HEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: Now THEREFORE I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested as aforesaid, and of all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation announce and proclaim that THE THIRD SESSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AND THE LEGISLATIVE Assembly, to be holden under the provisions of the said Act, shall be holden, for the despatch of business, on Thursday, the third day of November Next, at the hour of three of the clock, p.m.: the Session of the Legislative Council to be holden in the Legislative Council Chambers, in St. George's Terrace, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly Chambers, in Howick Street, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

### 1382 PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &., &c.

HEREAS by "The Quarantine Ordinance, 1868" (32 Vic., No. 12), it is, amongst other things, enacted that all vessels, as well Her Majesty's Ships of War as others, coming from or having touched at any place from which the Governor shall have adjudged and declared it probable that any infectious disease, dangerous to the health of Her Majesty's subjects, may be brought, shall, upon their arrival at any port or place in the Colony, be obliged to perform Quarantine: AND WHEREAS it has been reported to the Governor that many European and other Ports are infected with the infectious disease known as Cholera: Now THEREFORE I, the Governor of Western Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby adjudge and declare it probable that the infectious disease known as Cholera may be brought from all ports other than the ports of Australasia.

Prohibition of Importation of Articles or Goods.

W HEREAS by Section 32 of "The Customs Consolidation Act, 1892," the Goods enumerated or described therein are prohibited to be imported or brought into Western Australia: And whereas by the said section it is provided that the Governor in Council may by any Order from time to time prohibit the importation of any article or goods, being a manufactured or natural product: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth order that from and after the date hereof, the importation into this Colony of the undermentioned articles, by land or sea, is hereby prohibited; and if any such goods are so imported they shall be absolutely and peremptorily forfeited, as provided by the aforesaid section of the said Act:—

Essence of Brandy. Essence of Geneva. Essence of Rum. Essence of Sherry.

And the Honorable Sir John Forrest, K.C.M.G., Colonial Treasurer, shall give the necessary direction herein accordingly.

The Order-in-Council dated 23rd August, 1892, is hereby rescinded.

By-laws made by the Northam Municipal Council with respect to New Streets and Buildings in the Northam Municipality.

### Interpretation of Terms.

- 1. In the construction of the By-laws relating to New Streets and Buildings, the following words and expressions shall have the meanings hereinafter respectively assigned to them, unless such meanings be repugnant to or inconsistent with the context or subject matter in which such words or expressions occur, that is to say:—
  - "The Authority" means the Northam Municipal Council, or their Surveyor, or other officer acting for them.
  - "Base," applied to a wall, means the underside of the course immediately above the footings.
  - "Topmost-storey" means the uppermost storey in a building, whether used or constructed, or adapted for human habitation or not.
  - human habitation or not.

    "External Wall" means the outer wall of a building not being a party wall, even though adjoining to a wall of another building.
  - "Building of the Warehouse Class" means a warehouse, factory, manufactory, brewery, or distillery.
  - "Domestic Building" means a dwelling-house or an office building, or other outbuilding appurtenant to a dwelling-house, whether attached thereto or not, or a shop or any other building not being a public building, or of the warehouse class.
  - "Dwelling-house" means a building used, or constructed or adapted to be used wholly or principally for human babitation.
  - "Width," applied to a new street, means the whole extent of space intended to be used, or laid out, so as to admit of being used as a public way, exclusive of any steps or projections therein, and measured at right angles to the course or direction of such street.

WITH RESPECT TO THE LEVEL OF NEW STREETS.

2. Every person who shall lay out a new street shall lay out such street at such level as will afford the easiest practicable gradients throughout the entire length of such street for the purpose of securing easy and convenient means of communication with any other street or intended street with which such new street may be connected or may be intended to be connected, and as will allow of compliance with the provisions of the 35th Section of 48 Victoria, No. 15, 1884, or of any Statute or By-law in force within the district for the Regulation of New Streets and Buildings.

## WITH RESPECT TO THE CONSTRUCTION OF EXTERNAL AND OTHER WALLS.

3. A person who shall erect a new building shall not construct any foundation of such building upon any site which shall have been filled up with any material impregnated with fœcal matter, or impregnated with animal or vegetable matter, or upon which any such matter may have been deposited, unless and until such matter shall have been properly removed, by excavation or otherwise, from such site.

