HEREAS by "The Imported Stock Act, 1876," and "The Prevention of the Importation of Diseased Stock Act, 1879," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to acquire and set apart by Proclamation in the Gazette, such ground as may be required for one or more Quarantine Stations, on which the necessary sheds and appurtenances may be erected, for the purposes of the said Acts: And whereas it is deemed expedient to set apart a Quarantine Station for Dogs at Cossack: Now therefore I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers in me vested as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby set apart, as a Quarantine Station, Jarman Island, for the purposes of the said Acts.

Bonus for Deep Sinking.

OTICE is hereby given that the Government offers a Bonus to any person or company who, during the year 1893, shall sink on any of the declared Goldfields of the Colony a Shaft as hereinafter mentioned, and according to the following conditions, from a depth previously attained of not less than 100 feet:—

For a shaft to be sunk from below the depth of 100 feet to a depth of 200 feet, @ £2 10s. per foot.

For a shaft to be sunk from below the depth of 200 feet to a depth of 300 feet, @ £5 per foot.

CONDITIONS.

Each shaft to be vertical throughout, with a superficial area of not less than 27 feet in the clear when completed, and a minimum width of not less than 3 feet, to be sunk and timbered where necessary, to the satisfaction of the Warden or his Deputy.

Provided, that if any shaft has been already sunk of a less superficial area than 27 feet, the bonus shall be paid in proportion; but in no case shall any bonus be paid for a shaft having a less area than 20 feet, or less than 3 feet in width.

All measurements of depth to be taken from the surface of the ground.

Payments will be made monthly as the work progresses. No payments will be made for less than 10 feet, and all work shall be measured and passed by the Warden or his Deputy before payment, and the decision of the Warden or his Deputy shall be final.

No payment will be made in respect of the first 100 feet from the surface.

With regard to existing shafts, no payment will be made in respect of work done before the date hereof.

Any person intending to deepen any existing shaft of or exceeding the depth of 100 feet shall give notice in writing to the Warden or his Deputy of the depth of the said shaft, and of his intention to deepen the same.

The Warden or his Deputy shall ascertain and certify the depth of such shaft, and payment shall be made only in respect of the work done beyond the depth certified by the Warden or his Deputy.

Any person intending to sink a new shaft with the intention of claiming a bonus shall give notice in writing of such intention before the commencement of the work, or before the shaft is down 100 feet.

No company or person shall receive assistance for more than one shaft on the same mining property.

"The Roads Act, 1888."

By-Laws of the Yilgarn Roads Board.

THE Yilgarn Roads Board doth hereby make and publish the following By-Laws, under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1888."

By-Law No. 1—Standing Orders.

Order of Proceedings.

1. The Board shall meet on the first Thursday in every month, at the hour of half-past seven o'clock, p.m., at such place as the Chairman shall from time to time appoint, for the transaction of their ordinary business, and the business of the Board shall be conducted with open doors.

- 2. The Board shall commence business as soon after the above-mentioned hour as there is sufficient number of members in attendance to constitute a quorum of three; but if at the expiration of thirty minutes from the above-mentioned hour there is not a quorum present, no business shall be transacted by the Board at that meeting.
- 3. At all meetings of the Board the minutes of any preceding meeting, not confirmed, shall be read as the first business, in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.
- 4. Immediately after the confirmation of the minutes, the Chairman may make any communication to the Board which he may deem advisable, or bring under consideration any business he may think necessary; and it shall be competent for any member of the Board to ask a question or questions, but he shall confine himself to the question simply, and no debate shall ensue thereon at that time.
 - 5. The ordinary business shall then be proceeded with.

Order of Debate.

- 6. Any member proposing a motion or an amendment shall, if the Chairman so desire it, put it in writing and sign and deliver it to the Chairman for the time being after it has been duly seconded, and the Chairman shall read the same before being discussed, and no motion or amendment so made shall be withdrawn without leave of the Board.
- 7. No member shall speak twice upon the same question, except by way of explanation, or in reply, upon any original motion or amendment of which he may have been the mover; nevertheless any member who may have been misrepresented or misunderstood may be allowed to explain. Immediately after the mover has replied, the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be put to the vote.
- 8. The Chairman shall, without waiting for the interposition of the Board, call to order any member proceeding to speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation as aforesaid.
- 9. Any member moving a motion or a mendment shall be held to have spoken on that question.
- 10. No member shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, or impute improper motives to any member.
- 11. The Chairman when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall decide the same without argument, and his decision shall be final in that particular case.
- 12. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time but if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote, but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment thereon, but no more.
- 13. In case of equality of votes, the Chairman shall, in addition to his ordinary vote, give a casting vote; and any reasons stated by him shall be entered in the minutes of proceedings.
- 14. No By-Law shall be finally passed or rescinded at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed, but at the next or some subsequent meeting of the Board, duly convened.

BY-LAW No. 2.

Suspension of Standing Orders.

1. In case of urgent necessity, any Standing Order or Orders of the Board may be suspended, on motion duly made and seconded, without notice, provided that such motion has the concurrence of at least four members of the Board.

By-Law No. 3. Public Notice.

- 1. The salary and allowance attached to all offices at the disposal of the Board shall be fixed for the Board year, and in all cases before proceeding to the Election.
- 2. All elections for offices at the disposal of the Board shall be effected by voting by bollot, the two candidates polling the largest number of votes being again put to the ballot until one of such candidates shall have polled the majority of the votes of the members present. Every member present shall record his vote.
- 3. No member of the Board nor any auditor or officer of the Board shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the Board, or for any work to be done by the Board; and in all cases in which security for the due and faithful performance of any duty or contract is required, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the Board.

BY-LAW No. 4.

Rates.

- 1. All rates made and levied by the Board shall be paid yearly, and the Collector for the time being appointed by the Board shall, at the commencement of each year, leave with the person liable to be rated, at his residence within a radius of ten miles of the Telegraph Office at Southern Cross, a notice of the amount due by such person for rates.
- 2. If the property rated is situated beyond a ten miles radius as aforesaid, notice may be sent by registered letter through the post. All rates shall be paid within three months of the receipt of such notice.

By-Law No. 5.

1. No person shall commit any nuisance in or near any tank, or well, or watering place, or in or near to any watercourse or drain leading into any tank, well, or watering place, used for drinking or other purposes; and no person shall permit or suffer any animals or stock to be camped within a radius of one hundred yards of any such tank, well, or watering place; and no person shall permit or suffer any animals to remain or be at or near any such tank, well, or watering place, so as to cause any contamination or fouling of or injury to the water therein.

Any person who shall be guilty of any neglect or breach of this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of any sum not exceeding £20.
