HEREAS by an Ordinance of the Legislature of the said Colony, made and passed in the Twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 21, entitled "An Ordinance for the recovery of Small Debts and "Demands," the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to constitute Local Courts for the recovery of small debts and demands, to be holden at such times and places and within such Districts throughout the said Colony, as may be most fit and convenient, and likewise by Proclamation to alter the time or place or manner of holding any such Courts; And WHEREAS it has been deemed expedient to alter the time for holding the Local Court at Katanning, in the Williams District: Now THEREFORE I, ALEX-ANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, Governor's Deputy, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby notify and proclaim that the day for holding a Local Court for the recovery of small debts and demands at Katanning, in the Williams District, shall, after the 1st day of March and thenceforth, be the third Wednesday in each and every month.

By-Law No. 9.

To regulate Hawking.

Preamble.

WHEREAS by the Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of Western Australia, 44 Victoria, No. 11, intituled "The Municipal Institutions Further Amendment Act, 1880," the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Perth are authorised to grant any such licenses for the hawking of fruit, fish, or vegetables in the City as they may deem proper, and to take for the same such fees as they may by any by-law or public notice from time to time appoint, and to make by-laws and regulations relative to such hawking. Now, therefore, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Perth hereby, in pursuance of the said powers and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, appoint and make the following by-laws and regulations :-

Hawkers to be licensed.

1. No person shall sell, offer, or expose for sale, in any part of the City of Perth, except in the house or premises of the person so selling, offering, or exposing for sale, or in any markets or open spaces adjoining, any fruit, fish, or vegetables, without a license to do so signed by the Mayor, Town Clerk, or other duly appointed officer of the said City, and every such license shall be numbered and registered and shall be in the form contained in the sphedule border and the license of the said city. schedule hereto, and shall be in force for the term therein stated and no longer.

Hawkers to carry License.

2. Every person licensed as a hawker shall, whilst engaged in hawking, carry the license so granted with him, and upon being required by any officer of the said Council or police officer, produce and show the same.

Name to be painted on vehicle.

3. Every licensed hawker shall, whilst hawking, have affixed to some conspicuous part of his cart, barrow, basket, vehicle, or dray a board or plate bearing his name and the words "Licensed Hawker" legibly printed thereon in letters not less than one inch in length.

License Fees.

The following fees shall be paid for such licenses for hawking:

With handbasket or tray, the sum of one shilling and sixpence per mensem. With wheelbarrow or handcart, the sum of two

shillings and sixpence per mensem.
With vehicles drawn by horses or other animals,

the sum of three shillings per mensem.

5. Any person offending against these by-laws shall for each offence, upon conviction thereof before any Justice of the Peace, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

from a depth previously attained of not less than 100 feet:—

For a shaft to be sunk from below the depth of 100 feet to a depth of 200 feet, @ £2 10s. per foot.

For a shaft to be sunk from below the depth of 200 feet to a depth of 300 feet, @ £5 per foot.
