HEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: Now THEREFORE I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested as aforesaid, and of all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation announce and proclaim that THE THIRD SESSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AND THE LEGISLATIVE Assembly, to be holden under the provisions of the said Act, shall be holden, for the despatch of business, on Thursday, the third day of November Next, at the hour of three of the clock, p.m.: the Session of the Legislative Council to be holden in the Legislative Council Chambers, in St. George's Terrace, in the City of Perth, in the said Colony; and the Session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly Chambers, in Howick Street, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

HEREAS by "The Imported Stock Act, 1876," and "The Prevention of the Importation of Diseased Stock Act, 1879," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to acquire and set apart, by Proclamation in the Gazette, such ground as may be required for one or more Quarantine Stations, on which the necessary sheds and appurtenances may be erected, for the purposes of the said Acts; And whereas it is deemed expedient to set apart a temporary Quarantine Station for Dogs at the Abrolhos: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers in me vested as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby set apart, as a temporary Quarantine Station, Gun Island, one of the group of Houtman's Abrolhos, for the purposes of the said Acts, for a period not to exceed seven months from this date.
