## The Fishery Act, 1889.

 $\frac{1842}{92}$ 

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, 17th November, 1892.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the power vested in the Governor in Council by "The Fishery Act, 1889," the Governor in Council did, by Regulation published in the Government Gazette on the 9th June, 1892, declare it unlawful for any person to fish, by means of any net or fixed engine, within the following limits of the Canning River, that is to say:—

From the Lower Canning Bridge to the Upper Canning Bridge,

His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council doth hereby declare and prescribe that such Regulation aforesaid shall not, from the 1st day of December to the 30th day of April in any year, apply to the taking of Shrimps or Prawns, within the following limits of the Canning River, that is to say:—

Between the Lower Canning Bridge and a due East line from Mount Henry across the River.

Whereas by Section 6 of "The Fishery Act, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, by Regulations to be published in the Government Gazette, amongst other things, "to prescribe the limits in or about the "mouth of, or within any river, creek, stream, "estuary, or other inlet of the sea, within which it "shall not be lawful for any person to fish by means "of any net or fixed engine, and to impose such "reasonable penalties, not exceeding £20, and "forfeitures, as the Governor in Council may think "fit, for any breach of such Regulations:"

His Excellency the Governor in Council does by this Regulation declare it to be unlawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine in or about the mouth of the Swan River, that is to say:—

Between the Bar and the North Fremantle Road Bridge and a quarter of a mile from the Bar seaward, from the 1st day of December to the 1st day of March in every year.

Every person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of £10 for the first offence, and £20 for every subsequent offence, and shall forfeit the net or engine used, and all fish which he shall have taken.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that the following alterations in the Bunbury Jetty Regulations have been made, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, this 22nd of November, 1892:—

## TIMBER, WHARFAGE DUES.

Timber ex Bunbury-Boyanup Railway, if discharged by the Railway Department from railway trucks into ship, 2s. per ton of 40 cubic feet.

Timber, if loaded and unloaded by shippers, 1s. per ton of 40 cubic feet.

Timber is not to remain under load unless demurrage is paid for detention. If it be necessary to discharge timber at shore end of Bunbury Jetty, to wait ship's arrival, it should be discharged by owners; and when required for shipment, owners must do their own loading and discharging. The Department will do the haulage from shore end to ship's side, and charge wharfage dues at 1s. per ton.

Should timber be delayed on the Department's ground at shore end of Jetty longer than sixty (60) days, a charge of 2s. per ton per week, to be made for each week or part thereof following the sixty (60) days.
