PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS under and by virtue of "The Magisterial Districts Act, 1886" (50 Vic., No. 17), the Governor, by Proclamations dated the 30th day of September, 1886, and the 19th day of January, 1891, respectively, and published in the Government Gazette of even dates, did declare the boundaries of the Plantagenet, York, Toodyay, Victoria, and Yilgarn Magisterial Districts; And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the boundaries of the said Magisterial Districts: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers in me vested by the said Act, do hereby cancel the said Proclamations so far as the above-mentioned Districts are concerned; and, with the like advice, do hereby declare the following to be the Boundaries of the Yilgarn, Plantagenet, York, Toodyay, and Victoria Magisterial Districts, respectively:

Boundaries of the Yilgarn Magisterial District.

Bounded by lines starting from a spot situate 80 miles North and 20 miles West from Eenuin Well, and extending East 250 miles, South 180 miles, West about 250 miles, and North 180 miles to the starting point.

Boundaries of the Plantagenet Magisterial District.

Bounded on the Eastward by the East boundary of the Colony; on the Southward by the sea-coast from the said East boundary to D'Entrecasteaux Point, including the islands adjacent; on the Westward and Northward by lines extending North-North-Easterly from Point D'Entrecasteaux aforesaid to the junction of the Wilgarup River with the Warren River, thence by an Easterly line to the South-West corner of Nelson Location 6, at Topanup, thence Easterly by the Road to Albany to Muir's Bridge at the Frankland River, thence in a Northerly direction up the Frankland River to "Upper Yeriminup Pool," thence

Northerly to a point 16 miles West of the 175-Mile mark on the Perth-Albany Road, thence East passing through the said mile mark to the junction of the Jackitup Creek with the Pallinup River, thence East-North-Easterly to Mount Glasse in the Bremer Range, thence East-North-Easterly to the South boundary of the Yilgarn Magisterial District and along it East to its South-East corner, thence North along its East boundary to its intersection with a due East line from the highest summit of the Wongan Hills, and thence due East to the Eastern boundary of the Colony.

Boundaries of the York Magisterial District.

Bounded on the Westward by a due South line from a spot on the Eastern Railway, passing along the Eastern boundary of Helena Location 22 to its South-East corner, thence in a Southerly direction to the summit of Mount Dale, thence South-Easterly to a spot 20 miles East of the 41-Mile mark on the Perth-Albany Road, then in about the same direction to the Hotham River at Reserve 225 A at Cojatotine Pool; on the North-West by the South-East boundary of the reserve for the Railway aforesaid (the said reserve being a strip of land, one chain wide, on each side of the centre of the rails) in an East-North-Easterly direction till it intersects the Western boundary of Avon Location e 1, thence by that location's Western and Southern boundaries, and crossing the Avon River by its right bank downwards to the South corner of Avon Location P, thence East-North-Easterly along its Southern boundary, then in a South-South-Easterly direction along the Western boundary of Avon Location 62 and East-North-Easterly along the Southern boundaries of Avon Locations 62, 1066, 0, and 61, to the Western boundary of Avon Location N 1, and South-South-Easterly to its South corner, thence East-North-Easterly along its Southern boundary and by an East-North-East line in the direction of a spot due East from the summit of the highest peak in the Wongan Hills, at Long. 119° E., to the West boundary of the Yilgarn Magisterial District, thence South along said boundary to its South-West corner, and East to the North-West boundary of the Plantagenet Magisterial District; on the Southward and South-East by lines extending from the South end of the Western boundary in a North-Easterly direction along the Hotham River upwards to Millingnalling Pool, from thence by an East line to Mount Glasse in the Bremer Range, and from thence by an East-North-Easterly line to the East end of the North boundary afore-

Boundaries of the Toodyay Magisterial District.

Bounded on the North by a line starting from the seacoast, and extending due East, passing through the summit of Mount Lesuer to a spot due North from the summit of the highest peak in the Wongan Hills, thence due South to

the said summit, and from thence by a due East line to the West boundary of the Yilgarn Magisterial District; on the West by the sea-coast, including the islands adjacent; on the South and South-West by lines extending East from the coast aforesaid to a spot on the North branch of the Moore River where the South boundary of Melbourne Location 93 at Gillingarra crosses it, thence downwards along the said North branch to the junction of the North and East branches of the Moore River, thence in a South-South-Easterly direction to the 60th Mile mark on the road from Perth to New Norcia, thence to the South-West corner of Swan Location 95 at Bailup, thence by a South-Easterly line to a spot on the Eastern Railway due North from the North-East corner of Helena Location 22; and on the South-East by the South-East boundary of the reserve for the railway aforesaid (the said reserve being a strip of land, one chain wide, on each side of the centre of the rails) in an East-North-Easterly direction till it intersects the Western boundary of Avon Location e 1, thence by that location's Western and Southern boundaries and crossing the Avon River by its right bank downwards to the South corner of Avon Location P, then East-North-Easterly along its of Avon Location P, then East-North-Easterly along its Southern boundary, then in a South-South-Easterly direction along the Western boundary of Avon Location 62, and East-North-Easterly along the Southern boundaries of Avon Locations 62, 1066, 0, and 61, to the Western boundary of Avon Location N 1, and South-South-Easterly to its South corner, thence in the direction of a spot due East from the summit of the highest peak in the Wongan Hills, at Long. 119° E., to the West boundary of the Yilgarn Magisterial District; on the East by part of the said West boundary of the Yilgarn Magisterial District.

