THE attention of Bankers and the public generally is particularly requested to the provisions of "The Gold Declaration Act, 1888," which are as follows.

JOHN FORREST, Colonial Treasurer.

1. ANY banker or other person exporting from the Colony any gold, gold ore, gold dust, or gold bullion, if such gold, gold ore, or gold dust, shall have been found in or procured from the soil of the Colony, or if the gold contained in such bullion shall have been found in or procured from the soil of the Colony, shall at the Customs declare the weight or value of the same at the time of export.

2. ANY person failing to comply with the provisions of this Act may, on summary conviction before two Justices, be fined any sum not exceeding Ten pounds, or any sum not exceeding an amount equal to Five per cent. on the value of the undeclared articles, whichever sum shall be the greater.

3. NO person exporting from the Colony articles manufactured of gold, although such gold shall have been found in or procured from the soil of the Colony, shall be bound to declare the weight or value of such articles.

Amendment of Clauses 65 and 76 of the Regulations for the management of Goldfields.

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Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 12th July, 1893.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under the powers conferred upon him by the Goldfields Act (50 Victoria, No. 18), has been pleased to amend Clauses 65 and 76 of the Regu-lations under the said Act, gazetted 4th October, 1892, so as to read as follows:-

Term and payment of rent.

65. The term of all Leases granted under these Regulations shall be computed from the 1st of January preceding the date of the application.

The rents of all Leases shall be calculated as from the 1st of January to the 31st of December, and shall be paid in advance to the Minister, at the Land and Survey Office, Perth, or to his Agents at the various Resident Magistrates Courts in the Colony, or to the Warden of the Goldfield, on or before the 1st of March in each year, and if the rent for any lease is not paid within thirty days from that date the lease shall be voidable at the will of the Governor. Leases applied for during the year will be charged rent from the beginning of the quarter previous to the date of application.

What considered a sufficient working.

76. A lease, claim, or protection area shall be considered as effectively worked when eight hours' bona fide work is performed thereon by the complement of miners required by these Regulations, on every working day except Saturday, when four hours' work shall be considered sufficient.

In any case where machinery has been erected upon any lease or claim, and is kept constantly at work, the Warden may, in his discretion, dispense with such portions of the labour conditions as to him may seem fit.
