PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Magisterial Districts Act, 1886," the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation, to declare any portion of the Colony to be a Magisterial District, and to name the same, and define the boundaries thereof: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the said Act, do hereby declare that portion of the Colony comprised within the following boundaries to be a Magisterial District, under the name of the "Pilbarra Magisterial District."

Bounded on the West by a line extending South from a spot on the Sea Coast South by West from Depuch Island, and passing through a spot 8 miles West from the summit of Mount Negri continuing South till it meets a due West line from Trigonometrical Station B3; on the South by a line extending East to said Station B 3, then South to a spot East from Mount Vigors, and then East to a spot South from the summit of Mount Macpherson; on the East by a line extending North through the summit of Mount Macpherson to a spot East from the junction of the Shaw River with the DeGrey River; and on the North by a line extending West through the said junction to a spot North from aforesaid

Station B3, then North to the Sea Coast, and along it Westwards to the starting point.

The extent of the North-West Magisterial District is reduced by that within the above boundaries.

- 2. The purchases will be made in Calcutta, Madras, and Bombay by Remount Agents, under the orders of the Director Army Remount Department.
- 3. The Remount Depots will be open for the reception of horses from the 1st November, 1893, to the end of the purchasing season.
- 4. Horses and mares of all breeds will be received; but they must be within the prescribed age, 4 to 6 years; and in the case of Australian horses, 14 hands 3 inches to 16 hands.
 - 5. Greys will not be purchased for Horse and Field Artillery.
- 6. The average price for an Australian or Cape Remount has been changed, and is now fixed at Rs. 675, which will be paid at the Indian port of purchase. The average price for Arabs and Persians is Rs. 550. Each horse presented for purchase will be valued separately, and higher or lower prices may be given under such rules as may be made by the Director of the Army Remount Department; but the average prices fixed above are not to be exceeded on the whole number purchased in any class. any class.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council under the poor cil, under the powers conferred upon him by the Goldfields Act (50 Victoria, No. 18), has been pleased to amend Clauses 65 and 76 of the Regulations under the said Act, gazetted 4th October, 1892, so as to read as follows:

Term and payment of rent.

65. The term of all Leases granted under these Regulations shall be computed from the 1st of January preceding the date of the application.

The rents of all Leases shall be calculated as from the 1st of January to the 31st of December, and shall be paid in advance to the Minister, at the Land and Survey Office, Perth, or to his Agents at the various Resident Magistrates' Courts in the Colony, or to the Warden of the Goldfield, on or before the 1st of March in each year, and if the rent for any lease is not paid within thirty days from that date the lease shall be voidable at the will of the Governor. Leases applied for during the year will be charged rent from the beginning of the quarter previous to the date of application.

What considered a sufficient working.

76. A lease, claim, or protection area shall be considered ss affectively worked when eight hours' bona fide work is performed thereon by the complement of miners required by these Regulations, on every working day except Saturday, when four hours' work shall be considered sufficient.

In any case where machinery has been erected upon any lease or claim, and is kept constantly at work, the Warden may, in his discretion, dispense with such portions of the labour conditions as to him may seem fit.

For a shaft to be sunk from below the depth of 100 feet to a depth of 200 feet, @ $\pounds 2$ 10s. per foot.

For a shaft to be sunk from below the depth of 200 feet to a depth of 300 feet, @ £5 per foot.

CONDITIONS.

Each shaft to be vertical throughout, with a superficial area of not less than 27 feet in the clear when completed, and a minimum width of not less than 3 feet, to be sunk and timbered where necessary, to the satisfaction of the Warden or his Deputy.

Provided, that if any shaft has been already sunk of a less superficial area than 27 feet, the bonus shall be paid in proportion; but in no case shall any bonus be paid for a shaft having a less area than 20 feet, or less than 3 feet in width.

Payments will be made monthly as the work progresses. No payments will be made for less than 10 feet, and all work shall be measured and passed by the Warden or his Deputy before payment, and the decision of the Warden or his Deputy shall be final.

No payment will be made in respect of the first 100 feet from the surface. $\,$

With regard to existing shafts, no payment will be made in respect of work done before the date hereof.

Any person intending to deepen any existing shaft of or exceeding the depth of 100 feet shall give notice in writing to the Warden or his Deputy of the depth of the said shaft, and of his intention to deepen the same.

The Warden or his Deputy shall ascertain and certify the depth of such shaft, and payment shall be made only in respect of the work done beyond the depth certified by the Warden or his Deputy.

Any person intending to sink a new shaft with the intention of claiming a bonus shall give notice in writing of such intention before the commencement of the work, or before the shaft is down 100 feet.

No company or person shall receive assistance for more than one shaft on the same mining property.