- 4. Every person who shall erect a new building shall (except in such cases as are hereinafter specified) cause the external walls of such building to be constructed of good bricks, stone, or other hard and incombustible materials, properly bonded and solidly put together:—
  - (a.) With good mortar, compounded of good lime and clean sharp sand, or other suitable material; or
  - (b.) With good cement; or
  - (c.) With good cement, mixed with clean sharp sand;

### Provided always:

- (a.) That where a new building intended for use as a dwelling-house shall be distant not less than 25ft. from any adjoining property the person erecting such new building may construct its external walls of timber framing, and in accordance with the following regulations; that is to say,—
  - (1.) The timber framing shall be properly put together, and the spaces between the timbers shall be filled in completely with brickwork.
  - (II.) A thickness of at least 4½in. of brickwork shall be placed at the back of every portion of timber, and shall be properly bonded to the brickwork, filling the spaces between the timbers.
- 5. Every person who shall erect a new building shall construct every cross wall, which, in pursuance of the bylaw in that behalf, may serve as a return wall, be deemed a means of determining the length of any external or party wall of such building, of good bricks, stone, or other hard and incombustible material, properly bonded and solidly put together:—
  - (a.) With good mortar, compounded of good lime and clean, sharp sand, or other suitable material; or
  - (b.) With good cement; or
  - (c.) With good cement, mixed with clean, sharp sand.
- 6. Every person who shall erect a new building shall construct any wall of such building so as to rest upon proper footings. He shall cause the projection at the widest part of the footings of every wall on each side of such wall to be at least one-half of the thickness of such wall at its base, unless an adjoining wall interferes, in which case the projection may be omitted where that wall adjoins.

He shall also cause the diminution of the footings to be in regular off-sets, or in one off-set at the top of the footings; and he shall cause the height from the bottom of the footings to the base of the wall to be at least equal to two-thirds of the thickness of the wall at its base.

- 7. Every person who shall erect a new building shall cause the footings of every wall of such building to rest on the solid ground, or upon a sufficient thickness of good concrete, or upon some solid and sufficient substructure as a foundation.
- 8. Every person who shall erect a new building shall cause every wall of such building to have a proper damp course of some durable material, impervious to moisture, laid beneath the level of the lowest timbers, and at a height of not less than 6in. above the surface of the ground adjoining such wall.
- 9. For the purposes of the By-laws with respect to the structure of walls of new buildings, the measurements of heights of storeys, and of height and length of walls, shall be determined by the following rules:—
  - (a.) The height of a topmost storey shall be measured from the level of the upper surface of the floor up to the level of the under-side of the tie of the roof or other covering, or if there is no tie then up to level of half the vertical height of the rafters or other support of the roof.
  - (b.) The height of every storey, other than a topmost storey, shall be measured from the level of the upper surface of the floor of the storey up to the level of the upper surface of the floor of the storey next above it; but no storey built in any basement intended for human habitation shall be of a less height than eight feet.
    - (I.) The height of a wall shall be measured from the top of the footings to the highest part of the wall, or in case of a gable to half the height of the gable.

- (II.) Walls shall be deemed to be divided into distinct lengths by return walls. The length of a wall shall be measured from the centre of one return wall to the centre of another, provided that the return walls are external walls, party walls, or cross walls, of the thickness proscribed by the By-laws, and are bonded into the walls so deemed to be divided.
- 10. Every person who shall erect a new domestic building shall construct every external wall and every party wall of such building in accordance with the following rules, and in every case the thickness prescribed shall be the minimum thickness of which any such wall may be constructed, and the several rules shall apply only to walls built of good bricks, not less than nine inches long, or of suitable stone or other blocks of hard and incombustible substance, the beds being horizontal.
  - (a.) Where the wall does not exceed Height up to twenty-five feet in height its thickness shall be as follows:—
    - If the wall does not exceed 30ft. in length and does not comprise more than two storeys it shall be 9in. thick for its whole height.
    - If the wall exceeds 30ft. in length, or comprises more than two storeys, it shall be 13½in. thick below the topmost storey and 9in. thick for the rest of its height.
  - (b.) Where the wall exceeds 25ft. but Height up to does not exceed 30ft. in height it 30 feet. shall be 13½in. thick below the topmost storey and 9in. thick for the rest of its height.
  - (c.) Where the wall exceeds 30ft. but does not exceed 40ft. in height its thickness shall be as follows:—

