## Bonus for Deep Sinking.

OTICE is hereby given that the Government offers a Bonus to any person or company who, during the year 1893, shall sink on any of the declared Goldfields of the Colony a Shaft as hereinafter mentioned, and according to the following conditions, from a depth previously attained of not less than 100 feet :=

For a shaft to be sunk from below the depth of 100 feet to a depth of 200 feet, @ £2 10s. per foot.

For a shaft to be sunk from below the depth of 200 feet to a depth of 300 feet, @ £5 per foot.

#### CONDITIONS.

Each shaft to be vertical throughout, with a superficial area of not less than 27 feet in the clear when completed, and a minimum width of not less than 3 feet, to be sunk and timbered where necessary, to the satisfaction of the Warden or his Deputy.

Provided, that if any shaft has been already sunk of a less superficial area than 27 feet, the bonus shall be paid in proportion; but in no case shall any bonus be paid for a shaft having a less area than 20 feet, or less than 3 feet in width.

All measurements of depth to be taken from the surface of the ground.

Payments will be made monthly as the work progresses No payments will be made for less than 10 feet, and all work shall be measured and passed by the Warden or his Deputy before payment, and the decision of the Warden or his Deputy shall be final.

No payment will be made in respect of the first 100 feet from the surface.

With regard to existing shafts, no payment will be made in respect of work done before the date hereof.

Any person intending to deepen any existing shaft of or exceeding the depth of 100 feet shall give notice in writing to the Warden or his Deputy of the depth of the said shaft, and of his intention to deepen the same.

The Warden or his Deputy shall ascertain and certify the depth of such shaft, and payment shall be made only in respect of the work done beyond the depth certified by the Warden or his Deputy.

Any person intending to sink a new shaft with the intention of claiming a bonus shall give notice in writing of such intention before the commencement of the work, or before the shaft is down 100 feet.

No company or person shall receive assistance for more than one shaft on the same mining property.

When mails are conveyed in wheeled vehicles, a free passage must be provided for any officer of the Postal and Telegraph Department travelling on duty.

The Government reserves the right of terminating the Contract at any time, by giving three months notice to the Contractor.

Special forms of Tender, with conditions attached, may be obtained on application to the various Postmasters, and at the General Post Office, Perth; and no Tender will be entertained unless rendered on the prescribed form.

The Government does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any tender.

# COASTAL STEAM MAIL SERVICES FOR WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

The Western Australian Government desire to enter into a Contract for the Conveyance of Mails between Fremantle and Wyndham (Cambridge Gulf), calling at intermediate Ports, for a period of five years, from 1st August, 1893.

## WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

## GENERAL CONDITIONS

To be embodied in any Contract made for a Steam Coastal Mail Service between Fremantle and Wyndham (Cambridge Gulf).

- 1. The Contract to be for five years, and to commence on the 1st day of August, 1893, and to continue and be in force until the 31st day of July, 1898, determinable nevertheless as hereinafter expressed.
- 2. All the steamships employed under this Contract shall have passenger accommodation for at least One hundred (100) statute adults, including saloon accommodation for not less than Forty (40) statute adults, and shall maintain a speed of at least ten knots an hour in fair ordinary weather.
- 3. A steamer shall once every twenty-eight days make a voyage from Fremantle to Derby and back, via Geraldton, Sharks Bay (Cape Lesueur), Carnarvon, Onslow, Cossack, and Broome, and shall remain at Derby not less than Forty-eight hours, and a steamer shall once every Fifty-six days make a voyage from Derby to Wyndham and back, and shall remain at Wyndham not less than Forty-eight hours. In the event of a separate steamer performing this service she shall be timed to connect with the service from Fremantle; and it will be sufficient if such separate steamer has passenger accommodation for at least 50 statute adults, including saloon accommodation for not less than 20 statute adults.
- 4. The dates and hours of the arrival and departure of these vessels at the several ports and stopping places above mentioned shall, unless otherwise agreed upon by the contracting parties, be in accordance with a time table to be from time to time agreed upon between the Postmaster General and the Contractors.
- 5. Tide and weather permitting, all steamers employed in the above mentioned services shall, where jetty or wharf accommodation exists, ship and discharge all passengers and cargo at such jetties or wharves.

