HEREAS by an Ordinance of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, made and passed in the Twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 21, intituled "An Ordinance for the Recovery of Small Debts and Demands," the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to constitute Local Courts for the recovery of Small Debts and Demands, to be holden at such times and places, and within such Districts throughout the said Colony as may be most fit and convenient: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby notify and proclaim, and do hereby constitute a Local Court for the recovery of Small Debts and Demands, to be holden on the first Wednesday in December next, and thenceforward on the first Wednesday in each month, at the hour of ten o'clock in the forenoon, at Marble Bar, in the Pilbarra Goldfield District.

Amendment of Clauses 65 and 76 of the Regulations for the management of Goldfields.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under the parties of the council and the parties of the council and the parties of the council and the counci cil, under the powers conferred upon him by the Goldfields Act (50 Victoria, No. 18), has been pleased to amend Clauses 65 and 76 of the Regulations under the said Act, gazetted 4th October, 1892, so as to read as follows:

Term and payment of rent.

65. The term of all Leases granted under these Regulations shall be computed from the 1st of January preceding the date of the application.

The rents of all Leases shall be calculated as from the 1st of January to the 31st of December, and shall be paid in advance to the Minister, at the Land and Survey Office, Perth, or to his Agents at the various Resident Magistrates' Courts in the Colony, or to the Warden of the Goldfield, on or before the 1st of March in each year, and if the rent for any lease is not paid within thirty days from that date the lease shall be voidable at the will of the Governor. Leases applied for during the year will be charged rent from the beginning of the quarter previous to the date of application.

What considered a sufficient working.

76. A lease, claim, or protection area shall be considered as effectively worked when eight hours' bonû fide work is performed thereon by the complement of miners required by these Regulations, on every working day except Satur-day, when four hours' work shall be considered sufficient.

In any case where machinery has been erected upon any lease or claim, and is kept constantly at work, the Warden may, in his discretion, dispense with such portions of the labour conditions as to him may seem fit.

For a shaft to be sunk from below the depth of 100 feet to a depth of 200 feet, @ £2 10s. per foot.

For a shaft to be sunk from below the depth of 200 feet to a depth of 300 feet, @ £5 per foot.

CONDITIONS.

Each shaft to be vertical throughout, with a superficial area of not less than 27 feet in the clear when completed, and a minimum width of not less than 3 feet, to be sunk and timbered where necessary, to the satisfaction of the Warden or his Deputy.

Provided, that if any shaft has been already sunk of a less superficial area than 27 feet, the bonus shall be paid in proportion; but in no case shall any bonus be paid for a shaft having a less area than 20 feet, or less than 3 feet in width.

All measurements of depth to be taken from the surface of the ground.

Payments will be made monthly as the work progresses. No payments will be made for less than 10 feet, and all work shall be measured and passed by the Warden or his Deputy before payment, and the decision of the Warden or his Deputy shall be final.

No payment will be made in respect of the first 100 feet from the surface.

With regard to existing shafts, no payment will be made in respect of work done before the date hereof.

Any person intending to deepen any existing shaft of or exceeding the depth of 100 feet shall give notice in writing to the Warden or his Deputy of the depth of the said shaft, and of his intention to deepen the same.

The Warden or his Deputy shall ascertain and certify the depth of such shaft, and payment shall be made only in respect of the work done beyond the depth certified by the Warden or his Deputy.

Any person intending to sink a new shaft with the intention of claiming a bonus shall give notice in writing of such intention before the commencement of the work, or before the shaft is down 100 feet.

No company or person shall receive assistance for more than one shaft on the same mining property.

Government Railways of Western Australia.

N and after 8th October the following Regulations for the conveyance of Her Majesty's Permanent Militia and Volunteer Forces will be in operation on the Government Lines:—

Regulations for the Conveyance of Her Majesty's Permanent, Militia, and Volunteer Forces.

PERMANENT FORCE.

The following Regulations apply to the Great Southern Railway Company and to Government Railways:—

- 1. Single Journey.—Officers on or off duty are allowed to make a single journey at three-fourths the ordinary first-class fare, on payment and on production of Military Form G 12.
- 2. SINGLE JOURNEY.—Soldiers on or off duty are allowed to travel second-class at the rate of 1d. per mile on payment and on production of Military Form G 12.
- 3. Return Journey.—Officers and soldiers on or off duty are allowed return tickets at single fares on payment and on production of Military Form G 12.
- 4. Large and small parties of soldiers may occasionally travel on duty without paying their fares. In such instances it will be necessary to issue them a ticket or tickets, on production of Military Form G 12A, and to charge the same fares for each officer or soldier as are enumerated in Regulations 1, 2, and 3.

5. Military Forms G 12 and G 12A, presented at any booking office, must bear the signature of the Commanding Officer of the Corps to which they belong.

MILITIA AND VOLUNTEER FORCES.

6. Volunteer Officers and Volunteers, whether in uniform or not, are not allowed to travel in Government Railway Trains without a railway ticket.

7. Volunteers of all ranks travelling on duty in uniform, and Officers not in uniform, will be supplied by their Commanding Officer with a ticket order on Military Form G 13. When such an order is presented at a booking office a railway ticket or tickets must be issued in exchange.

8. Volunteers of all ranks wearing plain clothes, when actually going to or returning from rifle practice (the carrying of a rifle being taken as a proof) will be allowed to travel under conditions provided in Regulation No. 7.

9. The fares will be the same as those provided under Regulations Nos. 1, 2, and 3.


