By His Excellency SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1876," power is given to the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to declare and proclaim any town to be a Municipality, and by the same Proclamation to define the boundaries of such Municipality: Now THEREFORE I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, G.C.M.G., Governor of the said Colony, do hereby, under and by virtue of the provisions of the said Act, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, declare and proclaim the Town of Gingin to be a Municipality, under the style and title of "The Council and Burgesses of the Town of Gingin"; And do also declare and proclaim the boundaries of the said Municipality to be as follows:—

Bounded by lines starting from the North-East corner of Swan Location 375, and extending East 32 chains 67 links to the Eastern boundary of Swan Location 398, thence South 17 chains 24 links to a post marked C and 167 degrees 15 minutes about 3 chains to the right bank of the Gingin Brook, and along it downwards about 2 chains 60 links, thence South about 49 chains to a post marked A, passing through a post situate 1 chain 64 links West and about 5 chains 50 links South from said post marked C, thence West 36 chains 2 links, passing along the North boundary of Swan Location 351 to an angle in the East boundary of Swan Location 378, and thence North 10 chains 33 links to the Western boundary of Roe Street and North-West 1 chain 78 links to the North boundary of said Location 378, and along it Westward to the East boundary of Swan Location 273, thence North about 12 chains, passing along the West boundary of Swan Location 326 to the left bank of the Gingin Brook, and along

it upwards to the North-West corner of Swan Location 262, thence North-West 160 chains crossing said Brook to an angle in Swan Location 265, and North along the Eastern boundaries of Swan Locations 265, 316, 370, and 375 to the starting point.

By-Laws of the Southern Cross Municipal Council.

Whereas by the forty-ninth (49th) section of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1876," it is enacted that "it shall "be lawful for the Council to make, publish, alter, modify, "amend, or repeal such By-Laws and Regulations as to "them shall seem meet for regulating their own proceed-"ings, and for certain other purposes in the said section "particularly named," and by the fiftieth section of the said Act it is further enacted "that such By-laws should "not be inconsistent with or repugnant to any of the "provisions of that Act, or to any Law in force, and when "confirmed by the Governor, with the advice of the Ex-"ecutive Council, and published in the Government Gazette, "ecutive Council, and published in the Government Gazette, "but not sooner or otherwise, should have the force of "Law." Now, therefore, pursuant to the powers contained in the said Act, it is ordered and directed by the Council of the Municipality of Southern Cross that the following By-Laws shall, from and after confirmation and publication as aforesaid, be in force throughout the Municipality of Southern Cross.

BY-LAW NO. 1.—INTERPRETATION.

In these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires:

- (a.) The word "Council" shall mean the Mayor and Council of Southern Cross.
- (b.) The word "Municipality" shall mean the town of Southern Cross.
- (c.) The word "Mayor" shall mean the Mayor of the Municipality.
- (d.) The words "Public Street" shall mean and include every public street, road, footway, square, thoroughfare, or other such place within the Municipality.
 - (e.) The word "Person" shall include a body corporate.
- (f.) The word "Owner" shall apply to every person in possession or receipt of either the whole or any part of the rents or profits of any house, building, land, or tenement.
- (g.) The word "Act" shall mean "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1876."

By-Law No. 2.—Standing Orders.

Order of Proceedings.

- (a.) The Council shall meet at the Temporary Council Room, on the first Monday in every month, at the hour of (7-30) half-past seven o'clock, p m., for the transaction of their ordinary business, and the business of the Council shall be conducted with open doors.
- (b.) The Council shall commence business so soon after the above-mentioned hour as there is a sufficient number of members in attendance to constitute a quorum; but if, at the expiration of thirty minutes from the above-mentioned hour, there is not a quorum present, no business shall be transacted by the Council at that meeting.
- (c.) Should the Mayor not be present, the meeting shall elect a Chairman from the Councillors present, who shall preside during the absence of the Mayor.
- (d.) At any meeting of the Council when there is not a quorum present or when the Council is counted out (which quorum present or when the council is counted out (which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be fewer than one-third of the Council present, exclusive of the Mayor or Councillor chosen to preside in his absence), such circumstance together with the names of the members present shall be recorded in the minute book.
- (e.) At all meetings of the Council the minutes of any preceding meeting not confirmed shall be read as the first business in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.
- (f.) Immediately after the confirmation of the minutes, the Mayor may make any communication to the Council which he may deem advisable, or bring under consideration any business he may think necessary, and it shall be competent for any member of the Council to ask a question or

questions, but he shall confine himself to the question simply, and no debate shall issue thereon at that time.

