By His Excellency SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the thirty-first section of "The Goldfields Act, 1886," it is lawful for the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to establish on any Goldfield one or more Courts, to be presided over and holden by a Warden, and which shall be a Court of Record, and shall have jurisdiction to hear and determine all actions, suits, claims, demands, disputes, and questions which may arise in relation to Mining: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that a second such Court should be established on the Yilgarn Goldfield: NOW THEREFORE I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, G.C.M.G., Governor of the said Colony, in Executive Council, do hereby establish a Warden's Court at "Coolgardie" for and in respect of the said Goldfield; such Court to be presided over and holden by the Resident Warden of the Yilgarn Goldfield, or in his absence by the Acting Warden thereof.

The Governor in Executive Council directs and orders the publication of the following additional Regulation under "The Explosives Act, 1885" (49 Victoria, No. 16):—

The Collector or Sub-Collector of Customs at any port of the Colony may, by writing under his hand, exempt from the provisions of Regulation 3 of "The Explosives Act Rules," published in the *Government Gazette* of the 4th March, 1886, any coasting ship proceeding to sea with explosives on board from such Port, and any ship so exempted may at any time be taken alongside any public wharf or landing place.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Government offers a Bonus to any person or company who, during the year 1893, shall sink on any of the declared Goldfields of the Colony a Shaft as hereinafter mentioned, and according to the following conditions, from a depth previously attained of not less than 100 feet:—

For a shaft to be sunk from below the depth of 100 feet to a depth of 200 feet, @ £2 10s. per foot.

For a shaft to be sunk from below the depth of 200 feet to a depth of 300 feet, @ £5 per foot.

CONDITIONS.

Each shaft to be vertical throughout, with a superficial area of not less than 27 feet in the clear when completed, and a minimum width of not less than 3 feet, to be sunk and timbered where necessary, to the satisfaction of the Warden or his Deputy.

Provided, that if any shaft has been already sunk of a less superficial area than 27 feet, the bonus shall be paid in proportion; but in no case shall any bonus be paid for a shaft having a less area than 20 feet, or less than 3 feet in width.

Payments will be made monthly as the work progresses. No payments will be made for less than 10 feet, and all work shall be measured and passed by the Warden or his Deputy before payment, and the decision of the Warden or his Deputy shall be final.

No payment will be made in respect of the first 100 feet from the surface.

With regard to existing shafts, no payment will be made in respect of work done before the date hereof.

Any person intending to deepen any existing shaft of or exceeding the depth of 100 feet shall give notice in writing to the Warden or his Deputy of the depth of the said shaft, and of his intention to deepen the same.

The Warden or his Deputy shall ascertain and certify the depth of such shaft, and payment shall be made only in respect of the work done beyond the depth certified by the Warden or his Deputy.

Any person intending to sink a new shaft with the intention of claiming a bonus shall give notice in writing of such intention before the commencement of the work, or before the shaft is down 100 feet.

No company or person shall receive assistance for more than one shaft on the same mining property.

B Y E - L A W S
OF
The Western Australian Turf Club.

PART I.

Bye-Laws regulating the election or admission of Members into the Club, and the expulsion of Members therefrom, and for providing for the due management of the affairs of the Club.

1. All rules and regulations of The Western Australian Turf Club made on or before the 1st day of October, 1892, shall be and are hereby repealed.

Members.

2. The Western Australian Turf Club consists of all persons who have been duly elected Members, and who have duly paid their Subscriptions pursuant to the Bye-Laws of the Club.

MEMBERS AND ADMISSION OF MEMBERS.

Honorary Life Members.

3. Any gentleman who shall give a plate, purse or trophy, of the value of One Hundred Pounds, to be run for at the races under the management of the Club, may be admitted a Life Member of the Club.

Admission of members by Committee by ballot.

4. Candidates for admission as Members of the Club shall be elected by the Committee, by ballot. One black ball in every five votes shall exclude, and no candidate shall be so admitted unless notice of his candidature has previously been sent to each member of the Committee in the circular convening the meeting for such election.

Entrance Fee.

5. Every candidate shall within one month after election pay an entrance fee of One Pound, otherwise his election shall be void, unless he shall justify the delay to the satisfaction of the Committee.

Addresses of members.

6. All members shall communicate their addresses from time to time to the Secretary of the Club, who shall register the same, and all letters delivered at or sent by post to such addresses shall be sufficient. If no addresses be given, all letters and notices posted and addressed to the last known place of abode of the member shall be sufficient.

ANNUAL SUBSCRIPTION.

7. The Annual Subscription shall be Two Pounds, payable in advance to the Secretary on the first day of May.

Non-payment thereof.

