WHEREAS a certain Townsite has been duly proclaimed a Townsite, under the name and style of "Cue Townsite," such Townsite consisting of land bounded as hereafter mentioned in the Schedule hereto: AND WHEREAS such Townsite is included in and forms a portion of the Murchison Goldfield: AND WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Goldfields Act, 1886," power is given to the Governor of the said Colony, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to except from occupation for mining purposes, or for residence or business, under any Miner's Right or Business License, any specific portion of Crown lands within a Goldfield: NOW THEREFORE I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, G.C.M.G., Governor as aforesaid, do, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, except such Townsite from occupation for mining purposes, or for residence or business, under any Miner's Right or Business License, such Townsite being a specific portion of Crown lands within a Goldfield, to wit, the Murchison Goldfield: And I do order all persons, from and after the date of the publication of this my Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to take notice hereof and govern themselves accordingly.

WHEREAS by the 17th Section of "The Customs Consolidation Act, 1892" (55 Vic., No. 31), it is provided, amongst other things, that it shall be lawful for the Governor to establish any Port or Sub-Port, and declare the limits thereof: NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim all that piece of water, whether Sea or Ashburton River, included within a radius of seven miles from Entrance Point, at the mouth of the Ashburton River, to be a Port of the said Colony; and also to be a Warehousing Port, as provided by Section 126 of the said Act.

## The Customs Consolidation Act, 1892.

## Regulations for Private Warehouses.

WHEREAS the Governor has appointed certain ports or places to be Warehousing Ports or places for the purposes of the said Act; And whereas it is deemed expedient to make Regulations in respect of Private Warehouses: Now, therefore, I, Sir John Forrest, K.C.M.G., Minister and Colonial Treasurer of the said Colony, do hereby, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor, make the following Regulations; and I direct that all occupiers or licensees of Private Warehouses shall execute a bond, with the sureties and for the amount prescribed by the following regulations; and I do order that all regulations heretofore made relating to Private Bonded Warehouses under the provisions of "The Private Bonded Warehouses Act, 1883," shall be and the same are hereby revoked.

1. Licenses for Private Warehouses shall be of two descriptions, namely, (1) Licenses for the warehousing of any or all dutiable goods belonging to or the property of the owner or occupier of the warehouse, except dangerous goods; and (2) Licenses for the warehousing of dangerous goods. Licenses shall be in the form A annexed. Dangerous goods shall include gunpowder, blasting powder, dynamite, detonators, caps, fuses, kerosene, paraffine, gasoline, turpentine, mineral acids, matches, and any other goods which may be deemed "explosive," or "specially dangerous," within the meaning of "The Explosives Act, 1885."

2. The holder of every Private Warehouse License shall enter into a bond, with two sureties, in the sum of £500, for the due payment of duties on all goods which may be deposited in the warehouse. The bond shall be in the form B annexed.

3. A fee of £50 per annum shall be paid in advance for each license. (*See* sections 127 and 128.)

4. The licensee of a Private Warehouse shall pay for the services of a Government Locker at the rate of 1s. 6d. an hour, or part of an hour, so long as he shall actually be engaged at such Private Warehouse.

5. Applications must be made at the Custom House at the Port not later than 10 a.m. on any day on which the services of a Locker be required at a Private Warehouse.

6. No building shall be licensed for the purpose of a Private Warehouse unless built of brick or stone, and roofed with iron, slates, or shingles.

7. In cases where the whole of a building is not licensed, the bonded portion must be partitioned off and secured to the satisfaction of the Principal Officer of Customs of the Port.

8. Licenses may be issued for Private Warehouses in the city of Perth. Buildings licensed under these Regulations in any Port shall not be more than 1,000 yards from the chief office of Customs of the Port. But buildings licensed for dangerous goods shall be situated in some safe locality to be approved by the Municipality of the town.

9. Every building licensed under these Regulations must contain a sufficient number of windows to supersede, as far as possible, the necessity of any artificial light. The windows on the upper floors and skylight must be secured by stout hammered iron bars firmly fixed and secured, to the satisfaction of the Collector; and those on the ground floor, in addition to such bars, must have shutters made to open internally, with strong hinges thereon, and a cross bar. All windows opening into private yards

in the occupation of other persons or over other buildings, and all superfluous windows together with the fire-places or chimneys, must be stopped with brick or stone as solid as the walls themselves. All the entrances into warehouses are to have strong doors furnished with screws, staples, and hasps, each screw to be secured by a nut and riveted on the inside to prevent the fastenings being drawn.

10. The keys of the Customs locks shall be in the custody of the Government Warehouse-keeper, and shall not be made use of without his authority. The door shall also be secured by a patent lock, the key of which may be kept by the owner or occupier of the Warehouse.

11. The occupier or licensee of a Private Warehouse must furnish at his own cost one weighing machine; such machine is to be tested when in use by the Customs Officers as often as may be deemed necessary.

12. Sufficient space must be reserved within some well lighted portion of the warehouse for gauging, or otherwise a shed, covered with slate or iron, must be provided for the purpose.

13. No Free or Duty-paid goods shall be kept within a Private Warehouse; and if any such goods are found therein the license will be liable to forfeiture.

14. Goods cleared for home consumption or exportation must be removed from the warehouse immediately; or any delay in so doing must be explained to the satisfaction of the Collector.

15. No goods shall be bonded which cannot be actually placed within the warehouse. This Regulation not to apply to goods landed on Collector's special order.

