WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: Now THEREFORE I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested as aforesaid, and of all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation announce and proclaim that the Fourth Session OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AND THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY, to be holden under the provisions of the said Act, shall be holden, for the despatch of business, on Wednesday, the fifth day of July Next, at the hour of three of the clock, p.m.: the Session of the Legislative Council to be holden in the Legislative Council Chambers, in St. George's Terrace, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly Chambers, in Howick Street, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

HEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Magisterial Districts Act, 1886," the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation, to declare any portion of the Colony to be a Magisterial District, and to name the same, and define the boundaries thereof: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the said Act, do hereby declare that portion of the Colony comprised within the following boundaries to be a Magisterial District, under the name of the "Murchison Magisterial District":—

Bounded by lines starting from Tallering Peak and extending North-Eastwards to the summit of Mount Murchison, thence to the summit of Mount Hale, thence to Mount Russell, near the Watershed of the Murchison River, thence South-Westward to Mount Kenneth, thence Westward to Mugga-Mugga Hill, and thence North-Westward to the summit of Tallering Peak.

The boundaries of the Victoria and Gascoyne Magisterial Districts, respectively, are hereby amended in so far as they are affected by the boundaries of the Murchison Magisterial District as hereinbefore described.

SIR,

Downing Street, 24th October, 1873.

My attention has been directed to the fact that no place has been assigned in the Order of Precedency to such Gentlemen as, in consideration of the length of their service as Members of the Executive Council, have received Her Majesty's permission to retain the Title of "Honourable" within the Colony after their retirement from the Council.

It is proper that a high position should be assigned to persons on whom this privilege has been conferred, and I have to convey to you the Queen's pleasure that former Members of the Executive Council who have been permitted to bear the Title of "Honourable" permanently within the Colony, shall take precedence next after the actual Members of the Executive Council, according to the dates at which they may have respectively become qualified by length of service to retain the Title.

AT THE COURT AT OSBORNE HOUSE, ISLE OF WIGHT,

Present,

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

Whereas by an Order in Council made in pursuance of the Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1862, and dated the 11th day of August, 1884, Her Majesty, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, was pleased to direct that on and after the 1st day of September, 1884, the Regulations contained in the Schedule thereto should, so far as regards British Ships and Boats, be substituted for the Regulations contained in the First Schedule to an Order in Council made as aforesaid, and dated the 14th day of August, 1879.

And whereas by two Orders in Council made in pursuance of the said Act, and on such joint recommendation as aforesaid, and dated respectively the 30th day of December, 1884, and the 24th day of June, 1885, certain modifications and additions were made to the said Regulations contained in the Schedule to the said recited Order in Council of the 11th day of August, 1884, as regards British fishing vessels and boats.

And whereas by another Order in Council made in pursuance of the said Act and on such joint recommendation as aforesaid, and dated the 18th day of August, 1892, certain modifications and additions were made to the said Regulations contained in the Schedule to the said recited Order in Council of the 11th August, 1884, as regards Steam Pilot vessels.

And whereas by the said Regulations contained in the Schedule to the said Order in Council of the 11th day of

August, 1884, it is amongst other things provided as follows:—

Art. 3.—A sea-going steam ship when under way shall carry—

- (a) On or in front of the foremast, at a height above the hull of not less than 20 feet, and if the breadth of the ship exceeds 20 feet, then at a height above the hull not less than such breadth, a bright white light, so constructed as to show an uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 20 points of the compass, so fixed as to throw the light 10 points on each side of the ship, viz., from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on either side, and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night, with a clear atmosphere, at a distance of at least five miles.
- (b) On the starboard side, a green light, so constructed as to show an uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 10 points of the compass, so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on the starboard side, and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night, with a clear atmosphere, at a distance of at least two miles.
- (e) On the port side, a red light, so constructed as to show an uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 10 points of the compass, so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on the port side, and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night, with a clear atmosphere, at a distance of at least two miles.
- (d) The said green and red side lights shall be fitted with inboard screens projecting at least three feet forward from the light, so as to prevent these lights from being seen across the bow.

