## PROCLAMATION

Western Justralia, to wit. W. C. F. Robinson.

(L.S.)

By His Excellency SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS the Parliament of Western Australia now stands prorogued until Wednesday, the 10th day of August: AND WHEREAS it is expedient further to prorogue the same: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers in me vested, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament from Wednesday, the 10th day of August, to Wednesday, the 14th day of September next ensuing.

Given at Perth, under my hand and the Public Seal of the said Colony, this 27th day of July, 1892.

Prohibition of Importation of Articles or Goods.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Perth, the 23rd day of August, 1892.

#### Present :

His Excellency the Governor, The Honorable the Colonial Treasurer, The Honorable the Colonial Secretary, The Honorable the Attorney General, The Honorable the Commissioner of Crown Lands, The Honorable the Commissioner of Railways.

HEREAS by Section 32 of "The Customs Consolidation Act, 1892," the Goods enumerated or described therein are prohibited to be imported or brought into Western Australia : And whereas by the said section it is provided that the Governor in Council may by any Order from time to time prohibit the importation of any article or goods, being a manufactured or natural product : Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth order that from and after the date hereof, the importation into this Colony of the undermentioned articles, by land or sea, is hereby prohibited; and if any such goods are so imported they shall be absolutely and peremptorily forfeited, as provided by the aforesaid section of the said Act :—

> Salicylic Acid. Essence of Brandy. Essence of Geneva. Essence of Rum. Essence of Sherry.

And the Honorable Sir John Forrest, K.C.M.G., Colonial Treasurer, shall give the necessary direction herein accordingly.

SIR.—

At the Colonial Conference of 1887 considerable discussion took place upon the question whether the Governor of a self-governing Colony should exercise the Prerogative of Pardon upon his own discretion and judgment, or whether he should be guided, as in other matters of local concern, by the opinion of his responsible advisers; but no conclusion was arrived at, as the delegates of the different Colonies were not unanimous in their views. No change has therefore been made up to the present time, and the existing Royal Instructions to the Governor of Western Australia contain the following clause respecting the exercise of the Prerogative of Mercy in Capital cases :—

"The Governor shall not pardon or reprieve any such offender unless it shall appear to him expe-"dient so to do, upon receiving the advice of the said Executive Council thereon; but in all such cases "he is to decide either to extend or to withhold a pardon or reprieve, according to his own deliberate "judgment, whether the members of the Executive Council concur therein or otherwise; entering, never-"theless, on the Minutes of the said Executive Council, a Minute of his reasons at length in case he "should decide any such question in opposition to the judgment of the majority of the members "thereof."

2. Since 1887 the question has received further consideration, and I have recently learnt that all the Australasian Colonies desire that, if Her Majesty so please, the Instructions to their Governors should in this respect be modified so that the Ministry of the day may become responsible for the carrying out or commutation of a Capital sentence, as they already are for all other matters connected with the Administration of Justice. I accordingly lost no time in taking the Queen's pleasure upon the subject; and Her Majesty has graciously signified her willingness to accede to the desire of her Colonial subjects, and to command that fresh Instructions should be prepared for the purpose.

3. I have now the honor to transmit to you fresh Instructions under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, containing a clause respecting the exercise of the Prerogative of Mercy, and adopting the language of the similar clause in the Instructions issued to the Governor General of Canada, language which will, I trust, be satisfactory to your Ministers as it always has been to the Government of the Dominion.

4. As the clause makes no mention of a report from the Judge in a Capital case, it will rest with your Ministers to consider what should be the practice in this respect, and as they may be glad to be made acquainted with the course which is followed in the Dominion of Canada, I transmit to you a copy of the section in the Canadian Act which relates to this subject (Sec. 8 of Chapter 181 of the Acts of 1886).

#### Section 8 of Canadian Act (Chapter 181) of 1886.

8. In the case of any prisoner sentenced to the punishment of death, the Judge Report to be made by before whom such prisoner has been convicted shall forthwith make a report of the <sup>the Judge</sup>. case to the Secretary of State, for the information of the Governor General; and the day to be appointed for carrying the sentence into execution shall be such as, in the opinion of the Judge, will allow sufficient time for the signification of the Governor's Reprieve in certain pleasure before such day, and if the Judge thinks such prisoner ought to be recom- <sup>cases</sup>. mended for the exercise of the Royal Mercy, or if, from the non-decision of any point of law reserved in the case, or from any other cause, it becomes necessary to delay the execution, he, or any other Judge of the same Court, or who might have held or sat in such Court, may from time to time, either in term or in vacation, reprieve such offender for such period or periods beyond the time fixed for the execution of the sentence as are necessary for the consideration of the case by the Crown.—32–33 V., c. 29, s. 107; 36 V., c. 3, s. 1.

#### WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

INSTRUCTIONS passed under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, to the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies.

INSTRUCTIONS to Our Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, or to Our Lieutenant Governor or other Officer for the time being administering the Government of Our said Colony and its Dependencies.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, this Ninth day of July, 1892, in the Fifty-sixth year of Our Reign.