(g.) The ordinary business of the Council shall then be proceeded with.

Orders of Debate.

- (h.) Any member proposing a motion or an amendment shall, if the Mayor so desire it, put it in writing, and sign and deliver it to the Mayor or other presiding Chairman for the time being, after it has been duly seconded, and the Mayor or other presiding Chairman shall read the same before being discussed, and no motion or amendment so made shall be withdrawn without leave of the Council.
- (i.) No member shall speak twice upon the same question, except by way of explanation, or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last carried. Nevertheless, any member who may have been misrepresented or misunderstood may be allowed to explain. Immediately after the mover has replied, the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.
- (j.) The Mayor or other presiding Chairman shall, without waiting for the interposition of the Council, call to order any member proceeding to speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply or in explanation as aforesaid.
- (k.) Any member moving a motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that question.
- (l.) No member shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, or impute improper motives to any member.
- (m.) The Mayor or other presiding Chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or precedent applicable to the case without argument or comment, and his decision shall be final in that particular case.
- (a.) One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but, if lost, another may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried, it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment thereon, but no more.
- (o.) Upon the adoption of any amendment such amendment shall be held to have taken the place of the original motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment shall be and shall be deemed to be an original motion.
- (p.) No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the Council, shall be entertained during the same Municipal year, unless a call of the whole of the Council has been duly made for the purpose, and no motion for rescinding any resolution of the Council which shall have been negatived by the Council shall again be entertained during the same Municipal year, unless by consent of at least four members of the Council.
- (q.) In case of equality of votes the Mayor or other presiding Chairman shall, in addition to his ordinary vote, give a casting vote, and any reason stated by him shall be entered in the minutes of proceedings.
- (r.) No By-Law shall be finally passed or rescinded at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed, but at the next or subsequent meeting of the Council duly convened.

BY-LAW NO. 3.—Suspension of Standing Orders.

In case of urgent necessity, any standing order or orders of the Council may be suspended on motion duly made and seconded, without notice, provided that such motion has the concurrence of at least four members of the Council.

BY-LAW NO. 4-ELECTION OF OFFICERS.

- 1. When any office is at the disposal of the Council, at least sixteen clear days notice shall be given by public notice or advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the neighborhood of the intention of the Council to fill such vacancy, which notice shall invite applications for the office to be sent in to the next meeting of the Council.
- 2. The salary and allowances attached to all offices at the disposal of the Council shall be fixed for the Municipal year, and in all cases before proceeding to the election.
- 3. At the next meeting of the Council after the notice as before mentioned has been given, all letters of application for the office shall be opened and the names read aloud, and the appointment may then be made.
- 4. All elections for offices at the disposal of the Council shall be effected by voting by ballot, the two candidates polling the largest number of votes being again put to the ballot until one of such candidates shall have polled a

majority of the votes of the members present. Every member present shall record his vote.

5. No member of the Council or any Auditor of the Municipality nor any officer thereof shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the Council or for any work to be done by the Council, and in all cases in which security for the due and faithful performance of any duty or contract is required the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the Council.

BY-LAW No. 5-MUNICIPAL RATES.

- 1. All Municipal Rates shall be payable half-yearly, and the Collector for the time being duly appointed by the Council shall, at the commencement of each half-year, leave with the person liable to pay the same, or at his residence, a notice of the amount due by such person, and requiring payment within fourteen days, and shall afterwards apply personally for payment for the same, and if the amount be not paid at the expiration of fourteen days after such application, shall take legal proceedings for its recovery.
- 2. In the event of any owner of property liable to pay rates being absent from the Municipality or Colony, and not having an agent, the publication in the Government Gazette three times of the amount payable on such property shall, after the expiration of twenty-eight days, be deemed sufficient notice.

