GENERAL REGULATIONS FOR THE WORKING, MAN-AGEMENT, AND USE OF THE ALBANY TOWN JETTY, FRAMED BY HIS HONOUR CHIEF JUSTICE Onslow, Governor's Deputy, in Executive COUNCIL ON THE 28TH FEBRUARY, 1893, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF "THE JETTIES REGULATION ACT, 1878" (42 Vic., No. 18).

- 1. All other Regulations for the management and use of the Albany Town Jetty are cancelled from
- The Albany Town Jetty shall in future be under the control and management of the Customs Department.
- 3. Owners of vessels and lighters using the jetty for delivering or receiving cargoes will be required to pay to the Officer in charge, in respect of berthing dues-

One penny per ton of 2,240lbs.

Minimum—5s. per vessel, 2s. 6d. per lighter.

4. Consignees and shippers will be required to pay a charge of 1s. 6d. per ton on all goods landed or shipped at the Jetty; such charge including all labor in trucking on the Jetty; the tonnage to be computed according to the undermentioned scale:-

Potatoes in bags Salt in bags Hay in pressed bales Ironware (not in cases) Lead Ore Coal

@ 1s. 6d. per ton of 2,240 lbs.

Stone and Sand ballast

Bone Dust in bags Sandalwood

Bran and Flour (in bags), @ 1s. 6d. per ton of 2,000lbs.

Barley, Oats, Wheat, Maize, Pollard, @ 1s. 6d. per ton of 10 bags.

Timber, cases, and bales, @ 1s. 6d. per ton of 40 cubic feet.

Gunpowder, Dynamite, and other explosives, @ 5s. per ton of 2,240 lbs.

Minimum charge (for explosives), per consignment, 2s. 6d.

Horses, @ 9d. each. Bulls and Steers, @ 9d. each. Cows and Heifers, @ 9d. each.

Pigs, @ 1d. each. Sheep, @ 1d. each. Carriages, 6s. each.

Drays (4 wheeled), 6s. each.

Buggies, Dogcarts, Drays (2 wheeled), and Traps, &c., @ 4s, each.

Minimum charge for any package, 6d.

Under ½ ton, 6d. Over ½ ton, at rate of 1s. 6d.

All goods not enumerated in the foregoing scale to be charged at 1s. 6d. per ton of 40 cubic feet, or in cases of dead weight, 1s. 6d. per ton of 2,240lbs.

Passengers embarking or disembarking will not be required to pay Jetty dues on personal baggage when trucked up or down the jetty.

- 5. Jetty dues on all goods must be prepaid before they are removed.
- 6. Before commencing to discharge inward cargoes, ship masters or their agents shall hand to the Officer in charge of the jetty a freight list of the cargo, which shall include mark, number, shipper, consignee, weight, or measurement.
- 7. No goods shall be placed on the jetty without permission of the Officer in charge.
- 8. If free goods are not removed from the receiving warehouses within 24 hours from the time they are placed therein, a storage charge of 6d. per ton., or 1d. per package per day, will be made.
- 9. Cargoes trucked direct into receiving warehouses shall be tallied; and the Officer in charge shall, if requested, give receipts for same.
- The official hours for trucking will be from 6 a.m. to 5 p.m. between 1st October and the 30th April, with an interval of one hour each for breakfast and dinner; and on Saturdays the hours will be from 6 a.m. to 1 p.m. From 1st May to the 30th September, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., with an interval of one hour only for dinner; and on Saturdays from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m.
- 11. No vessels, boats, or flats shall be fastened to any part of the jetty, except to such ring-bolts or other fastenings as are or may be provided for the purpose; and no vessels, boats, or flats shall lie alongside the jetty unless so fastened. All vessels, boats, or flats so fastened shall also be anchored or moored in such manner as to relieve the jetty as much as possible from the weight of such craft; and in no case shall more than one tier of such vessels, boats, or flats lie alongside or be fastened to the jetty or be moored or fastened to other vessels, boats, or flats lying alongside the jetty, except on special permission of the officer in charge of the jetty.
- 12. Such vessels, boats, or flats shall not be moored or so fastened as aforesaid, except for the purpose of loading or unloading, nor for any longer period, during the authorised hours, than shall be reasonably required for such purpose.
- 13. Passenger boats only may lie alongside the steps on the jetty, and for no longer period than may be necessary to embark or disembark passengers.
- All such vessels, boats, or flats lying alongside the jetty shall, on the approach thereto of a

