gold contained in such bullion shall have been found in or procured from the soil of the Colony, shall at the Customs declare the weight or value of the same at the time of export.
- 2. ANY person failing to comply with the provisions of this Act may, on summary conviction before two Justices, be fined any sum not exceeding Ten pounds, or any sum not exceeding an amount equal to Five per cent. on the value of the undeclared articles, whichever sum shall be the greater.
- 3. NO person exporting from the Colony articles manufactured of gold, although such gold shall have been found in or procured from the soil of the Colony, shall be bound to declare the weight or value of such articles.
- 4. THIS Act shall come into operation on the first day of January, 1889.