By-Law No. 6.—Officers of the Council. The Collector.

1. The Collector for the time being duly appointed by the Council shall demand, collect, and receive all rates and assessments, license fees, fines, forfeitures, rents, tolls and other moneys due to the Council, and his receipt shall be full and sufficient discharge for any moneys paid to him. And all moneys so received by the Collector shall be paid by him to the Treasurer of the Council weekly.

Clerk to the Council.

- 2. The Clerk to the Council shall keep the books of the Council, and shall duly enter, in a proper minute book, minutes of all proceedings of the Council. He shall attend all meetings of the Council, issue notices of all meetings, and shall prepare for the Council or Mayor thereof the Voters' List for the Municipality, and cause them to be affixed as by the said Act required, and shall supply copies thereof as by the said Act required, and shall make up and complete, under the direction of the Council, the Rate Book, and shall under the like direction prepare the annual estimates as by the said Act required. He shall also keep such books of accounts as are required by the one hundred and fourth section of the said Act. He shall also, under the direction of the Council, prepare the annual financial statement or summary, and shall do and perform all such other acts as the Council or Mayor thereof may lawfully require him to do under or by virtue of the said Act, and shall attend the Council office during such hours as the Council may direct.
- 3. The custody of the journals and all other documents whatsoever belonging to the Council (except such documents as are hereinafter expressed to be kept by the Treasurer) shall be in the care of the Clerk, who shall neither take away, nor permit to be taken away, any such journals or documents from the Council office, without the express leave or order of the Council.

The Treasurer.

- 4. The Treasurer shall have the custody of the common seal and all deeds and records of the Council, but he shall not affix the common seal to any corporate document without the express order of the Council.
- 5. The Treasurer shall receive weekly from the Collector all sums stated to be received by him under By-Law No. 6, S. 1, and give the Collector a receipt for such moneys.
- 6. The Treasurer shall (if required by the Council at any time to do so) give a bond with two sureties in a sum to be named by the Council, conditioned for the honest, fair, and diligent discharge of his duties.
- 7. The Treasurer shall, out of the moneys received by him as Treasurer of the Council, pay all accounts duly and lawfully passed by the Council at its ordinary monthly meetings, and shall make all other payments which the Council may lawfully order.
- 8. The Treasurer shall pay all moneys received by him to the credit of the Council's general account at the Commercial Bank of Australia, Limited, once at least in every week.
- 9. All payments shall be made by cheque, signed by the Treasurer, and countersigned by the Town Clerk.

The Supervisor.

10. The Supervisor for the time being duly appointed by the Council shall have the immediate care, management, and direction of all buildings, lands, streets, paths, bathhouses, trees, posts, fences, works, drains, culverts, and all other property belonging to, or in charge of, or under the possession, control, or power of the Council, and shall from time to time report to the Conneil the state of and condition as to repair of the same, and the progress of any works going on therein or thereon, and the breach or violation of any By-Law in connection therewith.

BY-LAW No. 7.—SLAUGHTER HOUSES.

No slaughter-house shall be erected within the boundaries of the Municipality, and no person shall be allowed to slaughter any cattle or sheep within such boundaries. Any person offending against this By-Law shall forfeit and pay on conviction a penalty not exceeding £20.

By-Law No. 8.—Pigs.

No person shall keep any kind of living swine within the boundaries of the Municipality. Any person offending against this By-Law shall pay and forfeit upon conviction a penalty not exceeding £2.

By-Law No. 9.—Damaging Property, &c., of Municipality.

Any person who shall (without first having obtained the sanction of the Council) break up, cut down, remove, damage, destroy or injure any footpath, tree, plant, post, fence, gate, drain, water-course, culvert, bathhouse, building or other property belonging to or in charge of or under the possession, control, or power of the Council shall forfeit and pay upon conviction a penalty not exceeding £20.

By-Law No. 10.—To prevent Danger from Fire.

