Downing Street, 28th February, 1893.

With reference to my predecessor's circular despatch of 25th March, 1890, I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony under your Government, copies of notes which have been exchanged between Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Belgrade and the Servian Minister for Foreign Affairs, prolonging until the 1st July, 1893, the Provisional Commercial Agreement of the ^{2nd}/_{14th} of February, 1890, between Great Britain and Servia.

EXCHANGE OF NOTES PROLONGING TO JULY 1, 1893, THE PROVISIONAL COMMERCIAL AGREEMENT OF FEBRUARY 14, 1890, BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND SERVIA.

Belgrade, January 4, 1893.

M. LE MINISTRE,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your Excellency's note of this date, in which you inform me that the Servian Government adhere to their desire to prolong the Provisional Commercial Agreement of the 14th February, 1890, for six months only from the 1st (13th) January, 1893.

I regret that your Excellency has found it impossible to accede to the wish of Her Majesty's Government, that the prolongation should be for a year, but under the circumstances I am authorised by the Earl of Rosebery, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, to accept on behalf of Her Majesty's Government the pro-longation of the Provisional Commercial Agreement between England and Servia for six months, that is to say till the 1st (13th) July, 1893.

I have also the honour to repeat to your Excellency that when the Servian Government make known their wishes with respect to a new Commercial Treaty, their communication will receive the early attention of Her Majesty's who are prepared at once to commence Government, negotiations.

I trust your Excellency will do me the honour to send an early reply on behalf of the Servian Government, and avail myself, &c.

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of the note I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of the note in which you were good enough to inform me that Lord Rosebery, Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, had authorised you to accept, in the name of the Government of Her Britannic Majesty, the prolongation until the 1st (13th) July, 1893, of the Provisional Commercial Arrangement concluded between England and Servia on the 14th

February, 1890.

The object of the present exchange of notes being to establish the agreement arrived at between the two Governments, the necessary instructions will be sent to the Customs authorities of Servia, with the view to the agree-

ment being carried into effect.

I have, consequently, the honour, my Lord, to have recourse to your good offices in begging you to be good enough to make the necessary communication to your High Government, in order that similar instructions may be given to the Customs authorities of the United Kingdom.

In conformity with the wish expressed by you, in the name of your Government, I will not fail to take the necessary steps in order that, after having taken the advice of my colleague, the Minister of Agriculture and Commerce, negotiations may shortly be commenced between our two Governments, with the view to the conclusion of a definite Treaty of Commerce.

PERTH LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

the Local Board of Health, pursuant to the Regulations made by the Central Board of Health on the 19th August, 1889, and published in the Government Gazette of the 19th August, 1889:—

- 1. The burial of the remains of all persons who have died of infectious diseases shall be conducted in such manner and at such hours as the Health Officer shall direct.
- 2. The Vehicle used for the conveyance of the dead shall be kept outside the City limits, and shall be thoroughly disinfected after each interment by the undertaker, to the satisfaction of the Health Officer or his deputy.
- 3. The licensed number of the Vehicle used for this purpose shall be communicated to the police before employment.
- 4. No person shall be allowed to attend at the burials except the undertaker and his assistants, a disinfector, and a police officer.
- 5. All persons attending burials according to the preceding Regulation shall be disinfected before returning to the City.
- 6. Any person other than those mentioned in No. 4 of these Regulations attending or assisting at the burials of those who have died of an infectious disease shall be removed by the Police Officer on duty to the nearest Quarantine Station, and there detained until such time as the Health Officer may deem fit.
- 7. The Police Officers on duty shall prevent all persons from either entering or leaving any quarantined area or premises without the written permit of the Health Officer.
- 8. Any person entering the quarantine area, or quarantined premises, without the written permit of the Health Officer, shall be detained within such area or premises until such time as the Health Officer shall have satisfied himself that such person is not liable to contract the disease by reason thereof, or likely to carry infection without the premises or area.
- 9. Any person leaving any quarantine premises or area without the written permit of the Health Officer shall be brought back by the Police Officers on duty, or such other officers as shall be appointed by the Local Board for the purpose, and be detained until such time as the Health Officer shall give him written permission to leave, in accordance with preceding Regulation.
- 10. No person shall be allowed to leave the quarantine area without first undergoing a thorough disinfection.
- 11. The preceding Regulations shall apply to all premises quarantined by order of the Health Officer.
- 12. On report being made to the Health Officer that in any house there is, or are, individuals suffering from any contagious disease, the Health Officer shall attend at such house and inquire into the correctness of such report, and any person obstructing him in the discharge of this duty shall, on summary conviction before any two Magistrates, be liable to a fine of not less than £20.
- 13. In the event of the Health Officer being refused admittance to any house or premises, he shall procure the assistance of the nearest police officer or officers, and, if necessary, force an entrance thereto, and neither Health Officer or police officer or officers shall be liable at law or equity by reason of such forcible entry.
- 14. Any person infringing the above Regulations, or refusing to comply therewith, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against "The Public Health Act, 1886," and, on conviction thereof before any two Justices of the Peace in Petty Sessions, shall be liable for every such offence to the penalties set forth in Sec. 127 of such Act.

By-Law.

NDER the provisions contained in Section 24 of the Public Health Act (50 Vict., No. 19), the Health Committee for the City of Perth, by the powers therein conferred, doth hereby make the following By-Law for the further abatement and prevention of nuisances, and for securing the healthfulness of the inhabitants of the City of Perth:—

1 That on and after the 20th day of April, 1893, no night cart shall be kept or caused to be kept by the owners thereof, or by their servants, or by any person or persons acting for or on behalf of any such owner or owners, within the limits of the said City of Perth, except during such time or times as they may be actually engaged in the removal of night-soil, manure, offal, or other offensive matter or liquid. And for the purposes of this By-Law the words "Night Cart" shall be understood to mean any cart or other carriage of any description whatsoever used by any such owner or by his servant or servants, or any person or persons as aforesaid, for the removal of night-soil, manure, offal, or other offensive matter or liquid as aforesaid. Every such owner committing or allowing any servant or servants, or person or persons as aforesaid to commit a breach of this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of any sum not exceeding £10.
