WHEREAS it is enacted by the second section of "The Small Debts Ordinance, 1863," that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, and at any time, by Proclamation published in the Western Australian *Government Gazette*, to constitute Local Courts for the recovery of small debts and demands, to be holden at such times and places and within such Districts throughout the said Colony as may be most fit and convenient, and as may be specified in such Proclamation, and likewise by Proclamation to alter the time and place or manner of holding any such Courts; and that it has been deemed expedient to alter, as hereinafter specified, the time for holding the Local Court at Fremantle: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of such power, do hereby notify and proclaim that from and after the 1st of January, 1893, the Local Court at Fremantle shall be held fortnightly, on the *second and last Mondays* in each and every month.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that the following alterations in the Bunbury Jetty Regulations have been made, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, this 22nd of November, 1892:—

TIMBER, WHARFAGE DUES.

Timber *ex* Bunbury-Boyanup Railway, if discharged by the Railway Department from railway trucks into ship, 2s. per ton of 40 cubic feet.

Timber, if loaded and unloaded by shippers, 1s. per ton of 40 cubic feet.

Timber is not to remain under load unless demurrage is paid for detention. If it be necessary to discharge timber at shore end of Bunbury Jetty, to wait ship's arrival, it should be discharged by owners; and when required for shipment, owners must do their own loading and discharging. The Department will do the haulage from shore end to ship's side, and charge wharfage dues at 1s. per ton.

Should timber be delayed on the Department's ground at shore end of Jetty longer than sixty (60) days, a charge of 2d.* per ton per week to be made for each week or part thereof following the sixty (60) days.

Section 9.

And every District Registrar shall inform himself carefully of every Birth, Death, or Marriage happening within his district, and shall, as soon as possible after the event, register the same respectively.

Section 22.

That in each case of the BIRTH of every child in the said Colony the parent shall, *within thirty days*, and in the case of the DEATH of any person the tenant of the house or place shall, *within fourteen days next thereafter*, respectively inform the District Registrar of such Birth or Death, and of all the particulars concerning the same, according to the form of registration hereinbefore referred to.

Section 26.

That in case any new-born child, or any dead body, shall be found exposed, the constable, in case of a new-born child, and the coroner, or, if none such, the Resident or Police Magistrate of the district, in case of a dead body, shall forthwith inform the District Registrar thereof, and of the place where the child or dead body was found; and where an inquest or magisterial inquiry shall be held on any dead body, the coroner or magistrate, as the case may be, shall notify to the District Registrar the verdict of the jury, or the opinion of such magistrate, with all other particulars required to be registered, concerning the death; and such District Registrar shall make the entry accordingly.

Section 30.

That every person who shall offend against this Ordinance by refusing or neglecting to give any notice or information required by any of the foregoing sections, or by knowingly registering any Birth or Death contrary to the provisions of any of the said sections, shall for every such offence forfeit a sum not less than Two pounds, nor exceeding Twenty pounds.
