HEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: Now THEREFORE I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested as aforesaid, and of all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation announce and proclaim that THE THIRD SESSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AND THE LEGISLATIVE Assembly, to be holden under the provisions of the said Act, shall be holden, for the despatch of business, on Thursday, the third day of November next, at the hour of three of the clock, p.m.: the Session of the Legislative Council to be holden in the Legislative Council Chambers, in St. George's Terrace, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly Chambers, in Howick Street, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

WHEREAS on the 30th day of August, 1890, a Convention was made at London between Her Majesty and the President of the French Republic, respecting the postal service between France and French possessions and the United Kingdom and British possessions, the terms of which Convention are set forth in the Schedule to the "Mail Ships (France) Order in Council, 1892."

And whereas the ratifications of the said Convention were exchanged on the 23rd day of March, 1891:

And whereas by section 8 of "The Mail Ships Act, 1891," it is provided, that an Order in Council may for the purpose of a Convention with a foreign State apply the said Act, subject to any exceptions or modifications not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act, to any British possession, and that the said Act when so applied should, subject to those exceptions and modifications, and subject as therein-after mentioned have effect as if it were reenacted, with the substitution of such British possession for the United Kingdom, provided that, before it should be applied to any British possession named in the Schedule to the said Act the Government of such possession should have adhered to the Convention:

And whereas the Governments of certain of the British possessions named in the Schedule to the said Act, namely, South Australia and Western Australia have adhered to the said Convention:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Act should, for the purpose of the said Convention, apply to the abovementioned British possessions, subject to the exceptions and modifications in this Order contained:

Now, THEREFORE, Her Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by "The Mail Ships Act, 1891," or otherwise, in Her Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. "The Mail Ships Act, 1891," shall, for the purpose of the said Convention, apply to the following British possessions, namely, South Australia and Western Australia, subject, however, to the provisions of section 8 of the said Act, and also to the exceptions and modifications following, that is to say:—
 - (i.) The expression "Officer of Customs" shall mean an officer of the Customs Department of the possession.
 - (ii.) In lieu of subsections (1) and (2) of section 7 of the said Act the following provisions shall be substituted, that is to say: Every offence may be prosecuted and every fine may be recovered by action or other legal proceedings in any court of the possession competent to impose fines, but any fine imposed by a court of inferior or limited jurisdiction shall not exceed either the amount authorised by the said Act or the amount of fine which the Court may impose in the exercise of its ordinary jurisdiction, whichever of the said amounts shall be the less; and there shall be the same right of appeal (if any) against any such fine as in other cases of fines imposed by the same court in the exercise of its ordinary jurisdiction; and every court, whether of original or appellate jurisdiction, may reduce the amount of any fine.
 - (iii.) The regulations required to be made under subsection (4) of section 7 of the said Act, by the Commissioners of Customs with the consent of the Treasury, shall, in the possession, be made by the Governor in Council.
 - (iv.) Section 5 of the said Act, so far as relates to the Commissioners of Customs, shall not apply in the possession.

- 2. The said Act shall apply as regards any public ship of the French Republic when employed as a mail ship in the cases authorised by Article 5 of the said Convention.
- 3. This Order may be cited as "The Mailships (France) Order in Council, 1892 (South Australia and Western Australia)."

NOTICE TO SHIPPERS OF MERCHANDISE TO THE REPUBLIC OF CHILE.

It is hereby notified that, in order to facilitate the operation of checking all Packages of Merchandise for deposit in any of the Customs Warehouses in the Republic of Chile, it has been decreed by His Excellency the President that from the First day of January, 1893, no Merchandise will be admitted into the aforesaid Warehouses unless the gross weight in kilograms be distinctly marked upon each Package close to the mark and number thereon.

In all cases where the said Decree is not complied with, such Packages will be weighed and marked at the risk and expense of the Consignees thereof, and charged to the Agents of the Ship by which they are imported before being warehoused.

GERALDTON LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH BY-LAWS.

