WHEREAS by a certain Deed Poll of Grant, bearing date the 30th August, 1884, under the hand of the Governor and Public Seal of the Colony, enrolled in the Survey Office of the said Colony in Book 6, No. 153, the Land known and therein described as "North Fremantle Lot P 82" was granted to PATRICK REDMOND, of Fremantle, in the said Colony, Military Pensioner, in Fee Simple: AND WHEREAS by the said Deed Poll power was reserved to the Crown, at any time within twenty-one years from the date thereof, to resume and enter upon possession of any part of the said lands which it might, any time by the Crown, be deemed necessary to resume for making roads, canals, bridges, towing-paths, or other works of public utility or convenience: AND WHEREAS the piece or parcel of land hereinafter described is necessary for the purposes of a Railway: Now KNOW YE that I, the said Governor, acting for and on behalf of and by the authority of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria, do hereby, and by virtue of the said power and authority reserved and contained in the said recited Deed Poll, resume for the purposes aforesaid: All that portion of North Fremantle Lot P 82, containing one rood and twenty perches, more or less, bounded by lines starting from the South-West corner of North Fremantle Lot P 82, and extending Northwards sixty-nine links along its Western boundary, thence in a North-Easterly direction by a curved line with a radius of twelve chains fifty links, measuring three chains forty-five links, thence East one chain eight links along its North boundary to the North-East corner of said lot, thence South fifty-five links along its Eastern boundary, thence by a curved line with a radius of eleven chains fifty links,

measuring three chains seventy links, thence West fifty-eight links along its South boundary to the starting point.

THE following letter from the Honourable the Premier of New Zealand is published for general information.

SIR,

Premier's Office,  
Wellington, 7th August, 1893.

I have the honour to acquaint you, that in August, 1892, the Premier of New South Wales submitted, for the consideration of this Government, that the indiscriminate recognition of the passes of Members of Parliament by the Railway authorities was objectionable and open to abuse, and suggested that the practice should be discontinued, but that passes should be issued from time to time by the authorities to members, as required. In this, this Government concurred, and informed the Premier of New South Wales to that effect, but did not take immediate action, pending further advice as to whether the other colonies agreed. Nothing further, however, has been heard on the subject, but as a person was recently detected travelling on our railways with a gold pass, which had been stolen from the residence of the late Hon. J. Lucas, M.L.A., of New South Wales, this Government has now decided that in future the practice of the recognition of passes held by Members of Parliament of the Australian Colonies shall cease as regards this colony; but that Members of Parliament from Australia, visiting New Zealand, may obtain free passes over our railways on presentation of a letter of introduction from the Premier or a Minister of the colony they represent.

For a shaft to be sunk from below the depth of 100 feet to a depth of 200 feet, @ £2 10s. per foot.

For a shaft to be sunk from below the depth of 200 feet to a depth of 300 feet, @ £5 per foot.

### CONDITIONS.

Each shaft to be vertical throughout, with a superficial area of not less than 27 feet in the clear when completed, and a minimum width of not less than 3 feet, to be sunk and timbered where necessary, to the satisfaction of the Warden or his Deputy.

Provided, that if any shaft has been already sunk of a less superficial area than 27 feet, the bonus shall be paid in proportion; but in no case shall any bonus be paid for a shaft having a less area than 20 feet, or less than 3 feet in width.

All measurements of depth to be taken from the surface of the ground.

Payments will be made monthly as the work progresses. No payments will be made for less than 10 feet, and all work shall be measured and passed by the Warden or his Deputy before payment, and the decision of the Warden or his Deputy shall be final.

No payment will be made in respect of the first 100 feet from the surface.

With regard to existing shafts, no payment will be made in respect of work done before the date hereof.

Any person intending to deepen any existing shaft of or exceeding the depth of 100 feet shall give notice in writing to the Warden or his Deputy of the depth of the said shaft, and of his intention to deepen the same.

The Warden or his Deputy shall ascertain and certify the depth of such shaft, and payment shall be made only in respect of the work done beyond the depth certified by the Warden or his Deputy.

Any person intending to sink a new shaft with the intention of claiming a bonus shall give notice in writing of such intention before the commencement of the work, or before the shaft is down 100 feet.

No company or person shall receive assistance for more than one shaft on the same mining property.

His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under the powers conferred upon him by the Goldfields Act (50 Victoria, No. 18), has been pleased to amend Clauses 65 and 76 of the Regulations under the said Act, gazetted 4th October, 1892, so as to read as follows:—

*Term and payment of rent.*

65. The term of all Leases granted under these Regulations shall be computed from the 1st of January preceding the date of the application.

The rents of all Leases shall be calculated as from the 1st of January to the 31st of December, and shall be paid in advance to the Minister, at the Land and Survey Office, Perth, or to his Agents at the various Resident Magistrates' Courts in the Colony, or to the Warden of the Goldfield, on or before the 1st of March in each year, and if the rent for any lease is not paid within thirty days from that date the lease shall be voidable at the will of the Governor. Leases applied for during the year will be charged rent from the beginning of the quarter previous to the date of application.

*What considered a sufficient working.*

76. A lease, claim, or protection area shall be considered as effectively worked when eight hours' *bonâ fide* work is performed thereon by the complement of miners required by these Regulations, on every working day except Saturday, when four hours' work shall be considered sufficient.

In any case where machinery has been erected upon any lease or claim, and is kept constantly at work, the Warden may, in his discretion, dispense with such portions of the labour conditions as to him may seem fit.

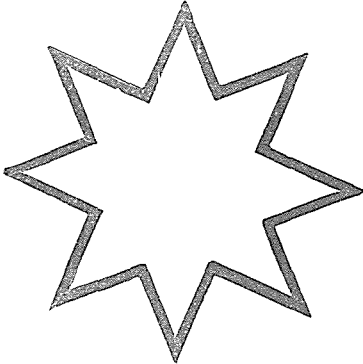

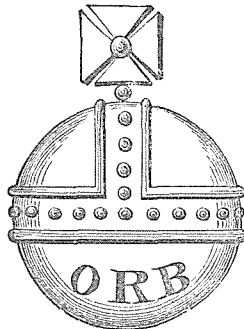
