HEREAS by the fifth section of "The Sand Drift Act, 1889," it is enacted that when it shall appear to the Governor in Council that, at any part of the coast, outside any Municipality, sand drifts from the sea on to the land to an injurious extent, it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette of Western Australia, to declare the existence of a sand-drift at such part of the coast, on so much of the land thereto adjacent as shall by metes and bounds be in such Proclamation set forth, which Proclamation shall come into force on the thirtieth day after its publication in the Government Gazette of the said Colony: And WHEREAS it appears to the said Governor in Council that at that part of the coast hereinafter described, outside the Municipality of Fremantle, sand drifts from the sea on to the land to an injurious extent: Now, THEREFORE, I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the said authority and power, proclaim and declare the existence of a sand-drift at that part of the coast bounded on the North by part of the South boundary of Fremantle Municipality, on the East by the West side of Fremantle-Rocking-ham Road, on the South by the South side of Russell Road, and on the West by the Sea-coast.

"Any Chinese who shall enter this Colony by land, without first obtaining a permit in writing from some person to be appointed by the Governor in Council, shall be guilty of an offence against this Act, and shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not less than £5 nor more than £20, and in addition or substitution for any such penalty shall be liable, pursuant to any warrant or order of the Colonial Secretary, to be removed or deported to the colony from whence he shall have come. Provided that this section shall only operate during such time as may from time to time be fixed by the Governor in Council by proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette of Western Australia, and any such proclamation may be revoked by he like authority in the like manner."

URSUANT to the Regulations of 50 Vic., No. 19, Sec. 24 "The Public Health Act, 1886," and to the powers therein contained, the Bunbury Local Board of Health did, on the 3rd day of May, 1893, make and approve of the following By-Laws:—

- 1. The Board may transact its business at the General Meetings of the Municipal Council, and Special Meetings may be called at any time in the same manner as Special Meetings of the Council.
- 2. The Local Board of Health shall have power to give notice (30 days) to all owners of property within the Municipality of Bunbury to fill in all cesspits and cause dry earth closets to be substituted in their place.
- 3. The duties of the Secretary shall be to make himself thoroughly acquainted with the provisions of "The Public Health Act, 1886," and carry out its provisions under instructions from the Local Board of Health; to summon, attend, and take minutes at meetings of the Board; keep accounts, and perform such other clerical duties as the Board thinks necessary.
- 4. The duties of the Inspector of Nuisances shall be to visit occasionally, and at uncertain times, the several parts of the town, and, if necessary, give advice to the occupiers of premises as to the prevention of nuisances and the deodorising of offensive matter; to keep a monthly record of all notices issued to abate nuisances and the result thereof, and to do such other things as the Board may require.
- 5. Should any nightman neglect or refuse, without reasonable excuse, to properly clean any cesspool, water closet, or earth closet, or to remove any other offensive matter for 24 hours after demand from the Inspector or any occupier of premises within the town, he shall be subject to a penalty of not exceeding One pound, and the Inspector or occupier may engage any other nightman for the service.
- 6. No nightsoil or other offensive matter shall be removed before 11 p.m. or after 5 a.m. Any person guilty of a breach of this by-law shall be subject on conviction to a penalty of not more than Five pounds.
- 7. Any person who shall deposit broken glass, bottles empty tins, or other rubbish in any street or other public place within the town, or other than the places set apart for that purpose, shall, on conviction thereof, in addition to the expenses of removing the same, be subject also to a penalty of not more than Two pounds.
- 8. No person shall exercise or practise the business of a nightman, or drive any night-cart within the limits of the town of Bunbury, unless and until he shall have obtained a license to do so from the Inspector, subject to the approval of the Board.
- 9. No night-cart shall be kept within the limits of the municipality.
- 10. For the purposes of these by-laws the word "nightman" shall be understood to mean any person who for remuneration shall remove, or assist to remove, any nightsoil, or other foul or offensive matter or thing whatever; and the word "night-cart" shall mean any cart or other carriage, of any description whatsoever, used by nightmen for the conveyance of any nightsoil, ammoniacal liquor, or other offensive liquid or substance.
- 11. Every vessel kept for the reception of nightsoil shall be of a shape and size approved by the Inspector.
- 12. Every privy or closet shall be built in such a position as may be approved by the Inspector or the Board, and every person having or building a closet contrary to this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than One pound nor more than Five pounds.
- 13. For every offence against the provisions of these bylaws to which no penalty is herein attached, the offender shall, upon conviction before any one or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty of not exceeding Five pounds.