- passenger steamer, be hauled off to a sufficient distance to enable her to disembark or embark
- 15. No person shall fish on the jetty to the obstruction of the traffic.
- Stones, bricks, clay, sand, lime, coals, coke, or other fuel (except in bags) shall not be landed or placed on the jetty, except imported bricks or paving stone both which latter must be removed immedi-Firewood, for the use of passenger steamers and other vessels or boats shall be taken direct from the truck to the vessels. No goods shall be handed over the rails of the jetty.
- 17. Tramways and trucks provided for the use of the jetty shall, where so provided, be used for the transit of goods, chattels, and merchandise, on, to, and from the jetty. Bullock or horse teams, or any wheeled vehicle drawn by any quadruped or quadrupeds, shall not be driven on or permitted to go on the jetty.
- Gunpowder shall not be landed or left on the jetty without a keeper, nor without being well covered with a tarpaulin, and shall be removed with all possible despatch.
- 19. All goods trucked on the jetty must be carefully removed from the trucks, and not shot off them.
- No stones or other kind of substance whatever, shall be thrown into the water from the jetty.
- No person shall make fast any tackle, purchase, or other gear to any part of the cranes placed at the ends of the jetty, except such gear as is furnished by the Government for the working of the
- Not more than one ton shall be lifted with single half-inch chain, or two tons with a single block added. On a single five-eighth chain not more than 33 cwt. shall be lifted, or 66 cwt. with one single block added. For heavier weights the number of parts of the chain shall be increased in proportion to the weight to be lifted; but not more than five tons shall be put upon any crane without special arrangements with the officer in charge of the jetty.
- 23. Any steam vessel plying on the coast of this Colony shall be permitted to lie alongside the jetty, for the purpose of discharging and taking in cargo, at all hours of the day and night consistently with the Regulations.
- All steamers when lying at the jetty shall have and use two up-and-down fenders made of rope, and outside the up-and-down fenders a fore and aft rope fender of sufficient length and thickness to keep the guard streak entirely clear of the fender piles.
- No goods are to remain on the jetty for more than 24 hours, or on the platforms for more than 48 hours.
- 26. In cases where special permission is granted by the Collector or other principal officer of Customs for the landing of goods from beyond the seas on the beach, no wharfage charges will be levied as are chargeable on goods landed at the jetty.
- When the officer in charge of the jetty may deem it unsafe, through stress of weather, for a vessel to remain alongside a jetty, he shall direct the immediate removal of such vessel.
- 28. All foreign-going vessels shall be moored alongside the jetty, by the officer in charge of the jetty, in such position as may be indicated by such officer, who will, if necessary, direct the removal of other craft for that purpose.
- Vessels shall unload in the order in which they arrive, and are placed in a list to be kept by the officer in charge of the jetty. Application, to be

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placed in turn on such list according to arrival, must be made to the officer in charge on the day preceding that on which the vessel will unload. If such application be not made the next vessel on the list shall have precedence, but the vessel forfeiting her turn may be placed next in succession. Vessels will load according to the order of application to the officer in charge, and shall, when required by him, give place to vessels discharging cargo. Vessels arriving from or bound to foreign ports shall have precedence of coasting and other craft.

30. In the event of any vessel or vessels being moored alongside the Jetty in such way as to exclude any other vessel or vessels whose owners or masters wish also to moor her or them alongside consistently with the Regulations, the Officer in charge of the Jetty has power hereby to order the removal of such vessel or vessels to another berth or berths, and thus afford a berth or berths for such vessel or vessels so wishing to moor alongside such Jetty.

The foregoing General Regulations are published for general information.

[Extract from Queen's Regulations.]

On the arrival of a unit at any place where it is to remain in quarters, a public proclamation is to be made that if the landlords or other inhabitants suffer the soldiers to contract debts, such debts will not be discharged. If, after such proclamation, the inhabitants shall, notwithstanding, suffer the soldiers to contract debts with them it will be at their own peril, the officers not being obliged to discharge such debts.

This notice affects Albany and its surrounding Districts, and has already been made public by a printed notice in the local paper.


