WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: NOW THEREFORE I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested as aforesaid, and of all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation announce and proclaim that THE FOURTH SESSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AND THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY, to be holden under the provisions of the said Act, shall be holden, for the despatch of business, on WEDNESDAY, THE FIFTH DAY OF JULY NEXT, at the hour of three of the clock, p.m.: the Session of the Legislative Council to be holden in the Legislative Council Chambers, in St. George's Terrace, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly Chambers, in Howick Street, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the Ordinance 4 and 5 Victoria, 21, His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following additional Regulation, namely:—

“No vessel or boat shall touch or land at or discharge upon or take cargo from the Island of Rottnest, or any jetty or pier appertaining to the said Island, without the consent of the Superintendent of the said Island, and no person shall land upon the said Island without the consent in writing of the Colonial Secretary.

“Any person wilfully contravening this Regulation is liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not less than 40s. nor exceeding £10, and in default to imprisonment for not less than seven days nor more than three months (4 and 5 Vic., 21, s. 4).”

*First Order Light.*

**I**T is hereby notified that in accordance with Notices to Mariners, dated respectively the 30th July, 1891, and 9th March, 1893, a Double Flashing Half Minute White Light, of the First Order, was exhibited from the New Lighthouse on Dassen Island on the 15th April, 1893, and

will continue to be shown hereafter. The duration of the Flashes and Eclipses is approximately as follows:—

The light has an elevation of 155 feet above high water level, ordinary spring tides, and is visible in clear weather at a distance of 18½ nautical miles from the Lighthouse.

Dassen Island lies about 4½ miles off the South-West Coast of the Cape Colony, in latitude 33° 26' South, and longitude 18° 5¼' East, and it is distant from Cape Town about 33 nautical miles.

**By-Laws of the Corporation of Fremantle.**

No. 1.

*A By-Law to regulate, by means of Standing Orders, the proceedings of the Municipal Council within and for the Town of Fremantle.*

*Business of the Council to be conducted according to the following Standing Orders.*

**P**REAMBLE.—Whereas by the Municipal Institutions Act, 1876, Sect. 49, it is enacted that “It shall be lawful for the Council to make, publish, alter, modify, amend or repeal such By-Laws and Regulations as to them shall seem meet for regulating their own proceedings,” and by the said Act it is further enacted that “such By-Laws should not be inconsistent with, or repugnant to, any of the provisions of that Act, or to any law in force, and when confirmed by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and published in the *Government Gazette*, but not sooner or otherwise, should “have the force of law;” And whereas it is expedient to make divers regulations for conducting the proceedings and business of the said Municipal Council: Be it therefore enacted and ordered and directed by the Mayor and Councillors of the Town of Fremantle that, from and after the date of this By-Law coming into operation, the proceedings and business of the said Municipal Council shall be conducted according to the following regulations only, which shall be and be called the Standing Orders of the said Municipal Council; that is to say—

## CHAPTER I.

*Order of Proceeding.**Monthly meeting.*

1. The Council shall meet at the Council Chamber on the first Tuesday in every month, or oftener if necessary, at the hour of 8 p.m., for the transaction of their ordinary business.

*Council to sit with open doors.*

2. The business of the Council shall be conducted on all ordinary occasions with open doors; but any one member present may require the exclusion of strangers until it shall have been decided by the Council whether the question proposed shall be discussed with open doors.

*Quorum.*

3. That four members, in addition to the Chairman, shall constitute a quorum.

*Notice of Meetings to be given.*

4. Previous to any meeting of the Council, a notice of the time and place of such intended meeting, signed by the Town Clerk, shall be left at the usual place of business or abode of every member of the Council, or sent to him by post, one clear day at least before such meeting.

*Commencement of Business.*

5. The Council shall commence business so soon after the time stated in the summons as there shall be a sufficient number of members to form a quorum: but if at the expiry of fifteen minutes from the time specified in the summons there is not a quorum present, no business shall be transacted by the Council at that meeting.

*When a quorum not present.*

6. At all meetings of the Council, when there is not a quorum present, or when the Council is counted out, such circumstance, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the minute-book.

