By His Excellency SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: Now Therefore I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested as aforesaid, and of all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation announce and proclaim that THE FOURTH SESSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AND THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY, to be holden under the provisions of the said Act, shall be holden, for the despatch of business, on Wednesday, the fifth day of July NEXT, at the hour of three of the clock, p.m.: the Session of the Legislative Council to be holden in the Legislative Council Chambers, in St. George's Terrace, in the City of Perth, in the said Colony; and the Session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly Chambers, in Howick Street, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

IS Excellency the Governor in Council, under the powers conferred upon him by "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act" (55 Vict., No. 9), notifies, for general information, that the Pearling Banks in Sharks Bay, closed by Gazette Notice on the 26th March, 1892, and numbered No. 2 and No. 3, will be opened for Pearl Shelling on the dates named hereunder, subject to the special conditions named and the regulations in force for the time being.

2. The area comprised in No. 2 is as follows:-

All that portion of Useless Inlet and Freycinet Reach which lies inshore of a line extending Northwards from Cape Bellefin to the edge of the 3-fathom bank on the 26th parallel of South Latitude, and along it East to a point 1½ miles North-North-East from Cape Heirisson, and then about South-South-East half South in direction of Lefevre Island to a spot 1½ miles East from a headland lying about 5 miles North-Westerly from said Island, and thence West to that headland.

This area to be opened from 1st October to 31st December, 1893, and, by the special permission of the Inspector, during January, 1894; but no dredging will be allowed, and the collection must only be by hand, subject to the right of the Inspector to stop work at any time if, in his opinion, the industry is being injured.

3. The area comprised in No. 3 is as follows:—

All that portion of Denham Sound lying inshore of a line extending West from Cape Lesueur three miles, then South-South-Easterly to a spot three miles West from Lagoon Point, and then East to said point.

This area to be opened from 1st July to 30th September, 1893, subject to the right of the Inspector to stop work at any time if, in his opinion, the industry is being injured.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in him by "The Defence Forces Act, 1893," has been pleased to make the following Regulations for the Defence Force, in addition to those previously published in the Government Gazette.

#### Regulations applicable to whole of Defence Force.

#### General Regulations.

Commandant to command Military Forces.

1. The Military Forces in the Service of Her Majesty's Government in Western Australia, subject to such Rules and Regulations as are now or may be from time to time passed by the Governor in Council, shall be under the command of the Military Commandant, as provided for by Sec. 4, Defence Forces Act, 1893.

Commandant responsible for Discipline of Troops.

2. The Commandant shall be responsible for the discipline of the Troops, and the constant preparation for actual service, and, in case of attack upon the Colony, for the immediate and advantageous disposal of every description of force under his command.

Commandant to make an annual Inspection.

3. The Commandant will make an annual inspection of every corps under his command, and such other inspections as he may consider necessary for raising the efficiency of any corps; and he will also make an annual inspection of all the Defence Works of the Colony.

Commandant to make an annual Report.

4. As soon as may be after the close of each year, the Commandant will furnish a report to the Responsible Minister for Defence at the time being, as to the Efficiency in all respects of the various parts of his command.

#### Precedence of Corps.

Precedence of branches of Defence Force.

- 5. The precedence of the various portions of the Defence Force of Western Australia has been provided for by Section 8, Defence Forces Act, 1893, and is as follows:—
  - I. The Permanent Force.
  - II. The Militia or Partially Paid Force.
  - III. The Volunteer Force.

#### Precedence of various Arms.

6. The various Arms of these Forces rank amongst themselves in accordance with the same rules as exist in the Imperial Army.

#### Precedence of Corps.

7 Different corps of the same Force and Arm take rank and precedence in accordance with the dates of their formation.

#### Command and Rank.

#### General Rules.

8. The General Rules relative to command and rank will be found in section II., Queen's Regulations, 1892, and they are to be accepted as a guide inasmuch as they affect the officers to which these Regulations apply.

### Corresponding Ranks of Officers of the Permanent Force, &c.

Officers of Permanent Force command those of equal rank in other branches.

