WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: Now THEREFORE I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested as aforesaid, and of all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation announce and proclaim that THE FOURTH SESSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AND THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY, to be holden under the provisions of the said Act, shall be holden, for the despatch of business, on WEDNESDAY, THE FIFTH DAY OF JULY NEXT, at the hour of three of the clock, p.m.: the Session of the Legislative Council to be holden in the Legislative Council Chambers, in St. George's Terrace, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly Chambers, in Howick Street, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

WHEREAS by "The Imported Stock Act, 1876," and "The Prevention of the Importation of Diseased Stock Act, 1879," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to acquire and set apart, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, such ground as may be required for one or more Quarantine Stations, on which the necessary sheds and appurtenances may be erected for the purposes of the said Acts; AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to set apart a Quarantine Station for Swine, near Fremantle: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers in me vested as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby set apart as a Quarantine Station, for four months from this date, a block of land, 100 yards square, with a 14ft. sty in the centre thereof, situate about the middle of Cockburn Sound Location No. 128, for the purposes of the said Acts.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the Ordinance 4 and 5 Victoria, 21, His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following additional Regulation, namely:—

"No vessel or boat shall touch or land at or discharge upon or take cargo from the Island of Rottnest, or any jetty or pier appertaining to the said Island, without the consent of the Superintendent of the said Island, and no person shall land upon the said Island without the consent in writing of the Colonial Secretary.

"Any person wilfully contravening this Regulation is liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not less than 40s. nor exceeding £10, and in default of imprisonment for not less than seven days nor more than three months (4 and 5 Vic., 21, s. 4)."

**FINDING OF THE COURT.**

*Pronounced in Open Court, in the hearing of James McAdam, late Master of the ship "Ulidia."*

We find that the British ship "Ulidia" (Official No. 96257) was stranded through your default on the Straggler Reef, in the Port of Fremantle, on the morning of the 18th May, 1893, while on a voyage from Fremantle to Sydney, New South Wales, and has since become a total wreck, and that charges 1, 3, and 4 have been fully proved.

We therefore, under the powers granted unto us under the Local Ordinances 28 Vic., No. 2, 40 Vic., No. 4, and 51 Vic., No. 6, suspend your Master Mariner's Certificate, No. 92330, for the term of six calendar months from the date of wreck, viz., the 18th day of May, 1893.

In the meantime you will be allowed to use a Chief Mate's Certificate.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council, under the powers conferred upon him by "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act" (55 Vict., No. 9), notifies, for general information, that the Pearling Banks in Sharks Bay, closed by Gazette Notice on the 26th March, 1892, and numbered No. 2 and No. 3, will be opened for Pearl Shelling on the dates named hereunder, subject to the special conditions named and the regulations in force for the time being.

2. The area comprised in No. 2 is as follows:—

All that portion of Useless Inlet and Freycinet Reach which lies inshore of a line extending Northwards from Cape Bellefin to the edge of the 3-fathom bank on the 26th parallel of South Latitude, and along it East to a point  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles North-North-East from Cape Heirisson, and then about South-South-East half South in direction of Lefevre Island to a spot  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles East from a headland lying about 5 miles North-Westerly from said Island, and thence West to that headland.

This area to be opened from 1st October to 31st December, 1893, and, by the special permission of the Inspector, during January, 1894; but no dredging will be allowed, and the collection must only be by hand, subject to the right of the Inspector to stop work at any time if, in his opinion, the industry is being injured.

3. The area comprised in No. 3 is as follows:—

All that portion of Denham Sound lying inshore of a line extending West from Cape Lesueur three miles, then South-South-Easterly to a spot three miles West from Lagoon Point, and then East to said point.

This area to be opened from 1st July to 30th September, 1893, subject to the right of the Inspector to stop work at any time if, in his opinion, the industry is being injured.

Additional By-Law of the Yilgarn Roads Board.

THE Yilgarn Roads Board doth hereby make and publish the following additional By-Law, under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1888":—

"That on and after the 1st day of July next, all Teamsters plying on the Coolgardie Road shall drive their horses in the following manner, viz.:

A team of 3 horses shall have 1 horse in shafts and 2 horses abreast; in a team of 4 horses, if double shafts, horses 2 abreast, if single shafts, 1 horse in the lead, 1 horse in the shafts, and other 2 horses abreast; in a team of 5 horses, if double shafts, 1 horse in the lead, other 4 horses 2 abreast, if single shafts, 1 horse in shafts, others 2 abreast; in a team of 6 horses, if double shafts, horses must be driven 2 abreast, if single shafts, 1 horse in the lead, 1 horse in the shafts, other 4 horses 2 abreast; the same will apply to teams of more than 6 horses.

4. The fares of small parties of soldiers travelling on duty will usually be paid at the time when tickets are issued, but large parties and small ones, in unavoidable cases, will not be paid for, in which case Military Form G 12 (printed in red, the words "on payment" being omitted), will be used, tickets issued on that, and recovery made from the Treasury in the usual manner.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Government offers a Bonus to any person or company who, during the year 1893, shall sink on any of the declared Goldfields of the Colony a Shaft as hereinafter mentioned, and according to the following conditions, from a depth previously attained of not less than 100 feet:—

For a shaft to be sunk from below the depth of 100 feet to a depth of 200 feet, @ £2 10s. per foot.

For a shaft to be sunk from below the depth of 200 feet to a depth of 300 feet, @ £5 per foot.

**CONDITIONS.**

Each shaft to be vertical throughout, with a superficial area of not less than 27 feet in the clear when completed, and a minimum width of not less than 3 feet, to be sunk and timbered where necessary, to the satisfaction of the Warden or his Deputy.

Provided, that if any shaft has been already sunk of a less superficial area than 27 feet, the bonus shall be paid in proportion; but in no case shall any bonus be paid for a shaft having a less area than 20 feet, or less than 3 feet in width.

All measurements of depth to be taken from the surface of the ground.

Payments will be made monthly as the work progresses. No payments will be made for less than 10 feet, and all work shall be measured and passed by the Warden or his Deputy before payment, and the decision of the Warden or his Deputy shall be final.

No payment will be made in respect of the first 100 feet from the surface.

With regard to existing shafts, no payment will be made in respect of work done before the date hereof.

Any person intending to deepen any existing shaft of or exceeding the depth of 100 feet shall give notice in writing to the Warden or his Deputy of the depth of the said shaft, and of his intention to deepen the same.

The Warden or his Deputy shall ascertain and certify the depth of such shaft, and payment shall be made only in respect of the work done beyond the depth certified by the Warden or his Deputy.

Any person intending to sink a new shaft with the intention of claiming a bonus shall give notice in writing of such intention before the commencement of the work, or before the shaft is down 100 feet.

No company or person shall receive assistance for more than one shaft on the same mining property.