*Confirmation of Minutes.*

7. The minutes of any preceding meeting, not previously confirmed, shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the Council in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

*Council may resolve itself into Committee.*

8. That on the discussion of any motion, the Council, if it shall deem expedient, may resolve itself into committee for the purpose of better discussing the subject matter of such motion.

*Standing Orders to be observed in Committees.*

9. That the Standing Orders of the Council shall be observed in all committees of the whole Council, except the rule limiting the number of times of speaking.

*Order of Business.*

10. At all meetings of the Council (unless otherwise provided for by law) the reading of correspondence unconnected with the orders of the day, the presentation of petitions by members of the Council, and the bringing up of reports of any committees, shall have precedence of the regular business.

*Notice-paper.*

11. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the Council, and any business which the Mayor may think fit to bring under consideration. Any member of the Council may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice of motion; such notice to be given in writing to the Town Clerk, either at the previous meeting, or at least three clear days previous to the meeting at which the same is to be taken into consideration, and all such notices of motion shall be considered in the order in which they are given.

*Proceeding with Notice-paper.*

12. No motion entered on the notice-paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorised by him, be present when the business is called in order; and in case he is not present, either himself or by proxy, the notice shall be struck out of the paper.

*By-Laws.*

13. No By-Law shall be finally passed or adopted at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed, nor until the next meeting of the Council regularly convened; and every such By-Law shall in the interim remain open for the inspection of any person whose name is on the assessment roll.

## CHAPTER 2.

*Order of Debate.**Motions and Amendments, how proposed.*

14. Any member desirous of proposing a motion or amendment, or of discussing any matter under consideration, must address the Mayor or other presiding Chairman, and no member when speaking shall be interrupted unless called to order; in which case the member calling to order shall be heard thereupon in preference to any other speaker, and the question of order shall be disposed of before the subject is resumed or any other subject entered upon.

15. Any member desirous of proposing either an original motion or amendment must state the nature of such motion or amendment before addressing the Council in support thereof.

16. Any member making a motion or amendment shall, if demanded by the Mayor, put it in form, sign and deliver it to the Town Clerk, who shall add thereto the name of the seconder; and no motion or amendment so made shall be withdrawn without leave of the Council.

*Seconding of Motions and Enforcement of Standing Orders.*

17. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed unless it be seconded; any member may, however, require the enforcement of any Standing Order of the Council by simply noticing that such order is disobeyed.

*As to speaking in moving or seconding Motions.*

18. Any member moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that question.

19. The members in speaking shall designate the Mayor by his title, but the Councillors only by their respective names.

*Pre-audience.*

20. If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the Mayor or other presiding Chairman shall decide which is entitled to pre-audience.

*Mayor to call to order in certain cases.*

21. The Mayor or other presiding Chairman shall, without waiting for the interposition of the Council, call to order any member proceeding to speak a second time, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation where he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

*Speaking twice.*

22. No member shall speak twice on the same question except by way of explanation, or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last carried; and after the reply, the amendment, or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

*Digression, imputation of motives, etc.*

23. No member shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, or impute improper motives to others, and all personal reflections upon any member shall be considered highly disorderly.

*Decision of Points of Order.*

24. The Mayor or other presiding Chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or precedent applicable to the case without argument or comment, and his decision as to what is order or explanation shall be final, *pro hac vice*, in each case.

*Offensive Expressions.*

25. Any member who shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other member shall, if required by the Council, withdraw such expression, and make a satisfactory apology to the Council, under a penalty (in case he refuses or neglects to do so before the rising of Council) of not less than one nor more than ten pounds. (40 Vic., No. 13, Sec. 52.)

*Words may be taken down.*

26. Any member may require the Town Clerk to take down any particular words used by a member immediately upon the same being spoken.

*Production of Documents.*

27. Any member may, of right, require the production of any of the documents of the Municipal Council relating to the question or matter in discussion.

*Amendments.*

28. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time; but, if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote; but, upon any amendment being carried, it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment thereon, but no more.

*Amendment if carried to quash original Motion.*

29. Upon the adoption of any amendment by the Council, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion; and for all the purposes of subsequent discussion, the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

*Vote, how taken.*

30. The Mayor or other presiding Chairman shall, in taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative, and then in the negative; and he may do so as often as is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion, from the show of hands, as to which party has the majority.