    Height up to 40 feet.
    - If the wall does not exceed 35ft. in length it shall be 13½in. thick below the topmost storey and 9in. for the rest of its height. If the wall exceeds 35ft. in length it shall be 18in. thick for the height of one storey, then 13½in. for the rest of its height below the topmost storey, and 9in. thick for the rest of its height.
  - (d.) Where the wall exceeds 40ft. but does not exceed 50ft. in height its thickness shall be as follows:—
    - If the wall does not exceed 30ft. in length it shall be 18in. thick for the height of one storey, then 13½in. thick for the rest of its height.
    - If the wall exceeds 30ft. but does not exceed 45ft. in length it shall be 18in. thick for the height of two storeys, then 13½in. thick for the rest of its height.
    - If the wall exceeds 45ft in length it shall be 22in. thick for the height of one storey, then 18in. thick for the height of the next storey, and then 13½in. for the rest of its height.
  - (e.) If any storey exceeds in height 16 times the thickness prescribed for its walls the thickness of each external wall and of each party wall throughout that storey shall be increased to one-sixteenth part of the height of the storey, and the thickness of each wall and of each party wall below that storey shall be proportionately increased, subject to the provisions hereinafter contained respecting distribution of piers.
- 11. Every person who shall erect a new public building, or a new building of the warehouse class, shall construct every external wall and every party wall of such building in accordance with the following rules; and in every case the thickness prescribed shall be the minimum thickness of which any such wall may be constructed, and the several rules shall apply only to walls built of good bricks, not less than 9in. long, or of suitable stone or other blocks of hard and incombustible substance, the beds or courses being horizontal.
  - (a.) Where the wall does not exceed 25ft. Height up to in height (whatever its length) it shall be 13½ in. thick at its base.
  - (b.) Where the wall exceeds 25ft. but does not exceed 30ft. in height it shall be at its base of the thickness following:—
    - If the wall does not exceed 45ft. in length it shall be 13½in. at its base;

- If the wall exceeds 45ft. in length it shall be 18in, thick at its base.
- (c.) Where the wall exceeds 35ft. but Height up to does not exceed 40ft. in height it shall be at its base of the thickness following:—

  If the wall does not exceed 35ft. in length it shall be 13½in. at its base;

  If the wall exceeds 35ft. in length but does not exceed 45ft. it shall be 18in. thick at its base;
  - exceed 45ft. it shall be 18in. thick at its base; If the wall exceeds 45ft. in length it shall be 22in. thick at its base.
- (d.) Where the wall exceeds 40ft. but does not exceed 50ft. in height it shall be at its base of the thickness following:—
  - If the wall does not exceed 30ft. in length it shall be 18in, thick at its base;
  - If the wall exceeds 35ft. but does not exceed 45ft. in length it shall be 22in. thick at its base.
- (e.) If the wall exceeds 45ft. in length Height up to and does not exceed 60ft. it shall be 26in. thick at its base.

Where by any of the foregoing rules relating to the thickness of external and party walls of public buildings, or of the warehouse class, an increase of the thickness is required if the storey exceeds in height 14 times the thickness prescribed for its walls, the thickness may be confined to piers properly distributed, of which the collective widths amount to one-fourth part the length of the wall