9. Officers of the Permanent Force command other Officers of equal rank belonging to the other branches of the Defence Force.

Rank and precedence of Officers and Non-Commissioned Officers.

10. The rank and precedence of officers and non-commissioned officers of the Defence Force has been provided for by section 10, Defence Forces Act, 1893.

#### Rank and precedence of Medical Officers.

11. The ranks of officers of the Military Medical Department shall be the same as those in the Imperial Service, and these ranks shall carry precedence and other advantages attaching to the rank indicated by the military portion of the title, but shall not entitle the officer to take military command over any body of troops other than those placed specially under his command. The various ranks will be found enumerated in the Royal Warrant for pay and promotion.

#### Commissions and Promotion of Officers.

#### Commissions, how issued.

12. Commissions will be issued, in accordance with and subject to the provisions of Section 9, Defence Forces Act, 1893, to all persons serving in the Defence Force, above the rank of warrant officer.

Appointments, &c., to be approved by Governor in Council.

13. All appointments, promotions, exchanges, transfers, and resignations of officers are to be submitted by the Commandant to the Responsible Minister for the approval of the Governor in Council.

Notifications in "Government Gazette" to be deemed Official.

14. The Government Gazette, published by authority, in which all military appointments, promotions, exchanges, and removals are inserted, is transmitted to all officers

commanding corps to enable them to notify in orders such details contained therein as may affect their commands, and notifications so published will be deemed to be official for all military purposes.

#### Regulations applicable to Permanent Force only.

#### Service of Officers.

Ages of Compulsory Retirement.

15. The following are the ages in the various ranks at which officers will be compulsorily retired:—

Lieutenants, at the age of 40 years.

Captains, , , 45 ,, Majors, , , , 50 ,,

But the Governor in Council may nevertheless, on the recommendation of the Commandant, permit or require any officer who would otherwise be retired under this rule to continue to serve and perform his duties.

#### Permission to hold Rank and wear Uniform.

16. Officers ceasing to hold their commissions are not to be considered as retaining any rank, or to be entitled to wear uniform, except the special sanction of the Governor has been granted to them to do so, and notified in the Government Fazette.

#### Officers to pass Examination.

17. Officers appointed to corps must pass an examination as set forth in the syllabus contained in Appendix VII., Queen's Regulations, 1892, within a year of their appointment, and will not be eligible for promotion to the rank of lieutenant until they have passed this examination.

#### Lieutenants and Captains.

18. Lieutenants before promotion to the rank of captain, and captains before promotion to the rank of major, must qualify in the subjects detailed for their respective ranks contained in the syllabus above referred to.

#### Service.

Notice Paper to be given to Intending Recruits.

19. Any person applying to be enrolled in the Permanent Force when it is open for recruiting shall be given a notice paper setting forth terms of service, &c., and his enrolment shall not be proceeded with until he has assented to the conditions contained therein.

#### Qualifications for Enlistment.

20. The following is the standard of measurements which a man must reach to qualify for enlistment in the Permanent Force:—Height (with bare feet), 5 feet 8 inches; chest measurement (next to skin), 36 inches. He must also be between the ages of eighteen and thirty, of good character, and single.

#### Boys

21. Boys must be fourteen years of age before they are qualified for enlistment.

#### Allowances.

#### Travelling Allowance.

24. The following are the rates of allowances for officers when travelling on duty, or while absent from their head-quarters on any special duty:-

#### I. Without Troops.

Rank of Officer.

(a) When proceeding a distance of over 5 miles from head quarters and returning same day, 10s. if more than 6 hours absent, if less 5s.

Captain Lieutenant 2nd Lieutenant (b) 1. For each night absent from quarters, if not supplied with lodging at Government expense,

2. If supplied with lodging at Government expense, 10s.

#### Officers defray Expenses.

25. Officers travelling without troops will invariably defray all expenses in the first instance, and recover on completion of the duty.

Officers receiving Forage Allowance, no claim under 10 miles.