Art. 15.—If two ships under steam are meeting end on, or nearly end on, so as to involve risk of collision, each shall alter her course to starboard, so that each may pass on the port side of the other.

This article only applies to cases where ships are meeting end on, or nearly end on, in such a manner as to involve risk of collision, and does not apply to two ships which must, if both keep on their respective courses pass clear of each other.

ships which must, if both keep on their respective courses, pass clear of each other.

The only cases to which it does apply are, when each of the two ships is end on, or nearly end on, to the other; in other words, to cases in which by day, each ship sees the masts of the other in a line, or nearly in a line, with her own; and by night to cases in which each ship is in such a position as to see both the side lights of the other.

or the other.

It does not apply by day, to cases in which a ship sees another ahead crossing her own course; or by night, to cases where the red light of one ship is opposed to the red light of the other, or where the green light of one ship is opposed to the green light of the other; or where a red light without a green light, or a green light without a red light, is seen ahead, or where both green and red lights are seen anywhere but ahead.

And whereas there has been doubt or misapprehension concerning the effect of the said two articles, and whereas the Admiralty and the Board of Trade have jointly recommended to Her Majesty to make the following additions to the said Regulations for the purpose of explaining the said recited Articles, and of removing the said doubt or misapprehension.

Now, THEREFORE, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said Act, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct that from the date of this Order the Regulations contained in the Schedule to the said Order in Council of the 11th day of August, 1884, shall be further modified by the addition to the said recited Article 3 of the provisions contained in the Schedule hereto.

With regard to all vessels whose lights are inspected by the officers of the Board of Trade the red or green side light will not be deemed to be fixed and fitted in accordance with the Regulations unless it is so fixed and screened

that a line drawn from the outside edge of the wick to the foremost end of the inboard screen of such light shall make an angle of 4 degrees, or as near thereto as may be practicable, with a line drawn parallel with the keel of the ship from the outside edge of the wick.

And whereas by two Orders in Council, made in pursuance of the said Act, and on such joint recommendation as aforesaid, and dated respectively the thirtieth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, and the twenty-fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, certain modifications and additions were made to the said Regulations contained in the Schedule to the said recited Order in Council of the eleventh day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, as regards British fishing vessels and boats:

And whereas by the said Regulations contained in the Schedule to the said Order in Council of the eleventh day August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, it is, amongst other things, provided as follows, namely:—

ARTICLE 9.—A pilot vessel, when engaged on her station on pilotage duty, shall not carry the lights required for other vessels, but shall carry a white light at the masthead, visible all round the horizon, and shall also exhibit a flare-up light, or flare-up lights, at short intervals, which shall never exceed fifteen minutes.

A pilot vessel, when not engaged on her station on pilotage duty, shall carry lights similar to those of other ships.

And whereas the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, have in pursuance of the said recited Act, jointly recommended to Her Majesty that the said Regulations contained in the Schedule to the said Order in Council of the eleventh day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, should be further modified by adding to the said recited Article 9 thereof the provision contained in the Schedule hereto

Now THEREFORE, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said Act, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct that from the date of this Order, the Regulations contained in the Schedule to the said Order in Council of the eleventh day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, shall be further modified by the addition to the said recited Article 9 thereof of the provisions contained in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

A Steam Pilot vessel exclusively employed for the service of Pilots licensed or certified by any Pilotage authority or the Committee of any Pilotage District in the United Kingdom when engaged on her station on pilotage duty and in British waters and not at anchor shall in addition to the lights required for all Pilot boats carry at a distance of eight feet below her White Masthead light a red light visible all round the horizon and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night with a clear atmosphere at a distance of at least two miles and also the coloured side lights required to be carried by vessels when under way.

When engaged on her station on Pilotage duty and in British waters and at anchor she shall carry in addition to the light required for all Pilot boats the red light above mentioned but not the coloured side lights.