8. If any member neglect to pay his subscription when due notice shall be sent to him or his agent (if known) or to his last known place of abode by the Secretary; and if the subscription be not paid before the next following race meeting of the Club, the defaulter shall cease to be a member of the Club, and his name shall be erased from the list of members, unless he can assign to the Committee reasons which they may deem satisfactory for his default; then, on payment of the amount due, the Committee may replace his name upon the list.

Non-paying members not to vote.

9. No member shall be competent to vote on any occasion whatever, or enjoy any of the privileges of a member, until he shall have paid his subscription.

HONORARY MEMBERS.

Governor and Staff.

10. The Governor of Western Australia and his Staff shall be Honorary Members of the Club.

Visitors.

11. Visitors to the Colony may be admitted by the Committee as Honorary Members at any race meeting, without payment of any subscription.

ABSENTEE MEMBERS.

12. Any member of the Club who may be absent from Western Australia, or who may be about to absent himself therefrom, may give notice thereof in writing to the Secretary, and thereupon shall be exempt from the annual subscription during his absence from the Colony, and such member shall, on giving to the Secretary notice in writing of his return to the Colony within six months after such return, and on payment of his subscription from the date of his return to the end of the then current year, be again entitled to all privileges as a member of the Club.

NON-EFFECTIVE MEMBERS.

13. All Commissioned Officers of the Imperial Navy or Army on the full-pay list whilst employed in the Naval or Military service of the Colony, and all Consuls and other gentlemen holding diplomatic appointments in Western

Australia, and not engaged in professional or commercial pursuits in any of the Australian Colonies or New Zealand, during the time they hold such diplomatic appointments, may, subject to the approval of the Committee, be non-effective members of the Club upon payment of the subscription half-yearly, but no non-effective or honorary member shall be present or vote at any meeting.

OFFICERS.

Committee of Management to be elected.

14. The affairs and general business of the Club shall be managed by a Committee consisting of twelve members, to be elected at the General Meeting. The six longest in office shall retire annually, but shall be eligible for re-election; and in the event of any dispute between two or more retiring members as to who has been longest in office, the same shall be decided by lot.

Chairman.

15. The Chairman of the Committee shall be elected by the Committee at their first meeting after the General Meeting.

Stewards.

16. The Committee shall, at their first meeting after the General Meeting, proceed to the election of five Stewards, who shall be members of the Club, and whose term of office shall be twelve months. Any vacancy in their number shall be filled up by the Committee.

Secretary and Treasurer.

17. The Committee shall also appoint a Secretary and a Treasurer.

Committee to be elected by ballot from names proposed fourteen days before Meeting. Scrutineers to be chosen. Committee to make Regulations. Vacancies in Committee.

18. The names of all members proposed or submitting themselves for election as members of the Committee shall be forwarded to the Secretary of the Club at least fourteen clear days before the General Meeting, from which names shall be elected by ballot the members of the Committee in place of those who retire, or whose term of office shall have expired; and a list of such names, in alphabetical order, shall be published in one of the West Australian newspapers. Should a sufficient number of members not offer themselves for election, any remaining vacancies shall be filled up at the General Meeting. The ballot shall commence at 3:30 and close at 9 p.m., and opened in the presence of three Scrutineers chosen by the General Meeting. The majority of such Scrutineers shall, at the close of the ballot, certify to the Secretary the names of the successful candidates; and in case of there being an equal number of votes recorded for two or more candidates, the majority of the Scrutineers shall then decide who shall be elected. The names contained in such certificate of the Scrutineers, or a majority of them, shall be the members of the Committee in place of those who retire, or whose term of office shall have expired. The Committee shall from time to time make such provision as they shall think necessary for taking such ballot.

Voting by Ballot.

19. A member unable to attend on the day of election to record his vote may, at any time after the names of intending candidates have been duly advertised, obtain from the Secretary a ballot paper, and after duly notifying thereon the members for whom he proposes to vote, shall put such paper into an envelope endorsed "Ballot Paper," addressed to the Secretary, and the Secretary shall retain such ballot paper and envelope until the day of election, when, in the presence of the Scrutineers, it shall be opened and the ballot paper taken therefrom and deposited in the ballot box. Country members may record their votes by letter or telegram addressed to the Secretary, and such letter or telegram shall be delivered to the Scrutineers on the day of election.

Meetings of Committee.

20. The Committee shall meet as often as they may deem necessary; four shall form a quorum, and minutes of the proceedings shall be entered in a book, and be read and confirmed at the next meeting.

Committee may be convened by Secretary.