Boundaries of the Victoria Magisterial District.

Bounded on the North by a true East line from the sea-coast, passing through the summit of Mount Murchison; on the West by the sea-coast, including the islands adjacent to it; on the South by a true East line from the sea-coast passing through the summit of Mount Lesuer to a spot due North from the summit of the highest peak in the Wongan North from the summit of the fignest peak in the Wongan Hills, thence due South to the said summit, and from thence by a due East line to the West boundary of the Yilgarn Magisterial District, thence North to its North-West corner, situate 80 miles North and 20 miles West from Eenuin Spring, thence East 250 miles to its North-East corner, thence South along its Eastern boundary to the North boundary of the Plantagenet Magisterial District, and along it due East, and on the East by the Eastern boundary. along it due East; and on the East by the Eastern boundary of the Colony.

Clothing.

Alteration in periods for issue of Clothing.

1. The existing system of issuing clothing being found to work in an unsatisfactory manner, the date of a man's enlistment will not in future be considered as the date from which issues are to count, but the 1st April and 1st October in each year will be made the date for the issue of new clothing.

Paragraph 6, Sub-sections c, d, and e of the Regulations published in the "Government Gazette" of 6th April, 1893, will be cancelled, and the following substituted:—

Division of clothing year.

(c.) The clothing year will be divided into two periods: the first counting from 1st February to the 31st July, both dates included, and the second from the 1st August to 31st January, both dates included.

Issues to be made on 1st April and 1st October in each year.

- (d.) Issues of new clothing will be made on or as soon as possible after 1st April and 1st October in each of the above periods, and any soldier who joins or has joined within either of those periods will become entitled to new issues, in accordance with the scale laid down in these Regulations (Vide Table h.) on the 1st April or 1st October, according to the period he joined in.
- 2. To Paragraph 6 of Regulations published in "Government Gazette" of the 6th April, 1893, add in substitution of and after sub-heading e:—

Suit of White Drill.

(e.) Warrant Officers, Staff Sergeants, and Sergeants receive a suit of plain white drill, annually, instead of the blue guernsey and canvas trousers issued to the rank and file.

Boys' Uniform.

(f.) Boys are not supplied with cloth uniform (i.e. tunic and trousers). A new suit of serge will be issued to them at the periods of service laid down for the issue of cloth uniform for soldiers on men's service. On attaining the age of 18 years a soldier enlisted as a boy becomes entitled to cloth uniform, to be renewed biennially, under the same conditions as are laid down in sub-sec. (d) above; the date of his attaining this age being considered as the date of joining, for the purpose of fixing the periods of issue.

Issue to soldier on re-engagement.

(g.) On re-engagement a soldier is entitled to the same issue of clothing and kit for the rank he then holds as are laid down for a man on joining and after three months' service (vide sub-heads (a) and (b) and paragraph 10 Regulations in "Government Gazette," 6-4-93); to be issued on commencing his new period of service.

To paragraph 10 of Regulations published in "Government Gazette" of 6th April, 1893, add after "2 towels"—"1 kit-bag, canvas."

Allowances.

3. Paragraph 27 of the Regulations published in the "Government Gazette" of 1st March, 1893, is cancelled, and the following substituted:—

Scales for Fuel and Light.

27. To enable a check to be kept on the issues of fuel and lighting material made to the Barracks, the following scales have been drawn up for the winter months, beginning 15th April, and ending 30th September in each year.

Fuel.

(a.) FUEL (WOOD).

Scale F.A., for barrack and recreation rooms, each 47lbs. daily.

Scale F.B., for kitchen, 178lbs. daily. Scale F.C., for guard room, 44lbs. daily.

Light.

(b.) LIGHT (KEROSENE).

Scale L.A., for barrack and recreation rooms, each $1\frac{\pi}{4}$ pint, daily.

Scale L.B., for kitchen and guard room, each

1 pint daily.

Scale L.C., for sergeant's room, offices, passages, canteen, lavatory, and latrines, each $\frac{3}{4}$ pint daily.

