THEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: Now THEREFORE I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested as aforesaid, and of all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation announce and proclaim that the Fifth Session OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AND THE LEGISLATIVE Assembly, to be holden under the provisions of the said Act and "The Constitution Act Amendment Act, 1893," shall be holden for the despatch of business on Wednesday, the twentieth day OF DECEMBER INSTANT, at the hour of three of the clock, p.m.: the Session of the Legislative Council to be holden in the Legislative Council Chamber, in St. George's Terrace, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly Chamber, in Howick Street, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the

Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

- 3. NO person exporting from the Colony articles manufactured of gold, although such gold shall have been found in or procured from the soil of the Colony, shall be bound to declare the weight or value of such articles.