- 6. Upon each visit of a steamer to the several ports and stopping places above mentioned, the Contractors shall land or ship such passengers or cargo as shall at the time be proceeding to or from, or have been shipped for, or be ready for shipment from the said ports or stopping places, and for this purpose the steamer shall remain at each of such ports or stopping places for the space of not less than two hours.
- 7. The said steamships shall convey, free of all charge, all such Mails, Mail Parcels, Letters, and Newspapers, either separately or in boxes or bags, as may be required by or on behalf of the Government to be carried from or to any port or stopping place in the respective lines of service herein mentioned: and such Mails, Mail Parcels, Letters, and Newspapers shall be received and delivered at the Post Office at every such port or stopping place, or from or to the person duly authorised in that behalf at the respective ports or stopping places, by the Contractors, and while on board any steamship employed on the said service shall be carried in a properly secured mailroom or compartment, and the Contractors shall take all proper precautions for the preservation of the said mails against injury in transit between the Post Offices.
- 8. Every such steamship shall during the continuance of the Contract, at the expense in all things of the Contractors, be kept sound, staunch, and strong, and in every respect seaworthy, and in good repair, order, and condition, and clean and free from vermin, and capable of performing her said services, excepting always the acts of God, and all and every the dangers and accidents of the sea and navigation, whatever nature or kind, and shall be manned with a proper number of efficient and good and properly qualified officers, engineers and seamen, and be provided with everything necessary to ensure safe and speedy navigation and the due performance of the Contract, and shall at all times be liable to inspection by any person duly authorised in that behalf by the Postmaster General for the time being or his Deputy.
- 9. If the Chief Harbor Master should at any time report to the Postmaster General that he considers any one of the Contractors' vessels unfit for the conveyance of mails or passengers or has not satisfactory accommodation for passengers, the Postmaster General may cause an examination to be made of any such vessel by such person or persons as he may appoint for that purpose, and if on such examination such vessel shall be reported to be unfit for the conveyance of mails or passengers, such vessel shall be withdrawn from the service and another suitable vessel substituted therefor.
- 10. The rates of freight and for passengers by the said steamships shall not exceed those in the Schedule hereunder written, except with the consent in writing of the Postmaster General for the time being, and the freights and passage rates to any other port or stopping place than those specially mentioned herein shall be the subject of mutual agreement between the parties to the Contract.
- 11. With the view of preventing smuggling, the Government shall have the right to place and keep a Customs Officer on board the said steamers, who shall be carried and provisioned as a saloon passenger, free of charge to the Government.
- 12. No alteration shall be made in the Time Table or in any agreed variation thereof without the consent, in writing, of the Postmaster General.
- 13. Every steamer shall leave her port or place of departure on the date and at the hour stated in the time table hereinbefore mentioned, or in any agreed alteration thereof, or, if the mails be not then on board, as soon thereafter as the mails shall be put on board, and upon every breach of this obligation a sum of £5 shall be paid by the Contractors to the Government for each hour or fraction of an hour the departure of the steamer may be delayed, unless such delay shall be accounted for to the satisfaction of the Postmaster General. Such sums may be deducted by the Government from the amount of subsidy to be then next paid the Contractors.
- 14. In the event of a mail, or any portion of a mail, being overcarried or not delivered, the Contractors shall pay to the Government, unless such default be accounted for to the satisfaction of the Postmaster General, a sum of £20 by way of liquidated damages, and such sum may be deducted by the Government from the amount of subsidy to be then next paid to the Contractors.
- 15. The Contractors may, during the continuance of the contract, import into Western Australia, free of duty, for use on board their steamships, fuel, machinery, stores, boilers, masts, rigging, and provisions, including wines, beer, spirits, and tobacco; subject, however, to such restrictions as may from time to time be imposed in case of foreign and sea-going British ships.

- 16. The Contractors or their agents may use, without charge, the electric telegraph within the Colony of Western Australia, for the purpose of reporting the arrival at or departure of any such steamship from any port or stopping place, for ascertaining the state of the weather along the coast or for reporting any casualty or mishap to any such steamship or her cargo or passengers or crew, or for the purpose of reporting or ascertaining as between the Contractors and their agents the amount of cargo for or from any port or stopping place to any other port or stopping place within the said Colony.
- 17. If at any time during the continuance of the Contract the Postmaster General shall order any Officer of the Postal or Telegraph Department on duty, or shall be desirous himself to proceed to or from any port or stopping place in the Colony, the Postmaster General or such Officer shall be carried free of expense, as a saloon passenger, in any of the said steamships to and from any of the said ports or stopping places.
- 18. If at the expiration or sooner determination of the Contract any vessel shall have started on any voyage with the mails on board, such voyage shall be continued and completed, and all the provisions of the Contract shall in respect of any such vessel be observed as if the same were still in force.
- 19. The said steamships shall, during the continuance of the Contract, be free of all harbor, light, pilotage, and tonnage dues of every nature and kind.
- 20. The Contractors shall have and keep a duly authorised agent at Fremantle, and all notices required to be given by the Government to the Contractors may be given to such agent at Fremantle; and all notices given to such agent shall be deemed to have been duly served upon the Contractors.
- 21. The Company shall not assign or underlet the Contract, in whole or in part, without the consent of the Postmaster General in writing.
- 22. In case of any breach by the Contractors or the Government of any of the articles herein contained, the party not in default may, by notice in writing, rescind and terminate this Agreement, and the party in default shall in that event pay to the other party the sum of Five hundred pounds sterling (£500) by way of liquidated damages.
- 23. In case any breach of the Contract be occasioned by the act of God, the Queen's enemies, fire or tempest, or any of the dangers of the sea, or of navigation, or be occasioned by any strikes or lockouts either of colliers or seamen, or caused by any labor organisation or trade union connected with or affecting colliers or seamen, the penalty of Five hundred pounds mentioned in the last preceding clause shall not be enforced, but the subsidy shall be reduced  $pro\ rat\acute{a}$  as the mileage of service is diminished.
- 24. Any difference or dispute arising under the Contract shall be settled by arbitration, as provided by "The Common Law Procedure Act, 1854."