*Manner of Voting. Divisions.*

31. The Council shall vote by show of hands, except in the cases of elections, when the vote shall be by ballot. Any member of the Council may, however, call for a division upon any question; in which case the members voting in the affirmative shall stand up and those in the negative shall retain their seats, until the vote is recorded.

*Adjournment.*

32. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Council; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the Council.

*Protests.*

33. Any member of the Council may enter his protest against any resolution of the Council, provided that such protest is not inconsistent with truth or disrespectful to the Council. Notice of intention to protest must, however, in every case be given on the adoption of the resolution to be protested against; and the protest signed by the member or members protesting, and specifying the reasons for protesting, must be entered by the Town Clerk, before the next regular meeting of the Council, in the Minute Book, in the usual way.

*Resolutions, how rescinded.*

34. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the Council, shall be entertained during the same Municipal year, unless a call of the whole Council has been duly made for that purpose; and no motion for rescinding any resolution of the Council which shall have been negatived by the Council shall be again entertained during the same Municipal year, unless by consent of at least four of the members.

## CHAPTER 3.

*Elections.**Notice of Elections.*

35. No election to any office at the disposal of the Council shall take place unless seven clear days' notice at least shall have been given by advertisement in one or more of the local newspapers, inviting applications for candidates properly qualified.

*Fixing of Salaries.*

36. The salary or allowance attached to all officers and places at the disposal of the Council, excepting the office of Mayor, shall be fixed for the Municipal year in all cases before proceeding to the Election.

*Election of Officers.*

37. At all elections for offices at the disposal of the Council the voting shall take place by ballot.

*Security.*

38. No member of the Council, nor any officer of the Municipal body holding office under the Council, shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the Council, or for any work to be done for the Council; and in all cases in which security for the due and faithful performance of any duty or contract is required, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the party giving the same.

## CHAPTER 4.

*Miscellaneous Regulations.**Call of Council.*

39. For the consideration of any By-Law, or for the raising or appropriating of money, or for the objects contemplated in Standing Order No. 34, it shall be competent for any member, without previous notice, to move for a call of the whole Council for the consideration of any such subject, at the next or any subsequent meeting; and upon such motion being carried, due notice thereof shall be given in the Notice-paper for the day when the order of the day or notice of motion for which such call was made is set down for consideration; and any member not in attendance when such order of the day or notice of motion comes under consideration, or not in attendance at the voting upon such question or any amendment thereof, whether of adjournment or otherwise, shall be liable to a penalty of One pound, unless reasonable cause for such absence be shown to the satisfaction of the Council.

40. Any one or more of the Standing Orders of the Council may be suspended *pro tempore* in case of emergency, provided that five members at least be present, and the majority then shall decide whether such suspension is necessary.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council, under the powers conferred upon him by "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act" (55 Vict., No. 9), notifies, for general information, that the Pearling Banks in Sharks Bay, closed by Gazette Notice on the 26th March, 1892, and numbered No. 2 and No. 3, will be opened for Pearl Shelling on the dates named hereunder, subject to the special conditions named and the regulations in force for the time being.

2. The area comprised in No. 2 is as follows:—

All that portion of Useless Inlet and Freycinet Reach which lies inshore of a line extending Northwards from Cape Bellefin to the edge of the 3-fathom bank on the 26th parallel of South Latitude, and along it East to a point  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles North-North-East from Cape Heirisson, and then about South-South-East half South in direction of Lefevre Island to a spot  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles East from a headland lying about 5 miles North-Westerly from said Island, and thence West to that headland.

This area to be opened from 1st October to 31st December, 1893, and, by the special permission of the Inspector, during January, 1894; but no dredging will be allowed, and the collection must only be by hand, subject to the right of the Inspector to stop work at any time if, in his opinion, the industry is being injured.

3. The area comprised in No. 3 is as follows:—

All that portion of Denham Sound lying inshore of a line extending West from Cape Lesueur three miles, then South-South-Easterly to a spot three miles West from Lagoon Point, and then East to said point.

This area to be opened from 1st July to 30th September, 1893, subject to the right of the Inspector to stop work at any time if, in his opinion, the industry is being injured.