When not engaged on her station on Pilotage duty she shall carry the same lights as other steam vessels.

WHEREAS by the first section of the Colonial Probates Act, 1892, it is enacted as follows:—

"Her Majesty the Queen may, on being satisfied that the legislature of any British possession has made adequate provision for the recognition in that possession of probates and letters of administration granted by the courts of the United Kingdom, direct by Order-in-Council that this Act shall, subject to any exceptions and modifications specified in the Order, apply to that possession, and thereupon, while the Order is in force, this Act shall apply accordingly."

And whereas Her Majesty is satisfied that the Legislatures of the British Possessions herein-after mentioned have made adequate provision for the recognition in those Possessions of Probates and Letters of Administration granted by the Courts of the United Kingdom.

Now, THEREFORE, Her Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above-recited Act in Her Majesty vested, is pleased by and with the advice of Her Most Honourable Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

The Colonial Probates Act, 1892, shall apply to the British Possessions hereunder mentioned:—

Hong Kong,

Western Australia, and

The Province of Ontario in the Dominion of Canada. And the Most Honourable the Marquess of Ripon, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

ADDITIONAL RULES AND ORDERS.

For the Registrars of the Principal Probate Registry in Non-contentious Business for carrying out the provisions of the Colonial Probates Act, 1892.

92. Application to seal a Grant of Probate or Letters of Administration or copy thereof under the Colonial Probates Act, 1892, may be made in the Principal Probate Registry by the Executor or Administrator or the Attorney [lawfully authorised for the purpose] of such Executor or Administrator, either in person or through a Solicitor.

93. Such application must be accompanied by an Oath of the Executor, Administrator, or Attorney in the form in the Appendix or as nearly thereto as the circumstances of the case will allow.

- 94. The Registrars are to be satisfied that notice of such application has been duly advertised. (Form of advertisement in Appendix.)
- 95. On application to seal Letters of Administration the Administrator or his Attorney shall give Bond (in the form set out in the Appendix) to cover the personal estate of the deceased within the jurisdiction of the Court. same practice as to Sureties and Amount of Penalty in Bond is to be observed as on application for Letters of Administration.
- Application by a Creditor under Section 2 Sub-Section 3 of the Colonial Probates Act is to be made by Summons before one of the Registrars, supported by an Affidavit setting out particulars of the claim.
- 97. In every case, and especially when the domicile of the deceased at the time of death as sworn to in the Affidavit differs from that suggested by the description in the Grant, the Registrars may require further evidence as to Domicile.
- 98. If it should appear that the deceased was not at the time of death domiciled within the jurisdiction of the Court from which the Grant issued, the Seal is not to be affixed unless the Grant is such as would have been made by the High Court of Justice in England.
- 99. The Grant (or copy grant) to be sealed and the copy to be deposited in the Registry must include copies of all testamentary papers admitted to Probate.
- When application to seal a Probate or Letters of Administration is made after the lapse of three years from the death of the deceased the reason of the delay is to be certified to the Registrars. Should the certificate be unsatisfactory the Registrars are to require such proof of the alleged cause of delay as they may think fit.
- 101. Special or limited or temporary grants are not to be sealed without an order of one of the Registrars.
- 102. Notice of the sealing in England of a Grant is to be sent to the Court from which the Grant issued.
- When intimation has been received of the resealing of an English Grant, notice of the revocation of, or any alteration in such Grant is to be sent to the Court by whose authority such Grant was resealed.
- 104. The affidavit for Inland Revenue pursuant to the Customs and Inland Revenue Acts, 1880 and 1881, shall be transmitted to the Commissioners of Inland Revenue as if the person who applied for sealing under the Colonial Probates Act, 1892, were a person applying for Probate or Letters of Administration.
- 105. The affidavit for Inland Revenue and Accounts and Schedules forming part thereof shall be in such form as may be prescribed by the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury.

(Note.—The affidavit to be used will in fact be Form A. with some few modifications to suit the circumstances.)