WHEREAS by certain Letters Patent bearing date the Twenty-fifth day of August, 1890, We did constitute, order, and declare that there should be a Governor and Commander-in-Chief (therein and hereinafter called the Governor) in and over Our Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies (which said Colony and its Dependencies are therein and hereinafter called the Colony):

And whereas We did thereby authorise and command the Governor to do and execute all things that belong to his said office, according to the tenor of Our said Letters Patent, and of such Commission as might be issued to him under Our Sign Manual and Signet, and according to such Instructions as might from time to time be given to him under Our Sign Manual and Signet or by Our Order in Our Privy Council, or by Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, and to such Laws as were then or should thereafter be in force in the Colony:

And whereas We did issue certain Instructions under Our Sign Manual and Signet, bearing date the Twenty-fifth day of August, 1890:

And whereas We are minded to give these further Instructions to Our said Governor:

Now know you that We do hereby revoke the aforesaid Instructions, and We do by these Our Instructions under Our Sign Manual and Signet direct and enjoin and declare Our Will and pleasure as follows :—

I. In these Our Instructions, unless inconsistent with the context, the term "the Governor" shall include every person for the time being administering the Government of the Colony.

II. The Governor may, whenever he thinks fit, require any person in the public service to take the Oath of Allegiance, together with such other Oath or Oaths as may from time to time be prescribed by any Law in force in the Colony. The Governor is to administer such Oaths, or cause them to be administered by some Public Officer of the Colony.

III. The Governor shall forthwith communicate these Our Instructions to the Executive Council, and likewise all such others, from time to time, as he shall find convenient for Our service to impart to them.

IV. The Governor shall attend and preside at the meetings of the Executive Council, unless prevented by some necessary or reasonable cause, and in his absence such member as may be appointed by him in that behalf, or in the absence of such member the senior member of the Executive Council actually present shall preside; the seniority of the members of the said Council being regulated according to the order of their respective appointments as members thereof.

V. The Executive Council shall not proceed to the despatch of business unless duly summoned by authority of the Governor, nor unless two members at the least (exclusive of the Governor or of the member presiding) be present and assisting throughout the whole of the meetings at which any such business shall be dispatched.

VI. In the execution of the powers and authorities vested in him, the Governor shall be guided by the advice of the Executive Council, but if in any case he shall see sufficient cause to dissent from the opinion of the said Council, he may act in the exercise of his said powers and authorities in opposition to the opinion of the Council, reporting the matter to Us without delay, with the reasons for his so acting.

In any such case it shall be competent to any Member of the said Council to require that there be recorded upon the Minutes of the Council the grounds of any advice or opinion that he may give upon the question.

VII. The Governor shall not, except in the cases hereunder mentioned, assent in Our name to any Bill of any of the following classes :----

1. Any Bill for the divorce of persons joined together in holy matrimony. .

2. Any Bill whereby any grant of land or money, or other donation or gratuity, may be made to himself.

3. Any Bill affecting the currency of the Colony.

4. Any Bill imposing differential duties (other than as allowed by the Australian Colonies' Duties Act, 1873).

5. Any Bill, the provisions of which shall appear inconsistent with obligations imposed upon Us by Treaty.

6. Any Bill interfering with the discipline or control of Our forces in the Colony by land or sea.

7. Any Bill of an extraordinary nature and importance, whereby Our prerogative or the rights and property of Our subjects not residing in the Colony, or the trade and shipping of the United Kingdom and its Dependencies, may be prejudiced.

8. Any Bill containing provisions to which Our assent has been once refused, or which have been disallowed by Us;

Unless he shall have previously obtained Our Instructions upon such Bill through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, or unless such Bill shall contain a clause suspending the operation of such Bill until the signification in the Colony of Our pleasure thereupon, or unless the Governor shall have satisfied himself that an urgent necessity exists requiring that such Bill be brought into immediate operation, in which case he is authorised to assent in Our name to such Bill, unless the same shall be repugnant to the law of England, or inconsistent with any obligations imposed upon Us by Treaty. But he is to transmit to Us by the earliest opportunity the Bill so assented to, together with his reasons for assenting thereto.

VIII. The Governor shall not pardon or reprieve any offender without first receiving in capital cases the advice of the Executive Council, and in other cases the advice of one, at least, of his Ministers; and, in any case in which such pardon or reprieve might directly affect the interests of our Empire, or of any country or place beyond the jurisdiction of the Government of the Colony, the Governor shall, before deciding as to either pardon or reprieve, take those interests specially into his own personal consideration in conjunction with such advice as aforesaid.

IX. All Commissions granted by the Governor to any persons to be Judges, Justices of the Peace, or other officers, shall, unless otherwise provided by law, be granted during pleasure only.