21. A Committee meeting shall be convened by the Secretary at any time, upon receiving a requisition requesting him to do so signed by three members of the Committee.

Committee to appoint and dismiss Officers and Servants.

22. The Committee shall have the appointment of the bankers and all officers and servants of the Club, and allow such salaries, allowances, and recompenses to them respectively during their service or employment as the Committee shall from time to time see fit. All such officers and servants shall be appointed during the pleasure of the Committee, who shall have the power of discontinuing their

services at any time on giving one month's notice; and also of immediate dismissal in the event of inefficiency, irregularity of conduct, or disobedience.

Committee to enter into contracts and dispose of funds of Club.

23. The Committee shall have power to enter into such contracts on behalf of the Club as they shall think advisable, and shall at all times dispose of the funds of the Club as they may deem best for carrying out the objects of the Club.

Committee to appoint a person to handicap.

24. The Committee shall appoint one or more competent persons to frame the handicaps for the race meetings of the Club; the name or names of such person or persons shall be notified to the public.

Committee may expel members guilty of misconduct.

25. The Committee may expel any member proved, to their satisfaction, to have been guilty of improper conduct or riotous behaviour, at any race or race meeting, or for such general misconduct as in the opinion of the Committee merits expulsion, or for default in the payment of any stake or bet.

Club to protect Committee and Stewards from legal proceedings.

26. The Committee and Stewards shall be indemnified from the funds of the Club against the damages, verdicts in, and costs of any legal proceedings that may be instituted against them or any of them in the exercise of their office or performance of their duties.

Qualification of Steward or Committeeman.

27. No Committeeman or Steward of any other Racing Club in Western Australia shall be eligible for or hold office as a Committeeman or Steward of this Club.

THE SECRETARY.

28. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep full and accurate accounts of all sums of money received or expended on account of the Club; to make full and accurate minutes in the books of the proceedings of all General, Special, and Committee Meetings; to give all notices of General and Special Meetings, and also propositions to be brought before them, and also notices of Committee Meetings; and subject to the directions of the Committee, to make all disbursements of the funds of the Club by cheque to be drawn upon the bank at which the Club account is kept, to obtain receipts or discharges for the same, and to carry out the instructions of the Committee and Stewards respectively.

THE TREASURER.

29. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to present a balance sheet of the total receipts and expenditure of the Club, in accordance with "The West Australian Turf Club Act, 1892."

GENERAL AND SPECIAL MEETINGS.

Annual General Meeting.

30. There shall be a General Meeting of the Club on the third Monday in May in each year, for the purpose of electing members of the Committee, discussing the general business of the Club, and receiving from the Committee an abstract of the state of the accounts of the receipts and expenditure, with a report of the general concerns of the Club. At such meeting the accounts shall exhibit a true statement of the total receipts and expenditure of the Club during the year immediately preceding the 1st of May, with a statement of the balance of such account.

Special Meetings.

31. The Committee may call a Special Meeting of the members of the Club whenever they think fit, and shall call a Special Meeting not earlier than fourteen days nor later than twenty-eight days after the receipt of a written requisition signed by twelve members, specifying the object of the meeting required, and to which object alone the discussion shall be confined.

At General or Special Meetings ten a quorum.

32. At the General or any Special Meeting ten members must be present to constitute a quorum, before proceeding to business; but should there not be a quorum, the members present may, at the expiration of half an hour from the time appointed for assembling, adjourn the meeting. In the event of there not being any members present at the expiration of half an hour, the meeting shall be considered as adjourned for one week.

Chairman to preside at General and Special Meetings.

33. The Chairman, or in his absence some member of Committee, or in their absence some member to be elected by the meeting, shall preside at the General or any Special Meeting. The Chairman of all such meetings shall only have a casting vote. All propositions and elections at any such meetings shall be disposed of in the first instance by a show of hands, but a ballot may be demanded, after such show of hands, by any member.

Notice of proposition to be given to members.

34. A circular letter stating the proposition or propositions to be made at the General or any Special Meeting, shall be posted or sent to the address of each member seven days previous to such meeting.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Members retiring.

35. All persons ceasing to be members of the Club, whether by retirement, expulsion, death, neglecting to pay the annual subscription, or otherwise, shall forfeit *ipso facto* all right to or claim upon the Club or its property.

PART II.

Bye-Laws for regulating all matters concerning or connected with the land now vested or which may hereafter be vested in the Chairman for the time being of the Committee of the Club, and the admission thereto and expulsion therefrom of members of the Club and the public respectively, and the rates or charges to be paid for such admission, and for the general management of the Club's Racecourse.

Division of Club's premises.

