NORTH FREMANTLE BRIDGE.

P.W. 3800.

SPECIAL Regulations for the management and use of the North Fremantle Paris of by the Governor in Executive Council on the 18th of October, 1892, in accordance with the provisions of "The Jetties Regulation Act, 1878" (42 Vic., No.

1. All Special Regulations heretofore made for the management and use of the North Fremantle Bridge are altered and cancelled from this date.

- 2. No person shall drive, or cause to be driven, any vehicle containing a load exceeding 25 cwt. on to or across the Bridge.
- 3. No animal or vehicle shall be ridden or driven on to or across the Bridge at other than a walking
- 4. No cattle, camels, or horses shall be driven on to or across the Bridge between the months of April and September (both inclusive) except between the hours of 5 a.m. and 7.30 a.m., or between the months of October and March (both inclusive) except between the hours of 4 a.m. and 6 a.m., unless the same shall be harnessed to some vehicle.
- 5. All persons in charge of or driving cattle, camels, or horses on to or across the Bridge shall place a person at the opposite end of the Bridge to caution other persons against crossing during the transit of such cattle, camels, or horses.

NOTICE.

Every person violating the above Regulations shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding £20. (42 Vic., No. 18, Sec. 3.)

Also for the conveyance of all mails from the Post Office to (a) the steam launch lying at the Town Jetty and vice $vers\hat{a}$, and (b) to the steam launch lying at the Land Company's Jetty and vice $vers\hat{a}$, as often as required, in a spring vehicle.

3. Albany-Broome Hill.

From the Albany Post Office to the Post Office at Broome Hill, $vi\acute{a}$ Woodburn, Tackalarup, Warrenup, Mongup, Glengarry, and Martinup, and $vice\ vers \acute{a}$, once a fortnight, on horseback.

4. Wagin-Arthur River.

Between the Post Office at Wagin and the Arthur River Post Office, once a week, in a spring vehicle.

5. Australind-Hampton.

From Australind to Hampton and vice versa, via Rosamel, Parkfield, Spring Hill, Runnymede, Myalup, and the homesteads of Messrs. M. B. Smith, Alfred Crampton, and C. Crampton, on Harvey Plains, and of Messrs. Piggott and Perrin, on Long Swamp, once a week, on horseback.

6. Boyanup-Bridgetown.

From the railway terminus at Boyanup to the Post Office at Bridgetown, $vi\hat{a}$ Preston, Balingup, and Greenbushes, twice a week, and thence to Balbarup, once a week, and vice $vers\hat{a}$, in a spring vehicle.

7. Carnarvon-Yanyereddie.

From Carnarvon to Yanyereddie and vice versû, viû the homesteads of Messrs. Cleveland, Campbell, and Musk, and Newman's boundary well between Middalya and Williamsberry Station, receiving and delivering letters, &c., en route, once a fortnight, on horseback or in a spring vehicle.

8. Carnarvon-Gascoyne (Dairy Creek, Mr. Fitz-patrick's Station).

From Carnarvon to Dairy Creek and vice versa, receiving and delivering letters, &c., at the various homesteads en route, including Walbewardoo (Mr. Munroe's), once a fortnight, in a spring vehicle.

9. Carnarvon-Jetty.

From the Post Office at Carnarvon to the Jetty Landing, and *vice versâ*, as often as required, in cart or spring vehicle.

10. Dongara Railway Station and Jetty.

From the Dongara Post Office to the Railway Station, and vice versa, and from the Post Office at Dongara to the Jetty, and vice versa, as often as required, in a spring vehicle.

11. Geraldton-Moorarrie.

From Geraldton to Moorarrie, and vice verså, viå Tibradden, Yuin, Murgoo, Boolardy, Manfred, Milly Milly, and Beringarra, returning viå Beringarra, Milly Milly, Manfred, and Boolardy, to Murgoo, and from Murgoo to Gullewa, and vice verså, viå Mount Wittenoom, Meka, and Warra Warra, once every four weeks, performing that portion between Geraldton and Beringarra in a spring vehicle, and between Beringarra and Moorarrie on horseback. (See also No. 15).

11a. Goomalling-Mangowine.

From Goomalling to Mangowine (Mr. Adam's) and vice versa, calling at the various homesteads en route, once a fortnight, on horseback.

12. Greenough-Walkaway.

From Greenough to Walkaway, and vice versa, two trips a day, twice a week, on horse-back or vehicle, when required.

13. Jarrahdale-Cockram's Crossing.

Between the Jarrahdale Post Office and the Crossing near Cockram's, four times a week, on horseback, at per trip.

22. Perth-Wanneroo.

From Perth to Wanneroo, and vice versa, on horseback, once a week, calling at the various homesteads en route to deliver and receive letters and newspapers.

23. Pilbarra-Nullagine.

From Pilbarra to Nullagine and Western Shaw, viâ Messrs. Must and McKenzie's, Wagina, Look's, G. and J. Withnell's, and Bamboo Springs, once a month, on horse-back.

24. Preston-Mr. Fisher's.

Between Preston Post Office and Mr. Fisher's residence, calling at the various homesteads *en route*, once a week, on horseback.

$25. \ Serpentine-Low lands.$
