Amendment of Clauses 65 and 76 of the Regulations for the management of Goldfields.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under the powers conferred upon him by the Goldfields Act (50 Victoria, No. 18), has been pleased to amend Clauses 65 and 76 of the Regulations under the said Act, gazetted 4th October, 1892, so as to read as follows:—

Term and payment of rent.

65. The term of all Leases granted under these Regulations shall be computed from the 1st of January preceding the date of the application.

The rents of all Leases shall be calculated as from the 1st of January to the 31st of December, and shall be paid in advance to the Minister, at the Land and Survey Office, Perth, or to his Agents at the various Resident Magistrates' Courts in the Colony, or to the Warden of the Goldfield, on or before the 1st of March in each year, and if the rent for any lease is not paid within thirty days from that date the lease shall be voidable at the will of the Governor. Leases applied for during the year will be charged rent from the beginning of the quarter previous to the date of application.

What considered a sufficient working.

76. A lease, claim, or protection area shall be considered as effectively worked when eight hours' *bonâ fide* work is performed thereon by the complement of miners required by these Regulations, on every working day except Saturday, when four hours' work shall be considered sufficient.

In any case where machinery has been erected upon any lease or claim, and is kept constantly at work, the Warden may, in his discretion, dispense with such portions of the labour conditions as to him may seem fit.

Fractions of a penny to be charged as a penny.

Frail or very bulky articles, in proportion to weight, such as barometers, cases of stuffed birds and animals, light furniture, parcels containing brittle articles, such as china, glass, and porcelain, pasteboard boxes of light millinery or feathers, picture frames, ship's chronometers, small birds alive in cases or cages, thermometers, and violins are charged 50 per cent. more than the ordinary parcels rates.

The undermentioned articles, when conveyed at parcels rates, will be delivered free of charge in Perth and Fremantle within a distance of one mile from the respective Railway Stations, viz. :—

Bacon, brawn, bread, butter, cheese, eggs, fish, flowers, fruit, hams, honey, ice, meat, poultry, and vegetables.

For distances beyond one mile and under two miles, over macadamised roads, the following charges will be made for delivery :—

Up to and not exceeding 28lbs., 4d.
Do. do. 56lbs., 6d.
Do. do. 112lbs., 9d.

The undermentioned articles, when sent from one consignor to one consignee, in packages weighing 56lbs. and upward, are charged half Parcels Rates—minimum charge ¼d. per lb. :—

Aerated waters, bacon, brawn, bread, butter, cheese, corned beef, eggs, fish, flowers, fruit, hams, honey, ice, meat, potted beef and fish, poultry, and vegetables.

Delivery in Perth and Fremantle is not included in this rate, but special arrangements can be made with the Station Masters for delivery, at the following rates :—

For distances of one mile and under, up to and not exceeding 56lbs., 4d.
For distances of one mile and under, up to and not exceeding 112lbs., 6d.
For distances over one mile and not exceeding two miles, double rates.

Deliveries will be made between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m.

Persons making inquiry as regards the delivery of Registered Letters addressed to places beyond the Colony shall pay the fee of 2½d. provided for the acknowledgment of receipt, such fee to be refunded in the case of any delay in delivery being attributable to the Post Office.

3. Urgent Telegrams:

Urgent Telegrams addressed to places beyond the Colony will be received and despatched at double the ordinary rates.

4. Repeats of Intercolonial Telegrams (for correction):

The receiver of a message may have the whole or part of it repeated on payment of the cost of the telegram demanding the repetition, and of the reply to the same.

The sender can also have the whole or any portion of his message repeated, on payment of the cost of the telegram he forwards and of the reply.

The demand for the repetition must be made within seventy-two hours after receipt or despatch of the telegram, and should be written in the following manner:—