36. The divisions into which the land by the said Act vested in the Chairman of the Committee of the said Club, and his successors in office, with the buildings and other erections and fences thereon, is parcelled out and known, are as follow:—

1. The Lawn, the Grand Stand, the Members' Carriage Paddock and approaches.
2. The Weighing Yard, the Stewards' Room, the Committee Room, the Committee Stand, the Stewards' Stand, the Judge's Box and approaches.
3. The ground called the "Flat" and approaches.
4. The Training Ground and approaches.
5. The enclosure called the "Outer Carriage Paddock" and approaches.
6. The enclosure called "The Saddling Paddock" and approaches.

Admission of Members.

37. Subject to the provisions of the Bye-Laws of the Club, all members of The Western Australian Turf Club shall, upon production of their tickets, be admitted at all race and other meetings to all parts of the said land (with the exception of the second division hereinbefore specified), and with their own horses and carriages (not being licensed horses or vehicles) to the Members' Carriage Paddock.

Admission for training horses.

38. Subject to the provisions of the Bye-Laws of the Club, all persons who shall have duly paid for admission to the fourth of the said divisions for the purpose of training or exercising horses shall, upon production of their tickets, be admitted thereto, with their horses, for the period for which such tickets are issued; subject, however, to such orders as the Committee or the Stewards may from time to time give, as there may be occasion with reference to such division.

Judge's Box.

39. No person, except the Judge and Timekeeper, or any person the Judge may call to his assistance, or any Steward, shall enter the Judge's Box.

Weighing Stand and Yard.

40. No person shall enter the Weighing Stand or the Weighing Yard, or the approaches thereto, except the officers of the Club, the Jockeys requiring to be weighed, and the owners and trainers of horses desirous of seeing their jockeys weighed.

Stewards' and Committee's stand and room.

41. No person shall enter the Stewards' Stand, the Stewards' Room, the Committee Stand, the Committee Room, or the several approaches thereto, except the officers of the Club and such persons as the Committee or the Stewards may invite to do so.

Admission to be by ticket.

42. No person, unless otherwise permitted under these Bye-Laws, shall enter upon the said land or any division or part thereof, unless such person shall have a ticket duly authorising him in that behalf.

Persons disqualified for admission.

43. No person who has been proved to the satisfaction of the Committee to have been at any time guilty of any malpractice or dishonorable conduct in connection with racing, or who has been proved to the satisfaction of the

Committee to be a defaulter, shall enter or remain upon the said land, or any division or part thereof, after having been warned off by or on behalf of the Committee or Stewards.

Tickets to be produced.

44. Each member of the Club, and all persons paying for admission to the first, third, fourth and sixth divisions, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he shall upon demand produce, or (if required) surrender to any gatekeeper, servant, or other person having authority from the Committee or Stewards to demand the production or surrender of the same.

Remaining on land after races concluded prohibited.

45. No person without permission shall remain on the said land or any division or part thereof for a longer period than half an hour after the last race of the day shall have been run.

Tenants to comply with Committee's orders.

46. Persons renting or hiring for any race meeting the Grand Stands, or any portion thereof respectively, or any Booth upon the said land, shall abide by any order given by the Committee or Stewards in reference to the said land and the buildings and other erections thereon.

Dogs not to be admitted.

47. No person shall take any dog on the said land, or any division or part thereof, or into any building thereon, and any dog found upon the said land may be destroyed by any officer or servant of the Club.

Lost property.

48. Any officer or servant or employee of the Club, and any other person, finding any lost property or document upon any land in the use or occupation of the Club, or upon any land belonging to the Club, or in any building or premises erected on any such land, shall immediately deliver the same at the office appointed by the Committee for the reception of lost property, to the person in charge of such office; but should such office be closed, shall deliver such property at the office of the Club in Perth, to the person for the time being in charge of such office. Any person committing a breach of this Bye-Law will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five Pounds.

Distributing bills or placards prohibited.

49. No person, unless duly authorised in writing by the Secretary, shall distribute or post or stick bills or placards, or assist in distributing or posting or sticking same, within or upon any fence, wall, building, property, or premises of the Club. Any person committing a breach of this Bye-Law will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five Pounds.

Removal of offenders.