- 12. Every person who shall erect a new building shall cause every party wall of such building to be carried up 9in. at the least in thickness: (I.) Above the roof, flat, or gutter of the highest building adjoining thereto to such height as will give, in the case of a building of the warehouse class, or of any public building, a distance of at least 3ft., and in the case of any other building a distance of at least 15in. above the highest part of any flat or gutter, as the case may be.
- 13. Every person who shall erect a new building shall cause every wall of such building when carried up above any roof, flat, or gutter to be properly coped to prevent water from soaking into any wall.
- 14. A person who shall erect a new building shall not place in any party wall of such building any bond timber, or any plate, block, brick, or plug of wood.
- 15. A person who shall erect a new building shall not place the end of any brest-summer, beam, or joist in any party wall of such building unless the end of such brest-summer, beam, joist, or girder be at least 4½in. distant from the centre line of such party wall.
- 16. Every person who shall erect a new building shall cause every girder used in such building to be of fire-proof material, or to be properly enclosed with some fire-proof substance.
- 17. Every person who shall erect a new building shall cause every girder to be borne by a sufficient template of stone or iron of the full width of the girder.
- 18. Every person who shall erect a new building shall cause every girder or brest-summer to have a bearing in the direction of its length of 9in. at the least at each end.
- 19. A person who shall erect a new building shall cause every brest-summer or girder of such building to have a strong post at each end of the said brest-summer or girder, in addition to its being on any party wall, either of iron or wood, fixed on a solid foundation.
- 20. Every person who shall erect a new building shall cause the open space inside any partition wall of such building, or between the joist in any wall of such building, to be stopped with brickwork, concrete, pugging, or other incombustible material at every floor and ceiling.
- 21. Every person who shall erect a new building shall, except as is hereafter provided, cause every chimney of such building to be built on solid foundations, and with footings similar to the walls against which such chimney is built, and to be properly bonded into such wall.
- 22. Provided, nevertheless, that such person may cause any chimney of such building to be built on sufficient corbels of brick or stone, if the work so corbeled out does not project from the wall more than the thickness of the wall.
- 23. Every person who shall erect a new building shall cause the inside of every flue of such building to be properly rendered or pargetted as such flue is carried up.
- 24. Every person who shall erect a new building shall cause every flue in such building, which may be intended for use in connection with any furnace cockle, steam

- boiler, or close fire constructed for the purpose of trade, business, or manufacture, or which may be intended for use in connection with any cooking range or cooking apparatus of such building, when occupied as an hotel, tavern, or eatinghouse, to be surrounded with brickwork at least 9in. thick for a distance of 10ft. at the least in height from the floor on which such furnace cockle, steam boiler, close fire, cooking range, or cooking apparatus may be constructed or placed.
- 25. Every person who shall erect a new building shall cause a sufficient arch of brick or stone, or a sufficient bar of wrought iron to be built over the opening of every chimney of such building to support the breast of such chimney, and if the breast projects more than 4½in. from the face of the wall, and the jamb on either side is of less width than 13½in., he shall cause the abutments to be tied in by a bar or bars of wrought iron of sufficient strength, 18in. longer than the opening, turned up and down at the ends, and built into the jambs on each side.
- 26. Every person who shall erect a new building shall cause the jambs of every chimney of such building to be at least 9in. wide on each side of the opening of such chimney.
- 27. Every person who shall erect a new building shall cause the breast of every chimney of such building, and the brickwork or stonework surrounding every smoke flue, and every copper flue of such building to be at least  $4\frac{1}{2}$ in. in thickness.
- 28. Every person who shall erect a new building shall cause every chimney shaft or smoke flue of such building to be carried up in brickwork all round at least 4½in. thick to a height of not less than 3ft. above the roof, flat, or gutter adjoining thereto.
- 29. A person who shall erect a new building shall not place any iron holdfast, or other metal fastening, nearer than 2in. to the inside of any flue or chimney opening in such building.
- 30. A person who shall erect a new building shall not place any timber or woodwork:—
  - (a.) In any wall or chimney breast of such building nearer than 9in, to the inside of any flue or chimney opening.
  - (b.) Under any chimney opening of such building within 15in. from the upper surface of the hearth thereof.
    - A person who shall erect a new building shall not drive any wooden plug into any wall or chimney breast of such building nearer than 6in. to the inside of any flue or chimney opening.

WITH RESPECT TO WATER CLOSETS AND EARTH CLOSETS.