X. The Governor shall not quit the Colony without having first obtained leave from Us for so doing under Our Sign Manual and Signet, or through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, except for the purpose of visiting the Governor of any neighboring Colony for periods not exceeding one month at any one time, nor exceeding in the aggregate one month for every year's service in the Colony.

XI. The temporary absence of the Governor for any period not exceeding one month shall not, if he have previously informed the Executive Council, in writing, of his intended absence, and if he have duly appointed a Deputy in accordance with Our said Letters Patent, nor shall any extension of such period, sanctioned by one of Our Principal Secretaries of State and not exceeding fourteen days, be deemed a departure from the Colony within the meaning of the said Letters Patent.

Perth, 6th July, 1892. HE attention of Bankers and the public generally is particularly requested to the provisions of "The Gold Declaration Act, 1888," which are as follows.

JOHN FORREST, Colonial Treasurer.

1. ANY banker or other person exporting from the Colony any gold, gold ore, gold dust, or gold bullion, if such gold, gold ore, or gold dust shall have been found in or procured from the soil of the Colony, or if the gold contained in such bullion shall have been found in or procured from the soil of the Colony, shall at the Customs declare the weight or value of the same at the time of export.

2. ANY person failing to comply with the provisions of this Act may, on summary conviction before two Justices, be fined any sum not exceeding Ten pounds, or any sum not exceeding an amount equal to Five per cent. on the value of the undeclared articles, whichever sum shall be the greater.

3. NO person exporting from the Colony articles manufactured of gold, although such gold shall have been found in or procured from the soil of the Colony, shall be bound to declare the weight or value of such articles.

Regulations for Shipment of Ships' Stores.

Y virtue of the powers conferred on me by the 147th Section of "The Customs Consolidation Act, 1892 (55 Vic., No. 31)," I hereby direct that the following Regulations shall be observed in connection with the Shipment of Ships' Stores.

1. The master of every ship of the burden of thirty (30) tons, or upwards, departing from any port in Western Australia upon a voyage to parts beyond the seas, may, upon due application made by him to the Collector of Customs at such port, receive an order for the shipment of dutiable goods, as ships' stores, duty free, in accordance with the scale prescribed in Schedule A hereto, for each day of the voyage, the duration being estimated by the Collector of Customs.

2. On receipt of an application in the form of Schedule B, and previous to the passing of an entry for any stores required by any vessel as aforesaid, the master of such vessel, or his agent, must give security by bond, in the form shown in Schedule C hereto, with one or more sureties, for double the amount of duty payable on any goods so required, that they are duly shipped and exported.

3. The Collector of Customs at any port in Western Australia may permit dutiable goods to be delivered as ships' stores, free of duty, on board vessels in such port, for the use of the crew, in such quantities as he may deem requisite.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. All persons desiring to carry dutiable goods from or to any ship, pier, or bond, must obtain from the Collector of Customs a license, as per Schedule A, for each dray or conveyance to be used; and for each lighter or boat in the form of Schedule B; and give a bond, as per Schedules C and D respectively, with two approved sureties, for due compliance with the Customs Laws and Regulations. In the case of drays and conveyances the bond shall be for £100, and for lighters or boats double the value of the craft.

2. Applications must be made in writing to the Collector for such license, in which must be stated the names, calling, and addresses of the two sureties proposed (who must be residents of Western Australia) at full length.

3. The annual fee for such license, payable in advance on the 1st July in each year, is £1, and must be punctually paid, or the license will be promptly suspended.

4. The number of the license, with the word "Customs," must be legibly painted on each dray, vehicle, lighter, or boat.

5. The license can be transferred on written application, provided a new bond is entered into.

6. Draymen and others will be held responsible for the duty on all deficiencies found in any package during transit between the sheds, bonded warehouses, or shipping. They are, therefore, cautioned to take particular care as to the condition of any such goods before signing for them.

7. All vessels or boats used as lighters must be fitted with close bulkheads between the cabin and hold or holds, and between the forecastle and holds or hold, and to each hatchway there shall be properly fitted hatches, and a hatchbar for crossing the hatches, prepared for locking with a Chubb's padlock, in order to effectually secure the same. Each hatchway to be provided with a good and waterproof tarpaulin.

8. Each lighter to have the name of the vessel and the port of license painted in a conspicuous place, in white or yellow Roman letters, not less than two inches in length, on a black ground, and also the words "licensed lighter."

9. And all dutiable goods found in any lighter or boat not duly licensed as a lighter will be deemed to have been illegally removed, and as such will be liable to seizure and forfeiture, together with the lighter or boat.

10. The owner or licensee of every lighter must provide the necessary Chubb's padlocks to the satisfaction of the Collector of Customs. The duplicate keys of the Chubb's padlocks to be handed over to the Collector during the continuance of such license.

11. Registered vessels not being lighters or barges, and vessels employed by Her Majesty's Government, shall be exempt from these regulations.

12. These regulations shall apply to all lighters, boats, and other vessels licensed, at any port in the colony, and to all drays, carts, or vehicles which are licensed, at the undermentioned places : -