16. No Private warehouse shall be opened, except for receipt, delivery, packing, gauging, &c., of goods, and then only in the presence of the proper officer of Customs.

17. All packages of whatever description must immediately upon receipt be entered in a book ready for weighing, gauging, and examining as soon as practicable, or under any circumstances within forty-eight hours.

18. No spirits, wines, beer, or tobacco shall be placed on any floor where the lowest part of the roof is not 10 feet clear above the floor, unless the rafters are ceiled. This is not to apply to case spirits.

19. No tools of any description or other instruments shall be kept in Private Warehouses, except the following, viz., bung starters, flagging iron, pump, funnel, gimlet, rimer, cooper's chisel and hammer, small bottle funnel.

20. No naked lights shall be used in a Private Warehouse.

21. The proprietor of warehoused goods will have no claim on the Customs for any loss he may sustain, by fire in the warehouse or in any examining shed, or by accident, or by felony.

22. No spirits or wines shall be racked off but from the bung hole, with the pump or syphon, without special permission in writing from the Collector. No samples of wines or spirits to be taken without an order in the usual form from the Customs.

23. No water shall be kept in a Private Warehouse.

24. No case or package of any kind shall be examined but in the presence of the Officer of Customs; all ullage cases shall have the number of bottles they contain marked legibly on the outside of the case, and all cases shall be carefully nailed down before stowed away.

25. Owners of unsound wine, upon the importation thereof, or after it has been bonded, upon application to the Collector, and under the superintendence of the proper Customs Officer, may be permitted to convert it into vinegar, by adding at least twenty per cent. of crude vinegar, and after such conversion it may be admitted at the duty payable on vinegar.

26. No cask or other package containing spirits of wine received into bond is, under any circumstances, to be opened or tapped, either for samples or other purposes, except in the presence and under the direction of the Gauging Officer. Wines and spirits may be bottled off into reputed quart or pint bottles without any name or label thereon or on the package in which the same are packed, and packages may be opened, but only in presence of the officer of Customs deputed by the Collector, and subject to such precautions and restrictions as the Collector may think necessary.

27. No smoking shall be allowed in any part of a bonded store.

28. Private Warehouses shall be opened only during the same hours as may be in force at the Public Warehouses, except on special application to the Collector, and payment of the overtime allowed under the Customs Regulations.

29. All goods intended to be bonded in a Private Warehouse must be taken direct to the store, and the carrier shall deliver a cart-note to the officer in charge of the store.

30. Goods shall be placed and kept in the store at the risk and expense of owner.

31. A Register Book shall be kept of all goods "Received" and "Delivered" in such form as may be prescribed by the Collector, and on or before the last day of each month a certified copy shall be forwarded to the Collector made up to the 25th of the month inclusive.

32. Licenses under these Regulations shall not be transferable, and may at any time be revoked and cancelled by the Minister.

33. The Auditor General shall, whenever he considers it necessary, or on receipt of instructions to that effect, take stock of all goods bonded in any Private Warehouse for which a license has been granted under these Regulations.

2. The charges for receiving in the Public Warehouses, and delivering, shall be 2s. 6d., and the rent 6d. per hhd. per week.

3. All bulk beer not cleared from the Public Warehouses within three months after entry will be sold by Auction as overtime goods.

CUSTOMS CARRIERS' REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the said Act, I, Sir JOHN FORREST, K.C.M.G., Colonial Treasurer for the said Colony, hereby order and direct that in the following Ports and places, namely:—Albany, Geraldton, Fremantle and Perth, it shall be necessary to carry in duly licensed carriages or conveyances, and in such carriages or conveyances only, Goods cleared for drawback or from the warehouse for exportation, or removal under bond, or which have been imported the duty not having been paid thereon. And I do hereby also, with the approval of the Governor in Council, make the following Regulations for the carriage and conveyance of such Goods in the said Ports and places.

REGULATIONS.

1. All persons desiring to carry dutiable goods as aforesaid from or to any ship, pier, warehouse, or bond, must obtain from the Collector at the Port in which he desires to carry such goods, a License, as per Schedule A, for each dray, carriage or conveyance to be used, and shall also give a bond in the Form B in the Schedule hereto, with two approved sureties, for due compliance with the Customs Laws and Regulations. Such bond shall be for the sum of £100.

2. Applications shall be made in writing to the Collector for such license, and shall state the names, calling, and addresses of the two sureties proposed (who must be residents of Western Australia).

3. The annual fee of £1 for such license shall be paid in advance on the 1st July in each year.

4. The number of the license, with the word "Customs," shall be legibly painted on each dray, carriage, or conveyance used by the licensee.

5. The license may be transferred on written application, provided a new bond is entered into when required.

6. The licensee and his draymen will be responsible for the duty on all deficiencies found in any package during transit between the sheds, bonded warehouses, or shipping.

### Term and payment of rent.

65. The term of all Leases granted under these Regulations shall be computed from the 1st of January preceding the date of the application.

The rents of all Leases shall be calculated as from the 1st of January to the 31st of December, and shall be paid in advance to the Minister, at the Land and Survey Office, Perth, or to his Agents at the various Resident Magistrates' Courts in the Colony, or to the Warden of the Goldfield, on or before the 1st of March in each year, and if the rent for any lease is not paid within thirty days from that date the lease shall be voidable at the will of the Governor. Leases applied for during the year will be charged rent from the beginning of the quarter previous to the date of application.

### What considered a sufficient working.
