THE attention of Bankers and the public generally is particularly requested to the provisions of "The Gold Declaration Act, 1888," which are as follows.

- 1. ANY banker or other person exporting from the Colony any gold, gold ore, gold dust, or gold bullion, if such gold, gold ore, or gold dust, shall have been found in or procured from the soil of the Colony, or if the gold contained in such bullion shall have been found in or procured from the soil of the Colony, the state of the Colony from the soil of the Colony, shall at the Customs declare the weight or value of the same at the time of export.
- 2. ANY person failing to comply with the provisions of this Act may, on summary conviction before two Justices, be fined any sum not exceeding Ten pounds, or any sum not exceeding an amount equal to Five per cent. on the value of the undeclared articles, whichever sum shall be the greater.
- 3. NO person exporting from the Colony articles manufactured of gold, although such gold shall have been found in or procured from the soil of the Colony, shall be bound to declare the weight or value of such articles.

"The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act, 1892."

THE following additional Regulations made under "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act, 1892," are published for general information.

Regulations under "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act, 1892."

HEREAS under the powers conferred upon him by "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act, 1892," His Excellency the Governor in Council did, on the 7th day of June, 1893, make certain Regulations, which were published in the Government Gazette on the 8th day of June, 1893;

And whereas it has been determined to make the following additional Regulations: Now THEREFORE His Excellency Sir WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, G.C.M.G., Governor of the Colony of Western Australia, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations under the authority of the said Act:

- 1. The Inspector or other Officer may seize and remove any young or immature shell found in the possession of any person.
- No person shall have or carry on board any boat or use a dredge without the permission of the Inspector, and the Inspector or other Officer may seize and remove any dredge found on board any boat or used contrary to this regulation.
- 3. The Inspector may authorise persons to collect mature shell on any portion of the waters of Sharks Bay which shall have been closed under the provisions of Section 12 of the said Act, but such shall not be collected except in deep water and by means of diving apparatus.

Any person offending against the provisions of any of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £50.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations, under the provisions of "The Homesteads Act, 1893.

Regulations respecting the Sale of Suburban

- 1. Suburban Lands throughout the Colony shall after being surveyed into lots of convenient size, be offered for sale by public auction, as provided in Clauses 40, 41, and 42 of the Land Regulations of 1887, but subject to the condition that each lot shall be fenced on the surveyed boundaries with a good and substantial fence, as prescribed in the aforesaid Land Regulations, within two years from the date of sale.
- 2. At all such sales, should the applicant not be the purchaser, his deposit will be refunded, and the purchaser shall on the fall of the hammer deposit an amount equal to ten per cent. of the purchase money, and such deposit shall be considered as part payment thereof, so far as the same will extend. In every case the balance of purchase money shall be paid, within twelve months, by four equal quarterly instalments on the first days of January, April, July, and October; the first instalment to be paid on the first day of the quarter next following the date of sale; the fees for Crown Grant and Registration being paid with the last instalment.
- 3. In default of payment of any one of the several instalments of purchase money within 30 days after the dates mentioned, or if the required fencing is not completed within two years from the date of sale, the land shall be absolutely forfeited, together with all purchase money or fees that may have been paid. Provided that nothing shall prevent the balance of the purchase money and fees being paid at an earlier date should the purchaser so desire; but no Crown Grant will be issued until the Commissioner of Crown Lands is satisfied that the required fencing has been completed.

Section 22.

That in each case of the BIRTH of every child in the said Colony the parent shall, within thirty days, and in the case of the DEATH of any person the tenant of the house or place shall, within fourteen days next thereafter, respectively inform the District Registrar of such Birth or Death, and of all the particulars concerning the same, according to the form of registration hereinbefore referred to.

Section 26.

That in case any new-born child, or any dead body, shall be found exposed, the constable, in case of a new-born child, and the coroner, or, if none such, the Resident or Police Magistrate of the district, in case of a dead body, shall forthwith inform the District Registrar thereof, and of the place where the child or dead body was found; and where an inquest or magisterial inquiry shall be held on any dead body, the coroner or magistrate, as the case may be, shall notify to the District Registrar the verdict of the jury, or the opinion of such magistrate, with all other particulars required to be registered, concerning the death; and such District Registrar shall make the entry accordingly.

Section 30.

That every person who shall offend against this Ordinance by refusing or neglecting to give any notice or information required by any of the foregoing sections, or by knowingly registering any Birth or Death contrary to the provisions of any of the said sections, shall for every such offence forfeit a sum not less than Two pounds, nor exceeding Twenty pounds.


