PROCLAMATION

Western Australia, }
to wit. }
W. C. F. Robinson.

By His Excellency Sir William Cleaver Francis Robinson, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the 42nd Section of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is enacted that when Six years shall have elapsed from the date of the first summoning, under Section Six of the said Act, of persons to the Legislative Council, or when the Registrar General of the Colony shall have certified, by writing under his hand, that the Population of the Colony has, to the best of his knowledge and belief, exclusive of aboriginal natives, attained to Sixty thousand souls—whichever event shall first happen—Part III. of the said Act shall come into operation; provided that the Governor in Council shall have power, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to further postpone the operation of the said Part III. of the said Act for any period not exceeding Six months;

AND WHEREAS the Registrar General of the Colony has this day certified, by writing under his hand, that the Population of the Colony has, to the best of his knowledge and belief, exclusive of aboriginal natives, attained to 60,000 souls;

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to postpone the coming into operation of Part III. of the said Act for a further period of Three months:

Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me as aforesaid, do, by this my Proclamation, declare, order, and direct that Part III. of "The Constitution Act, 1889," shall not come into operation until the expiration of Three months from the date hereof.

Given at Government House, Perth, this 18th day of July, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.