- 31. Every person who shall construct a water closet or earth closet in a building shall construct such water closet or earth closet in such a position that one of its sides, at the least, shall be in an external wall.
- 32. Every person who shall construct an earth closet in connection with a building, whether the situation of such earth closet be or not within such building, shall construct in one of the outer walls of such earth closet a window of not less dimensions than 2ft. by 1ft., exclusive of the frame, and opening directly into the external air.

He shall, in addition to such window, cause such earth closet to be provided with adequate means of constant ventilation by at least one air-brick built in an external wall of such earth closet, or by an air shaft, or by some other effectual method or appliance.

33. As to giving of notices, deposit of plans and sections by persons intending to lay out streets or to construct buildings as to inspection by the authority, and as to the power of such authority to remove, alter, or pull down any work begun or done in contravention of the by-laws:—

Every person who shall intend to lay out a block of ground for building within the Municipality shall give to the Council notice in writing of such intention, which shall be delivered or sent to the Mayor, the clerk, or their surveyor, at his or their office, and shall, at the same time, deliver or send duplicate plans and sections of any intended street drawn to a scale of not less than one inch to every forty-four feet, and, if approved by the Council, shall be signed by the surveyor, and returned to the applicant or his agent before any work shall be commenced. Such person shall show on every such plan the limits of the ground, the names of the owners of the land through or over which any street shall be intended to pass, the intended level and width, the points of the compass, the intended mode of construction, the intended name of the street, and its intended position in relation to the streets nearest thereto, the size and number of the buildings to be erected thereon, and the name and address of the person intending to lay out such street.

Such person shall sign such plan, or cause the same to be signed by his duly authorised agent.

Such person shall show on every such section the levels of the present surface of the ground above some known datum, the intended level and rate or rates of inclination of the streets with which it is intended that such street shall be connected, and the intended levels of the lowest floors of the intended building.

- 34. When a person who shall lay out or construct a street, or shall erect a building, or shall execute any other work to which the by-laws relating to new streets and buildings may apply, shall at any reasonable time during the progress, or after the completion of the laying out or construction of such street, or the erection of such building, or the execution of such work receives from the Council or their execution of such work, receive from the Council or their officer notice in writing specifying any matter in respect of which the laying out or construction of such street, the erection of such building, or the execution of such work may be in contravention of any by-law relating to new streets or buildings, or to the provisions of "The Building Act, 1884," and requiring such persons within a reasonable time, which shall be specified in such notice, to cause any thing done contrary to any such by-laws or to the said Act to be amended, or to do anything which by any such by-law, or by such Act, may be required to be done, but which has been omitted to be done.
- 35. Such person shall, within the time specified in such notice, comply with the several requirements thereof, so far as such requirements relate to matters in respect of which the laying out or construction of such street, the erection of such building, or the execution of such work as may be in contravention of any such by-laws or Act.

Such person shall, within seven days after the completion of any work which may have been executed in accordance with such requirement, deliver or send to the Council notice in writing of the completion of such work.

36. The contractor for any new building about to be sol. The contractor for any new binding about to be erected after this date must apply to the town surveyor for the line of frontage and levels three days before the commencement of any works, and the contractor shall have no right to commence such work until he has the said authority in writing from the town surveyor, and has paid him a fee according to the following scale :-

37. Every person who shall offend against any of the foregoing by-laws shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of Five pounds, and in the case of continuing offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after written notice from the Council: Provided, nevertheless, that the Justices or Court before whom any complaint may be made or any proceedings may be taken in respect of any such offence, may, if they think fit, adjudge the pay-ment as a penalty of any sum less than the full amount of the penalty imposed by this by-law.

38. If any work to which any of the by-laws may apply be begun or done in contravention of any such by-law, the person by whom such work shall be so begun or done, by a notice in writing signed by the clerk to the Council and duly served upon or delivered to such person, shall be required on or before such day, which shall be specified in such notice, by a statement in writing to show sufficient cause why such work shall not be removed, altered, or pulled down.

If such person fail to show sufficient cause why such work shall not be removed, altered, or pulled down, the Council shall be empowered, subject to any statutory provision in that behalf, to remove, alter, or pull down such work.

### CENTRAL SCAB DISTRICT.