26. Officers in receipt of forage allowance are to travel at their own expense up to a distance of 10 miles from head-quarters, and no recovery for conveyance can be made for distances within that limit.

#### II. With Troops.

27.---Rank of Officer.

Captain

Lieutenant

2nd Lieutenant

(a) First day of journey by land, 15s.; (b) Subsequent days of journey by land

or halting days, 10s.;

(c) Journeys by sea, for each day or part of day on board ship, 5s.; when steamboat fares include all meals, the allowance will be 2s. 6d. a day.

(d) For the day of embarkation and for the day of disembarkation,

15s.

#### When at Drill and Manœuvres.

28. Travelling allowance will not be issued to officers marching with troops for drills and manœuvres unless specially authorised by the Commandant.

#### W.O., N.C.O., and Men without rations.

29. Allowances for Warrant Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Men travelling without rations:-

Warrant Officers, 7s. 6d. a day.

N.C.O. of the rank of Sergeant and upwards, 5s. a day.

Rank and file, 4s. a day.

#### Field Allowance.

30. Field allowance at the following daily rates is authorised for Officers and Warrant Officers in aid of the expenses caused by their being placed under canvas:-

Rank of Officer. Captain

4s. { If in command of a unit, Is. in addition Lieutenant 2nd Lieutenant Warrant Officer, 1s. 6d.

#### Recovery of Allowances and Expenses.

31. All allowances and expenses connected with travelling will be recovered on Treasury Form "N," which will be rendered to the Military Office as soon as possible after completion of the service. A separate form will be used for each individual.

#### APPENDIX.

#### Alarm Signals.

32. With reference to section 18 "Defence Forces Act, 1893," the following are the Signals of Alarm therein referred to:

At Stations where there is a Corps of Field Artillery: Six guns fired in pairs, 15 seconds between each gun of a pair, and two minutes between each pair.

At Stations where there is no Field Artillery: The ringing of the Firebell for 15 minutes in succession.

#### Members of Defence Forces to Rendezvous at respective Head-quarters.

33. All members of the Defence Force on hearing these signals, or on learning that they have been made, will at once repair to the Head-quarters of their Corps, taking with them such Military arms, accoutrements, ammunition, and outfit as are in their possession.

#### Bonus for Deep Sinking.

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Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 11th January, 1893.

OTICE is hereby given that the Government offers a Bonus to any person or company who, during the year 1893, shall sink on any of the declared Goldfields of the Colony a Shaft as hereinafter mentioned, and according to the following conditions, from a depth previously attained of not less than 100 feet:—

For a shaft to be sunk from below the depth of 100 feet to a depth of 200 feet, @  $\pounds 2$  10s. per foot.

For a shaft to be sunk from below the depth of 200 feet to a depth of 300 feet, @  $\pounds 5$  per foot.

#### CONDITIONS.

Each shaft to be vertical throughout, with a superficial area of not less than 27 feet in the clear when completed, and a minimum width of not less than 3 feet, to be sunk and timbered where necessary, to the satisfaction of the Warden or his Deputy.

Provided, that if any shaft has been already sunk of a less superficial area than 27 feet, the bonus shall be paid in proportion; but in no case shall any bonus be paid for a shaft having a less area than 20 feet, or less than 3 feet in width.

All measurements of depth to be taken from the surface of the ground.

Payments will be made monthly as the work progresses. No payments will be made for less than 10 feet, and all work shall be measured and passed by the Warden or his Deputy before payment, and the decision of the Warden or his Deputy shall be final.

No payment will be made in respect of the first 100 feet from the surface.

With regard to existing shafts, no payment will be made in respect of work done before the date hereof.

Any person intending to deepen any existing shaft of or exceeding the depth of 100 feet shall give notice in writing to the Warden or his Deputy of the depth of the said shaft, and of his intention to deepen the same.

The Warden or his Deputy shall ascertain and certify the depth of such shaft, and payment shall be made only in respect of the work done beyond the depth certified by the Warden or his Deputy.