- 1. The Local Board of Health shall have power to give notice—60 days—to all owners of property in that part of the Town defined in By-Law 6, to fill in all cesspits, and cause earth closets to be substituted in their place.
- 2. The Local Board of Health or the Chairman may from time to time appoint any place or places within the town of Geraldton or elsewhere, for the reception of nightsoil, manure, offal, or other offensive refuse, or may at any time cancel or vary such appointment, and the Inspector of the said Board may at all times have free ingress and egress upon the said places, and such place or places shall be registered in a book kept for that purpose by the said Board; and it shall be lawful for the said Board to receive compensation from the owner of such place or places for such deposit, and the money so received shall be applied by the said Board in carrying out "The Public Health Act, 1886"
- 3. The Board shall transact its business at the General Meetings of the Municipal Council, and Special Meetings may be called at any time in the same manner as Special Meetings of the Council.
- 4. All moneys shall be placed in the National Bank to the credit of the General Revenue of the Municipality, and all payments made by cheque drawn by the Treasurer, and countersigned by the Mayor; a separate account being kept of all monetary transactions in connection with the Local Board of Health.
- 5. The duties of the Secretary and Inspector of Nuisances shall be—To make himself thoroughly acquainted with the provisions of "The Public Health Act, 1886," and carry out its provisions under instructions from the Board and Health Officer. To visit occasionally at uncertain times the several parts of the Town, and if necessary give his advice to the occupiers of premises as to the prevention of nuisances and deodorising offensive matter. To keep a monthly record of all notices issued to abate nuisances, and the result thereof. To keep constantly hung up, outside the office door, the names and abodes of all Licensed Nightmen for the information of the public. To summons, attend, and take minutes of all meetings of the Board, keep accounts, and perform such other clerical duties as may be necessary.
- 6. The dry earth or pail system shall be used at present in an area comprised and bounded as follows:—By a line from Town Lot 107 along Burges-street to Augustus-street, thence along Augustus-street to Evans-street, along Evans-street to Shenton-street, along Shenton-street to Holland-street, along Holland-street to Maitland-street, along Maitland-street to Elwes-street, along Elwes-street to Sandford-street, along Sandford-street to Durlacher-street, from thence along Sandune-road to George-road, and continued to Sub. Lot. 95, thence to Town Lot 382 in Mark-street, and along the water line to Town Lot 107.
- 7. Should any nightman neglect or refuse, without reasonable excuse, to properly clean any cesspool, water-closet or earth closet, or to remove any other offensive matter for 24 hours after demand from the Inspector, or any occupier of premises within the town, he shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding One Pound, and the Inspector or occupier may engage any other nightman for the service
- 8. No nightsoil or other offensive matter shall be removed before 11 p.m. or after 5 a.m.; any person guilty of a breach of this By-Law shall be subject on conviction to a penalty of not more than Five Pounds.
- 9. Any person who shall deposit broken glass, bottles, empty tins, or other rubbish, in any street or other public place within the town, or other than the places set apart for that purpose, shall on conviction thereof, in addition to the expense of removing the same, be subject also to a penalty of not more than Two Pounds.
- 10. No person shall exercise or practise the business of a nightman, or drive any nightcart within the limits of the Town of Geraldton, unless and until he shall have obtained a license to do so from the Inspector subject to the approval of the Board.
- 11. Nightmen's licenses shall be in the form contained in the schedule hereto annexed marked A, or to the like effect, and shall be numbered in such manner as shall be approved by the Board.
- 12. Nightmen's licenses, at whatever period of the year they may be granted, shall remain in force only until the 31st day of December then next ensuing; provided that apart from any penalty which may be inflicted under the provisions hereof, it shall be lawful for the Board, upon

Force by Beaufort's scale,

being satisfied of the misconduct of any licensed nightman whilst engaged in the business for which he shall be so licensed, to cancel any such license, or to suspend the operation thereof for any such time as the Board shall deem fit; and if any such nightman shall, after such cancellation, or during the period of such suspension, practise such business as if under the authority of such license, he shall be subject, upon conviction thereof, to a penalty not exceeding Two Pounds.

- 13. Every licensed nightman whenever or so long as he shall be engaged in removing any nightsoil or other offensive matter or thing, or in driving any nightcart, or otherwise in conducting the said business, shall carry with and about him his license, and shall produce and show the same whenever required by any person to do so; and such license he shall, on no pretence whatever, lend or part with to any other person.
- 14. Every licensed nightman shall, whilst using any cart or other carriage as a nightcart, have painted, and kept at all times conspicuous on the right or off-side thereof, white upon a black ground, his name together with the words "Licensed Nightman," in letters not less than two inches in length and of proportionate breadth, and the number assigned to such nightcart in figures not less than four inches in length and of proportionate breadth.
- 15. For the purpose of these By-Laws the word "nightman" shall be understood to mean any person who for remuneration shall remove, or assist to remove, any nightsoil or other foul or offensive matter or thing whatever; and the word nighteart shall mean any cart or other carriage of any description whatsoever, used by nightmen for the conveyance of any nightsoil, ammoniacal liquor, or other offensive liquid or substance.
- 16. Each house shall be provided with a dustbin, or other suitable receptacle, of a size to be approved by the Inspector, and shall be kept clean and free from offensive smell, and shall be cleaned at least once every month, or as often as the Inspector may direct.
- 17. Any licensed nightman who shall ask or demand or receive from any person or persons, for work done by him, any sum greater than that fixed by Schedule B of these By-Laws, shall be guilty of an offence against these By-Laws.
- 18. Every bucket or pan kept for the reception of nightsoil shall be of iron, and shall be of a shape and size approved by the Inspector.
- 19. Every privy or closet shall be built in such a position as may be approved by the Inspector or the Board, and every person having or building a closet contrary to this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than One Pound, nor more than Five Pounds.
- 20. All penalties recoverable under these By-Laws shall be applied in the manner directed by Section 129 of the Ordinance, 50 Victoria, No. 19. Wherever in these By-Laws the word Inspector is used, it shall be taken to mean the Inspector for the time being of the said Local Board, or anyone duly appointed to act in his place.