Issue in bad weather.

(c.) The officer commanding will have the power to increase the issue of fuel under Scales F.A. and F.C. by not more than $\frac{1}{8}$ of the daily allowance, and to issue fuel according to scale during other than the winter months if, in his opinion, the inclemency of the weather necessitates it. He will send a copy of the order making the increase or issue to the Military Office, for the information of the Commandant.

Allowance for Kitchens.

(d.) The allowance of fuel for the kitchen will continue throughout the year.

Summer Allowances.

(e.) In the summer months the following will be allowance for lighting:—

Scale L.A. ... 1 pint. Scale L.B. ... $\frac{3}{4}$ do. Scale L.C. ... $\frac{3}{2}$ do.

Surplus.

(f.) If at the end of any month any surplus of fuel or lighting material is found to exist from what has been issued, the Commanding Officer may sanction its use for the good of the troops, but if there is no cause for its being used it shall be taken on charge again.

Fuel and Light Return.

(g). The receipt and expenditure of fuel and lighting material will be accounted for on Military Form Q 11, which will be despatched to the Military Office on the first day of the month following the one it refers to.

Allowance in lieu of Rations to men on Furlough.

4. An allowance of One shilling per diem in lieu of rations shall be paid to any warrant officer, non-commissioned officer, and man on leave of absence, or furlough, whilst out of mess, but to become entitled to this allowance the leave of absence granted to the soldier must be more than two days. This rule does not apply to married soldiers who permanently draw the allowance in lieu of rations, as this last-named allowance would continue whilst on leave or furlough.

Leave of Absence.

Leave season.

5. The furlough and leave season, during which periods of leave may be granted by the Commandant to officers, non-commissioned officers, and men of the Permanent Force will begin on 1st November, and end on the last day of February in each year.

Periods of Leave of Absence.

6. The periods of leave are as follows:—

For officers, two months.

For warrant officers, non-commissioned officers, and men remaining within the Colony one month, or proceeding to one of the other colonies six weeks.

Short leave.

7. The officer commanding a unit can grant leave or absence as follows, without reference to the Commandant:

To an officer, two days.

To any other soldier under his command, five days.

Leave a privilege.

8. It is to be expressly understood that all leave of absence is granted as a privilege, and that it must not be considered that any soldier is entitled to leave of absence at any time.

This privilege shall not be granted to men of bac character, and can be withheld if, in the opinion of the officer empowered to grant it, the exigencies of the Service or other reasons make such action necessary.

Soldier on long leave not to remain at Station.

9. No soldier to whom leave of absence over two days has been granted shall remain within the boundaries of the place where the Head Quarters of his corps are stationed and any soldier returning from leave of absence to reside within such boundaries will forfeit any unexpired portior of his leave of absence.

Soldiers on leave to have pass.

10. Warrant officers, non-commissioned officers, and men quitting their station on leave of absence will be furnished with a pass (Military Form G. 1) on which i will appear whether the wearing of plain clothes is per mitted.

Attention is directed to Part IV., Sec. XIII., Queen's Regulations, 1892, and those provisions contained therein which are applicable, will be invariably conformed to.

T is hereby notified that the Roebourne Roads Board has taken, for the purpose of opening new lines of communication, the Crown Lands hereinafter described, that is to say:—

No. 391.

A strip of land, fifty links wide, leaving the main road from Cossack to Upper Fortescue at Andover, and following the track now in use in an Easterly direction to Viveash's Station on the Jones River, via North Location 47

No. 392.

A strip of land, fifty links wide, leaving the main road from Roebourne to Condon at De Witt Hill, and extending in a Southerly direction to Richardson and Edgar's Station via Kialrah Pool.

Term and payment of rent.

65. The term of all Leases granted under these Regulations shall be computed from the 1st of January preceding the date of the application.

The rents of all Leases shall be calculated as from the 1st of January to the 31st of December, and shall be paid in advance to the Minister, at the Land and Survey Office, Perth, or to his Agents at the various Resident Magistrates' Courts in the Colony, or to the Warden of the Goldfield, on or before the 1st of March in each year, and if the rent for any lease is not paid within thirty days from that date the lease shall be voidable at the will of the Governor. Leases applied for during the year will be charged rent from the beginning of the quarter previous to the date of application.

What considered a sufficient working.

76. A lease, claim, or protection area shall be considered as effectively worked when eight hours' bona fide work is performed thereon by the complement of miners required by these Regulations, on every working day except Saturday, when four hours' work shall be considered sufficient.

In any case where machinery has been erected upon any lease or claim, and is kept constantly at work, the Warden may, in his discretion, dispense with such portions of the labour conditions as to him may seem fit.