Any person intending to sink a new shaft with the intention of claiming a bonus shall give notice in writing of such intention before the commencement of the work, or before the shaft is down 100 feet.

Rules for the Conduct of Examinations under "The Licensed Surveyors Act," 50 Vic., No. 6.

Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 9th May, 1893.

THE "Land Surveyors Licensing Board," appointed under the Act 50 Vic., No. 6, to recommend to His Excellency the Governor for appointment fit and proper persons, whose qualifications for the office shall have been satisfactorily ascertained (to be styled "Licensed Surveyors"), have, with the approval of the Governor, made the following rules for the conduct of examinations under the said Act:—

1. Examinations shall take place at Perth in the month of September, or at any other time in the discretion of the Board, provided that not less than two weeks notice shall in every case be given in the Government Gazette.

- 2. Each candidate shall give written notice to the President of the Board of his intention to present himself for examination; such notice must be received by the President of the Board not less than seven clear days previous to the date fixed for the examination to commence, and must be accompanied by documentary evidence
  - a. That he is over 21 years of age.
  - b. That he is a person of good fame and character.
  - c. That he has served for three years with a
    Surveyor or Surveyors, licensed under
    this or similar Acts in the Australian
    Colonies, Tasmania, or New Zealand,
    or that he has served for four years
    with a Surveyor or Surveyors of recognised standing in other countries; at
    least two years of such service shall
    have been in the field and one year in
    a Surveyor's office.
  - d. That he has served in the field in Western Australia with a Surveyor licensed under this Act, and that he is competent to undertake surveys on his own responsibility; the term of such service shall not be less than six months when the candidate has served his time in one of the Australian Colonies, Tasmania, or New Zealand, and not less than twelve months in other cases.

He must also forward at the same time a plan of a survey made by himself, with the original notes taken by him on the ground. The plan must be in strict accordance with the Rules and Regulations published for the guidance of Surveyors employed in the Surveyor General's Department.

- 3. A candidate presenting himself for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a set of scales, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.
  - 4. Subjects of examination: -
    - a. Adjustment and use of the following instruments:—

Theodolites (Transit and Y)

Level Sextant

Prismatic Compass
Chain

- b. Computation of areas.
- c. Viva voce on subjects a and b, and generally on field practice.

A candidate who fails to obtain 80 per cent. of the total number of marks placed on subjects a, b, and c shall not be allowed to proceed with his examination.

d. Mensuration

Algebra

Arithmetic

Logarithms.

e. Principles and Practice of Land Surveying

Details of Field Practice, including the keeping of Field Notes

Topographical Surveying

Setting out Block Surveys

Laying out Roads.

f. Trigonometry, Plane and Spherical.

- q. Levelling and Earthwork.
- h. Plotting from field notes by protractor and by ordinates

Construction of maps and charts

Compilation of maps and charts from detached plans and notes

Reduction of bearings to common datum Mechanical work of map drawing, writing, &c.

i. Determination of latitude by astronomical observations

Determination of the true meridian and time by astronomical observations

Determination of relative latitude and longitude by triangulation

Convergence of meridians.

- The Board will not recommend that a license be issued to any candidate that does not obtain 70 per cent. of the total number of marks placed on subjects d, e, f, g, h, and i.
- 6. Licenses may, in the discretion of the Board, be recommended without examination to the following:-

Any Surveyor holding a license under a similar Act from one of the Governments of Australia, Tasmania, or New Zealand; and who also produces documentary evidence of recent date satisfactory to the Board from a Surveyor General of any one of the above-named colonies, certifying as to his qualifications and character, or a similar certificate from one of the Surveyors Institutes established in the Australian Colonies, Tasmania, or New Zealand, signed by the Chairman at an ordinary meeting of the members, or from any other authority satisfactory to the Board.

When the Board cannot recommend the issue of a license to a candidate because his examination discloses a want of field experience, they may require him to produce further certificates as to his service in the field in this Colony before he can present himself again for examination; such additional term of service may be for any period not exceeding twelve months, at the discretion of the Board.

All previous rules published are hereby cancelled.
