EREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful THEREAS under the for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: Now THEREFORE I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested as aforesaid, and of all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation announce and proclaim that THE FOURTH SESSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AND THE LEGISLATIVE Assembly, to be holden under the provisions of the said Act, shall be holden, for the despatch of business, on Wednesday, the fifth day of July NEXT, at the hour of three of the clock, p.m.: the Session of the Legislative Council to be holden in the Legislative Council Chambers, in St. George's Terrace, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly Chambers, in Howick Street, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

HEREAS by "The Imported Stock Act, 1876," and "The Prevention of the Importation of Diseased Stock Act, 1879," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to acquire and set apart, by Proclamation in the Gazette, such ground as may be required for one or more Quarantine Stations, on which the necessary sheds and appurtenances may be erected for the purposes of the said Acts; And whereas it is deemed expedient to set apart a Quarantine Station for Swine, near Fremantle: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers in me vested as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby set apart as a Quarantine Station, for four months from this date, a block of land, 100 yards square, with a 14ft. sty in the centre thereof, situate about the middle of Cockburn Sound Location No. 128, for the purposes of the said Acts.

FINDING OF THE COURT.

Pronounced in Open Court, in the hearing of James McAdam, late Master of the ship "Ulidia."

WE find that the British ship "Ulidia" (Official No. 96257) was stranded through your default on the Straggler Reef, was stranded through your default on the Straggler Keer, in the Port of Fremantle, on the morning of the 18th May, 1893, while on a voyage from Fremantle to Sydney, New South Wales, and has since become a total wreck, and that charges 1, 3, and 4 have been fully proved.

We therefore, under the powers granted unto us under the Local Ordinances 28 Vic. No. 2, 40 Vic., No. 4, and 51 Vic., No. 6, suspend your Master Mariner's Certificate, No. 92330 for the term of six calendar months from the

Additional By-Law of the Yilgarn Roads Board.

THE Yilgarn Roads Board doth hereby make and publish the following additional By-Law, under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1888":—

"That on and after the 1st day of July next, all Teamsters plying on the Coolgardie Road shall drive their horses in the following manner, viz.:

A team of 3 horses shall have 1 horse in shafts and 2 horses abreast; in a team of 4 horses, if double shafts, horses 2 abreast, if single shafts, 1 horse in the lead, 1 horse in the shafts, and other 2 horses abreast; in a team of 5 horses, if double shafts, 1 horse in the lead, other 4 horses 2 abreast, if single shafts, 1 horse in shafts, others 2 abreast; in a team of 6 horses, if double shafts, horses must be driven 2 abreast, if single shafts, 1 horse in the lead, 1 horse in the shafts, other 4 horses 2 abreast; the same will apply to teams of more than 6 horses.

OTICE is hereby given that the Government offers a Bonus to any person or company who, during the year 1893, shall sink on any of the declared Goldfields of the Colony a Shaft as hereinafter mentioned, and according to the following conditions, from a depth previously attained of not less than 100 feet:—

For a shaft to be sunk from below the depth of 100 feet to a depth of 200 feet, @ $\pounds 2$ 10s. per foot.

For a shaft to be sunk from below the depth of 200 feet to a depth of 300 feet, (a) £5 per foot.

CONDITIONS.

Each shaft to be vertical throughout, with a superficial area of not less than 27 feet in the clear when completed, and a minimum width of not less than 3 feet, to be sunk and timbered where necessary, to the satisfaction of the Warden or his Deputy.

Provided, that if any shaft has been already sunk of a less superficial area than 27 feet, the bonus shall be paid in proportion; but in no case shall any bonus be paid for a shaft having a less area than 20 feet, or less than 3 feet in width.

The Warden or his Deputy shall ascertain and certify the depth of such shaft, and payment shall be made only in respect of the work done beyond the depth certified by the Warden or his Deputy.

Any person intending to sink a new shaft with the intention of claiming a bonus shall give notice in writing of such intention before the commencement of the work, or before the shaft is down 100 feet.

No company or person shall receive assistance for more than one shaft on the same mining property.