1. Any person who shall (without first obtaining the permission of the Mayor) anywhere within the limits of the Municipality light any unguarded fire, or set fire to any straw, wood, rubbish, or make any bonfire, or let off any fireworks within the Municipality shall forfeit and pay upon conviction a penalty not exceeding £5.

By-Law No. 11.—To prevent Danger from Inflammable Materials.

- 1. Any person who shall stack any hay, straw, or other inflammable material within one chain and a half of any house or other building, and who shall not remove the same within 48 hours after due notice by the Mayor, shall forfeit and pay on conviction a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence.
- 2. Any person who (without the consent in writing of the Council) shall stack more than 20 cords of firewood in an open or uncovered spot within the limits of the Municipality shall forfeit and pay upon conviction a penalty of £5 for every such offence.

By-Law No. 12.—Quarries and Timber.

- 1. Any person who shall quarry stone or dig or remove any sand, earth, or gravel on or from the lands belonging to, or in charge of, or under the possession, control, or power of the Council, without a license therefor, shall forfeit and pay upon conviction a penalty not exceeding £1 for every such offence.
- (2.) The license fee for quarrying not exceeding one square chain shall be Two shillings and sixpence per man per week, or 10s. per calendar month; and for the removal of sand, earth, or gravel, 6d. per load.

By-Law No. 13.—Danger from Vehicles.

Any person who, having the care of any vehicle in the public streets, shall be at such a distance from such vehicle as not to have the complete control over every horse drawing the same, and shall not have one wheel of such vehicle chained, or the horse securely tied, shall forfeit and pay upon conviction a penalty not exceeding £1.

Municipality of Roebourne.

The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, & Impounding Act, 1882.

TRESPASS SCALE.

"The Council and Burgesses of the town of Roebourne" do hereby, by virtue of the powers vested in them by the said Act (46 Vict., No. 7), make and publish the following scale of fines to be imposed on owners of cattle for trespass upon, and damage to land whereof the said Municipality is the owner, or upon land within the limits of the said Municipality, which is not enclosed by a sufficient fence.

The Scale above referred to.

For trespass on enclosed land, whether town or suburban, whereof the Municipality is the owner, or which is within the limits thereof, not being a public street or thoroughfare or Public Cemetery:—

For every entire horse, ass, or bull, in the day time. \bullet Not less than £2 nor more than £4.

For every such horse, ass, or bull, in the night time. $\$ Not less than £3 nor more than £5.

For every other head of cattle, by night or day.

For trespass on a public street or thorough fare, or in an enclosed Public Cemetery :— $\,$

For every entire horse, ass, or bull.

Not less than £3 nor more than £5.

For every other head of cattle ... A sum not exceeding 40 shillings.

POUNDAGE FEES.

THE Council and Burgesses of the Town of Roebourne do hereby, by virtue of the powers vested in them by the said Act (46 Vict., No. 7), with the consent of His Honour Chief Justice Onslow, Governor's Deputy, specify and frame the following Table of Fees to be taken by the Keeper of the Public Pound in the said Municipality for cattle impounded therein:—

In addition to the above fees, the Poundkeeper shall be entitled, if requested so to do by the person or persons impounding stock, and upon being satisfied as to the correctness of the distance such stock shall have been driven, to demand and receive a further sum of One shilling per mile (not exceeding ten miles) for each mob of stock, being the property of the same owner, or for each head of stock (if driven singly) so driven, including camels, but not including sheep or goats, such mileage to be payable to the person or persons impounding such stock or camels; provided that no greater sum than Five pounds shall be demanded in respect of any number of stock impounded at any one time.

And the said Council and Burgesses do also, with the like consent, appoint and fix the following prices which it shall be lawful for the Keeper of the said Pound to charge and receive for the sustenance of cattle impounded in the said Pound, and do also appoint and fix the following descriptions and quantities of such sustenance.

The above sustenance rates shall be charged for each day of 24 hours; half rates only shall be charged for not more than 12 hours, and no charge shall be made for less than three hours, or for suckling animals of any kind.