50. Any person committing on the said land, or any division or part thereof, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, may be removed from such land, notwithstanding such person may be a member of the Club, or may have purchased, and is or may be in possession of, a ticket of admission:—

1. Assaulting any other person.
2. Being drunk.
3. Riding, crossing, or trespassing upon the course, or any part of it, unless authorised, during a race meeting, or when the horses are preparing or prepared to start, or are running for any race.
4. Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
5. Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
6. Behaving improperly or riotously.
7. Being found in the first, third, fourth, or sixth of the said divisions, and not producing upon demand, or (if required) not surrendering to any gatekeeper, servant, or other person having authority from the Committee to demand production of the same, a ticket duly authorising admission to such division, unless the person so found shall forthwith satisfy the Stewards, or one of them, that the proper charge for admission has been paid by him, and that his ticket has been lost.
8. Obtaining admission to the said land, or any division or part thereof, when disintituled to such admission under these Bye-Laws.
9. Remaining on the said land, or any division or part thereof, after having been warned off any part of the said land by or on behalf of the Committee or Stewards.

Tolls and Charges.

51. The following is the scale of tolls and charges which shall be levied and taken for admission to the several divisions of the said land, and the buildings thereon respectively:—

For the admission of each person to the first division	s. d.

For the admission of each person to the third division (not exceeding)	2	0
For the admission to the fourth division for training or exercising each horse for every year	20	0
For admission through the outer boundary gates of the said land of every person with a truck or barrow (for each entry)	2	6
For admission through the outer boundary gates of the said land of every horse (not being a race-horse in training) with or without a vehicle (for each entry) ...	2	0
For the admission of each person to the sixth division (the Saddling Paddock)	1	0

provided that all members of the Western Australian Turf Club shall, upon production of their tickets, be admitted to any part of the said land with the exception of the second division, and shall be admitted to the Member's Carriage Paddock, with their carriages and horses, without payment of any of the above tolls and charges for admission.

PART III.

BYE-LAW RELATING TO THE SADDLING PADDOCK.

No person shall, after the first day of October, 1892, carry on the business of a bookmaker within the first division, as specified by the Bye-Laws of the said Club, of the land vested in the Chairman of the Committee of the said Club and his successors in office before and until he shall have complied with the following conditions:—

1. That he pay to the Committee of the said Club in advance an annual fee of Five pounds five shillings.
2. That during the time he shall be in or upon the said first division of the said land as specified as aforesaid, he shall wear a badge or ticket to be supplied by the Committee of the said Club, which badge or ticket shall be visible to the public, and shall have his name written or printed thereon.

Any person offending against this Bye-Law shall be removed from all land or lands vested in the Chairman of the said Club, and forfeit for every such offence the sum of Five pounds, to be recovered in the manner prescribed by the twentieth section of the said Act.

BYE-LAW RELATING TO THE FLAT.

No person shall, after the first day of October, 1892, carry on the business of a bookmaker within the third division, as specified by the Bye-Laws of the said Club, of the land vested in the Chairman of the Committee of the said Club and his successors in office before and until he shall have complied with the following conditions:—

1. That he pay to the Committee of the said Club in advance an annual fee of Three Pounds Three Shillings.
2. That during the time he shall be in or upon the said third division of the said land, as specified as aforesaid, he shall wear a badge or ticket to be supplied by the Committee of the said Club, which badge or ticket shall be visible to the public, and shall have his name written or printed thereon.

Any person offending against this Bye-Law shall be removed from all land or lands vested in the Chairman of the said Club, and forfeit for every such offence the sum of Five Pounds, to be recovered in the manner prescribed by the twentieth section of the said Act.

PART IV.

BYE-LAWS RELATING TO WORKING OF THE TOTALIZATOR.

1. Investors may back any number to an unlimited amount, the numbers on the official programme corresponding with the Totalizator numbers.

2. The total amount of the sweep, less 10 per cent. commission, will be divided *pro rata* between the subscribers to the winning number, but no fraction of a shilling will be paid.

3. In the event of any horse winning which has not been backed in the Totalizator, the amount invested will be returned to the investors, less commission.

4. In the case of a dead heat (not run off) the total amount staked, less commission, will be divided into two or more equal parts, as the nature of the case may require. The backers of the horses running such dead heat shall be entitled to be paid a dividend arrived at by dividing each such part by the number of investors on each such horse respectively.

5. Payment will be made 15 minutes after each race, but in the event of a protest being made during such 15 minutes, no payment will be made till after the Stewards' decision; protests made after such 15 minutes will not be recognised.

6. The decision of the Stewards in the event of a protest shall be final, and the Club shall not be liable for payment on any other horse, although such decision may subsequently be reversed by the Committee.

7. All winning tickets must be presented at the pay office on the day of the race and within half an hour from the termination of the last race of the day, otherwise they will not be paid.

8. The Stewards of the meeting at which any ticket is issued shall, as well after as during the meeting, be the sole judges, and shall decide, in case of dispute, upon every claim to all or any of the money invested during the meeting.
